TAWA COMMUNITY GRANTS – JANUARY 2011

Project Description.

The Tawa website is unique to Tawa, and has been operating for a number of years. The webmaster (Malcolm Sparrow) has provided a report as required for future funding.

As this is a non profit service, the Tawa Progressive and Ratepayers Incorporated has, from past grants, assisted in the maintenance by \$1500-00 per year.

We wish to apply for \$1500-00 for this financial year for the maintenance of the Tawa website.

1. Primary expenses for the tawalink.com website since 1.1.10:

An average of 3-4 hours labour are incurred each week in maintaining and updating the website, 150+ hours over the past 12 months;

Web hosting payment to Web Drive Limited:
\$360.00 + GST over 12 months (\$30 + GST monthly)

A claim of \$1500 towards labour costs is reasonable in the circumstances, the labour alone being worth more than this.

2. The TawaLink website exists to provide information about the community of Tawa and to keep local people informed of events taking place in their community.

The website provides:

- up-to-date details of Coming Events in the Tawa community
- contact details for more than 120 Tawa clubs and groups, plus local schools & churches, etc
- information about the Tawa Community Board
- course details for U3A Tawa Inc
- details about the proposed Stream Walkway in Tawa

The website is updated weekly and includes a new picture or pictures most weeks of some event or scene relevant to Tawa.

It features pages dedicated to specific events in the community like the recent *Tawa Lions Christmas parade* and the biennial Tawa Community Civic Awards.

The website includes:

- a pictorial record of Tawa's parks and reserves
- articles on a small number of Tawa people from the past
- almost 30 "2 Minutes with ..." profiles of current Tawa residents

In conjunction with the website, an email newsletter is sent to around 900 Tawa households, clubs & groups, businesses, schools & groups every month with a summary of what is happening in the community and making reference to new pages on the site.

The website, which is specific to Tawa and essentially designed for the use of local people, has seen an increase in the number of hits and is now averaging around 500 a month.

3. The front page of the website states that it is supported by the Wellington City Council, with the City Council's logo included as part of that statement.

1. Project Description

Vocal FX is a barbershop chorus of 40 young men between the ages of 17 and 27. We are aligned under the chapter of Wellington Men's Barbershop Inc, as a part of the New Zealand Association of Barbershop Singers.

Vocal FX practise at Tawa College every Monday evening. We encourage young men to join from around Wellington and 33% are past Tawa College students. We are NZ Chorus Champions and we placed 10th at the International Competition in Anaheim, California, in July 2009. 2009 was only the second time a group from outside North America made it into the top 10. We will travel in July to Kansas this year to once again represent New Zealand in the International Barbershop Harmony Society Competition.

Within our chorus we have a Tawa resident, Simon Croad. Simon is a past Tawa College Head Boy and is now the Assistant Musical Director of Vocal FX. Simon is currently studying at Victoria University. Studying full time means it is difficult for him to find the funds to travel with us to the International Convention.

2. Outcomes

- *Aim-* To enable Simon Croad, our Assistant Musical Director, to travel with Vocal FX to represent New Zealand at the International Chorus Competition in June/July.
- *Benefits-* Simon is an integral part of our musical leadership team. He is a wonderful leader and motivator and is well respected by the young men in our chorus. He is a fantastic support to our director Charlotte Murray.
- Simon helps promote barbershop among our young people in Wellington. He has coached a quartet at Bishop Viard College and he has is also a leader at the Wellington Young Singers in Harmony Barbershop High School Workshops that are held twice a year. The knowledge and experience he gains from attending the international convention will certainly be shared with young people in the future.

3. Need Identification

- Simon's vocal skills make a tremendous difference to the sound our chorus produces.
- Simon is a musical leader in the chorus. His musical knowledge and excellent 'ear' help our chorus improve our performance.
- Simon leads by example and is a fantastic motivator. He is passionate and shows maturity beyond his years. His presence and skills will be sorely missed if he is unable to attend.

4. Marketing

- Vocal FX is a singing group for young men. Our chorus provides an opportunity for young men to continue singing once they leave school. We aim to help our members' develop high self-esteem and a sense of community through singing. To encourage young men to become involved in our chorus we advertise through a website, a facebook page and we sing at Regional High School Competitions to help recruit future members.

5. Previous Funding Details

- Tawa Community Grant for \$400 to send our director to Directors College in 2010.
- Lion Foundation, 2010. \$2000 to help cover accommodation and travel to NZ Barbershop Chorus Convention in Hamilton.
