

REPORT 4 (1215/13/IM)

NEW ZEALAND COMMUNITY BOARDS' CONFERENCE THURSDAY 5 MAY TO SATURDAY 7 MAY 2011, ROTORUA

1. Purpose of Report

To consider attendance at the New Zealand Community Boards' conference to be held in Rotorua from 5 - 7 May 2011.

2. Recommendations

Officers recommend that the Makara/Ohariu Community Board:

- 1. Receive the information.
- 2. Agree that one member from the Makara/Ohariu Community Board attend the New Zealand Community Boards' conference to be held in Rotorua from 5 May – 7 May 2011. Agree that the costs associated with attending the meeting are met from the Elected Members Budget (GVEM01).
- *3. Agree to nominate one member of the Makara/Ohariu Community Board to attend the New Zealand Community Boards' Conference.*
- 4. Agree that the nominated Board member will present a report back on the conference in accordance with Council policy.

3. Discussion

The theme of the 2011 Community Boards conference is "Communities on Board – The Changing Face of Community Governance". This will involve a focus on boards' relationships, communications and advocacy with its communities, as well as considering the implications of the establishment of Auckland's 'super city' on communities throughout New Zealand Boards. The conference includes the Best Practice Awards Dinner at the Energy Events Centre. The Best Practice Awards recognise excellence in the implementation of projects in local government. Prizes will be presented to the winners of each the following different categories and the best overall project: Consultation, partnership, heritage, harmonious relations, safety, working with Maori, working with children and youth, and significant project. There will be a number of keynote speakers from local government, educational institutions and government bodies. Interactive concurrent workshops will be held and include the following:

- "Mobile Communication and Community Engagement"
- 'Legal Issues Affecting Community Boards"
- "Ageing Population"
- "Empowering Communities During a Civil Defence Emergency"
- "Aspects of Youth"
- "Engaging Local Leadership"
- "Our Communities, our Future The Alcohol Reform Bill and what it means for Boards"
- "Leading the Way Communities Taking Action to Reduce Alcohol related Harm"
- "Effective Relationships between Councils and Boards"
- "Empowering Communities during an emergency"
- "Local Boards: How is it working for us so far?"
- "Empowering new community board members".

3.1 Considerations

When deciding whether members of the Makara/Ohariu Community Board should attend this conference, consideration should be given to:

- the cost; and
- the impact of attendance on the budget.

The total cost of one member of the Makara/Ohariu Community Board is expected to be \$1265 and will be met from the Council conference budget.
