### **Minutes**

## 1. Opening

## 5. Previous minutes and matters arising

Oliver moved the minutes as true and correct. Brittany seconded the motion and it was passed.

# 6. Portfolios / Forward Programme

It was noted that the YC's preferred option for the Basin Reserve flyover had not been adopted but that YC was broadly supportive of other measures that were proposed to improve traffic follow to the eastern suburbs. New city bus priority measures and the passing of the Local Electoral Amendment Bill regarding campaigning were also noted, as was a Human Rights Commission Youth Forum.

#### 7. General Business

#### **Our Capital Spaces**

Ollie and Maddie led a discussion about things YC members would like to see in the YC's Our Capital Spaces submission. Members thought that the submission should be consistent with the YC's submission on the Town Belt Management Plan, make clear that the summer music festival in the Botanical Garden is important, and push for adult playgrounds. The working group will meet on 3 July and the submission will be ratified on Loomio before 9 July.

Cr Marsh suggested that YC should form a group to further develop a more detailed

adult playground proposal and to advocate for it. Zoe and Bing volunteered to do this.

### **Alcohol Management Strategy**

Jaime thanked the Youth Council and Link for their input to the development of the draft Alcohol Management Strategy, and outlined the essential elements of the Strategy and the next steps towards finalising Strategy and the Local Alcohol Policy. The next step is consulting on the draft Strategy and Policy using the Special Consultative Procedure. Following questions and discussion, Jack, Lily, Teariki, Zoe, Erin, Brittany, Amanda, Daisy and Bing volunteered to form a working group to draft the YC's submission.

#### **Elections**

The working group led a discussion on various aspects of this project including e-voting and videos about WCC services. After a discussion about the pros and cons of e-voting it was decided that the YC supports e-voting for all elections (i.e. for local and central government elections, referenda, DHBs, etc.) 12 members supported this position, 3 opposed it and 1 abstained. The working group will further develop the project plan.
