NEW ZEALAND COMMUNITY BOARDS WORKSHOP MONDAY 27 JUNE 2011, WELLINGTON

1. Purpose of Report

Consider attendance at the next 'New Zealand Community Boards' Workshop to be held in Wellington on Monday 27 June 2011, from 9.30am – 4pm.

2. Recommendations

Officers recommend that the Makara/Ohariu Community Board:

- 1. Receive the information.
- 2. Agree that up to three members from the Makara/Ohariu Community Board attend the next 'New Zealand Community Boards' Workshop to be held in Wellington on Monday 27 June 2011. Agree that the costs associated with attending the meeting are met from the Elected Members Budget (GVEM01).
- *3.* Nominate up to three members of the Makara/Ohariu Community Board to attend the next New Zealand Community Boards Workshop.
- 4. Agree that the nominated Board member(s) will present a report back on the workshop in accordance with Council policy.

3. Discussion

The theme of the next workshop is "Build Relationships. Create Value".

Community Boards play an important role in local government, representing and acting as an advocate for the interests of the community. This workshop will help Community Board members to understand the role of the Board, and discover how to best create value, and build strong trust-based relationships.

The workshop will involve a mix of legislative analysis, and success stories from across New Zealand.

Key topics will include:

- The decision-making process
- Identifying personal action points
- Statutory roles and responsibilities
- A review of relevant legislation
- Balancing proactive and reactive approaches
- How to advocate for the interests of your community
- Creating value in our different roles
