Mayor Prendergast gave the following speech to the meeting in recognition of Laura Kwan's actions.

"Next month, on 30 September, I will be presenting awards to people who have done remarkable things to contribute to safety in our communities.

One recipient cannot be there – for the best possible reason, of which more later. But she is so deserving of this award, as I'm sure you will all agree, that it seemed right to break with tradition and make this presentation early.

Saturday 6 February was one of the biggest days in Wellington's summer events calendar, with Waitangi Day celebrations in the morning, followed by Day Two of the New Zealand Insurance Sevens.

The city was full of revellers in weird and wonderful costumes. One was Wallace Rameka, who was walking along the walkway to the Stadium – dressed as a Mexican in sombrero and drawn-on moustache – when he suffered a massive heart attack.

A few people stopped to see if they could help but many passed by, probably blaming a combination of sun and booze. Laura Kwan, a house officer in anaesthesia at Wellington Hospital, was hurrying to see her native England play in the Sevens when she saw Wallace. She had a gut feeling that it was serious and she was right – his heart had stopped. Removing what she could of her own Sevens outfit – Nemo, the animated movie fish – she set about performing CPR.

Stadium staff arrived with first aid equipment, including a defibrillator. Between that and the CPR, Laura managed to re-start Wallace's heart.

Paramedics took Wallace to hospital, but Laura had no idea if he would survive. But she rejoined her friends, recovered Nemo's head and made it in time for the game.

Wallace had bypass surgery and has made a full recovery. It is fantastic to see him here today offering support to Laura, whose compassionate and speedy actions undoubtedly made the difference between life and death.

And congratulations are due to Wallace, as I understand this week sees his return to work for the first time since his illness.

This is a wonderful story which illustrates the importance of having the right person in the right place at the right time. Even in a Nemo outfit, a cool head can save lives.

It is also a great Wellingtonian story – anywhere else, a fish resuscitating a Mexican on a summer's afternoon might seem a little odd.

I mentioned Laura's good reason for not being here next month. She will be doing voluntary work at a medical aid station in Nepal, 4,500 metres up in the Himalayas. It seems she can't help helping people! But she will be back in time for the Sevens.

Laura, it is a pleasure and an honour to present you with this award for the magnificent task you performed on that day in February. Congratulations, and take the very best wishes of Wellington with you on your travels."

- (a) Streamline Council's consent processes for proposed Heritage and Urban Conservation Areas in Thorndon, including consideration of waiving consent fees
- (b) Review of the eligibility criteria for the Built Heritage Incentive Fund and the level of funding available
- (c) Prepare information and provide advice and interactive opportunities (for example, meetings or workshops) for the public who have an interest in heritage building/place conservation.
