# PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE - IMPACT REPORT

# NATIONAL TRIATHLON CHAMPIONSHIPS 9 MARCH 2013

# 1. Description of Event

This event has become a regular on Wellington City's sporting event calendar and will comprise five separate races. The event is proposed to be held on Saturday 9 March 2013. All races are proposed to start from parking and hard surface areas surrounding Waitangi Park, except for the Contact 3:9:3 and the Contact 1:2:1 events. These are proposed to be held around the Freyberg Pool car park area (due to the shallower swimming conditions available there). The change to hard surface sites for the starting and transition areas of the event seeks to protect the grass surface of Waitangi Park itself.

The Contact Trophy (starting at 7.15am) and the Contact Cup events double as the National Standard Distance Championships and involve approximately 500 athletes over the three different swim, cycle and run courses within the proposed road closure area, and outside the road closure area to and from the Miramar Peninsula. The Contact 1:2:1 event, which is hoped to involve approximately 50 children between the ages of 7 to 11 years (this event will take 20 minutes from start to finish) begins at 8am and leaves the Freyberg car park and utilizes sections of Oriental Parade. Following this, the Contact 3:9:3 event (an adult beginner's event with achievable distances) begins at 9.20am and involves approximately 200 athletes. At 10.30am the Grand Finale, which is the Contact Cup elite event, begins with approximately 150 elite athletes on a swim, cycle and run course entirely within the proposed closure area.

The proposed closures are from 6am to 2pm on Saturday 9 March 2013.

The proposed road closures are:

- Barnett Street (closed except for Te Papa car park exit)
- O Cable Street (between Tory Street and Oriental Parade one seaward lane closed)
- Oriental Parade (between Cable Street and Evans Bay Parade)
- Evans Bay Parade (between Oriental Parade to just north of 301 Evans Bay Parade NIWA building)
- Carlton Gore Road (between Oriental Parade and the intersection of Carlton Gore and Maida Vale Roads)

Access will be maintained (although this may be limited at times) by the event marshals for residents and businesses in the Herd Street area. Residents on Oriental Parade, Carlton Gore Road and Evans Bay Parade will also have access to and from their properties (although this also may be limited at times). Access in both directions on Evans Bay Parade from Greta Point southwards to Wellington Road will be maintained. The event organisers are to maintain as much access for residents within the closure area as possible. Known stakeholders in the Oriental Parade area have been informed and communicated with regarding the proposed closures. Road closure notification signs will be placed at points along the proposed closure route at least one week prior to the event. Residents and local businesses will receive a letter drop advising them of the event and the road closures. The event is

also to be advertised in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post on the Tuesday preceding the event.

The event is to be traffic managed by a professional traffic management company. Pedestrian access will not be restricted and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required. Transport operators have been informed of the proposed closures.

This local and international sporting community event is supported by the City Events team.

# 3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

Dominion Post Saturday 17 November 2012

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

Representatives of the Wellington City Council Events Team meet with the Oriental Bay Residential Association on a regular basis. The Oriental Bay Residents Association has agreed to no more than two full road closures of Oriental Parade for events, this being one of the two.

### 4. Objections

There have been NO objections to this closure request.

### 5. Traffic Impact Assessment

### **Prior Closures**

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

#### **Traffic Impact**

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to the plans provided, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Temporary Road Closures Subcommittee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to publicly notify the event via letter drop, local newspaper advertisement, advanced signage and media releases.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the affected property owners and businesses along the closure areas are consulted with.
- The event organiser is to provide as much access on closed roads for residents as possible during the staggered event programme.
- The event organiser is to provide marshals at all closure ends and intersections/bends to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised.
- The event organiser is to work with the public transport operators to provide alternative public transport route and bus stops.
- The event organiser is to provide further details of the Traffic Management Plan to Council for approval prior to the event.



Approval of Post-Settlement Governance Entity & Investment Framework

Over the last few months Maungaharuru-Tangitü incorporated (MTI) has held several hui with the Hapū
of Tangolo Marae to discuss developing a post-settlement governance entity to receive the assets that
will be acquired through the upcoming settlement with the Crown. Also discussed was a proposed
Investment Framework to guide investment decisions.

The Hapū now have the opportunity to vote on whether the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust should be the post-seitlement governance entity to receive the assets that will be acquired through the settlement, and to approve the Investment Framework. The resolutions to be voted on are:

I approve the Trust Deed for the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust & that the Trust receive the Treaty Settlement Assets for the Hapū.
 I approve the Investment Framework.

MTI will hold several hul to present information about the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust and the Investment Framework and to provide an opportunity for questions to be asked. MTI will also provide an update on the progress of the negotiations with the Crown for the settlement of the historical claims of the Hapū. Please note, there will be a separate vote (in 2013) to approve the settlement when the negotiations with the Crown have been completed.

All whanau who descend from the Hapū of Tangolo Marae are encouraged to attend an information hui.
