Submission on the proposed change to the speed limit in the Hataitai Village area.

I live on the corner of William Street and Waitoa Road. This gives me the opportunity to observe the traffic and pedestrians in this area and on Waitoa Road from the Village crossroads in particular.

There are three main factors which have lead me to request that the Strategy and Policy Council Committee consider extending the distance of the proposed 30km/h on Waitoa Road to the beginning of Waipapa Road. These are:

- The number of people especially children in this length of the road especially at the weekend
- The number of cars in this area especially in the evenings and at the weekend
- The number of vehicles arriving and departing from Arcus Way

In this area of the Village there is/are

- one shop
- four takeaways
- a Pasifika church
- a dairy

- a laundromat
- a bus stop on each side of the road

Please note that in Arcus Way there is/are

- 34 properties with access to Arcus Way many have garages/ parking area for vehicles
- this includes 5 blocks of flats
- a kindergarten with a parking area (2-3 cars)
- church parking area (6 cars)

Presently certain drivers begin to speed up around the zone of the pizza shop as they drive up Waitoa Road.

Please do not even consider shifting the bus stops as these prevent cars from parking in these spaces keeping those areas empty, adding to the visibility for drivers entering/leaving William Street and Arcus Way.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to present my views today. I'm here to speak as an individual and a resident of Moxham Ave. I've lived at my current address for over 12 years, and previously lived at two other addresses in Moxham Ave. I travel through the village daily by school bus, public bus or car, and I walk home four days a week through the tunnel and via Taurima Street. I walk to the shops and back about once a week. My children attended creche in Waitoa Rd and Kindergarten in Taurima St, and have been walking to the shops on their own since they were about 10 or 11. I consider that I know the Hataitai village area very well.

My view is that the proposal to lower the speed limit is a waste of time and money.

The council's brochure outlining the proposed changes states that "From 2007 - 2011, a total of 25 crashes were reported in this area, two of which resulted in injuries to pedestrians" and then goes on to say

"Studies show that reducing vehicle speeds significantly reduces the number and severity of injuries." But you haven't proved that the generalisation applies to this specific circumstance.

Even though it may be true that reducing vehicle speeds reduces injuries, you have not considered whether the 25 accidents at the village were caused by speed or other factors.

I obtained a printout of the 25 accidents reported between 2007 and 2011.

There were actually no accidents later than mid-2010, which means there was an 18-month period with a perfect safety record.

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Two of the accidents were recorded as being probable drunk drivers. I contend that these people would not care whether the speed limit was 50km or 30 km. Of the other 23 accidents, 9 had causes such as "didn't look behind", "attention diverted", "failed to notice car", which I consider to be basic inattention. 14 accidents had causes such as "misjudged position of fixed object", "too far left", "parking brake not fully applied". These are just plain bad drivers. One third of all the accidents were caused by drivers reversing or manoevering, or drivers already parked. These are obviously not issues of speed.

If you look at the physical environment, it's clear why speed is not a problem. The area covered by the proposal includes a cross road and a T- intersection. All the turns are right-angle or more.

There are 6 pedestrian crossings. There is angle parking in both Moxham Ave and Waitoa Road. In Moxham Ave there are driveways used by cars and trade vans and trucks at the plumbers, the electricians, the Realm Bottleshop, the Realm restaurant and the alley next to Bellagio. He Four Square.

In Waitoa Road there are vehicles entering and leaving William Strreet and Arcus Way. All these vehicles manoevering and turning must slow down the traffic.

And I wonder if the Council members here today know how many buses pass through the Moxham/Waitoa Intersection each hour? There are actually 20 buses per hour through this intersection — fewer in the evenings and weekends, but many more at peak hours. Buses have to take the corners slowly and usually stop at one of the four bus stops at the village — surely they have the effect of slowing following traffic?

All these factors together show why speed is not a problem in the village – in fact the Council admits this in their publicity material – you state that "There

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will be little effect on motorists' travel times, as the average speed in this area is already close to 30km/h".

If this is true, then what's the point of changing the speed limit? Most drivers already drive safely, as shown by the 18 —month accident-free period from mid 2010 to the end of 2011.

So the current proposal will have no practical effect. Why would you waste money on signage, publicity, painting the road, the cost of this meeting, for no purpose?

If the Police have the will and manpower available to do anything about road safety in the Eastern Suburbs, I would prefer that they do a blitz on drivers running red lights at the intersections at Bay Road/Rongotai Rd and Bay Rd/Kilbirnie Cres, or drivers who don't stop at the crossing half way down Moxham Ave.

If the council was really concerned about safety at Hataitai village you would do something about the intersection of Taurima St and Ruahine St, the tunnel approach, which is a really scary intersection. I see at least one near-miss a week when I am walking home.

You might also consider removing the phone box and advertising pillar at the intersection of Taurima and Moxham, which obstruct drivers' views of pedestrians at this busy corner. If you have money to spend on roading then how about giving us a decent road surface in Moxham Ave instead of the substandard chipseal we have put up with for five years?

I believe the current proposal is completely pointless. Thank you for listening to my views.
