TRADING IN PUBLIC PLACES POLICY

The Tawa Community Board agrees with the proposal to consult on option 2 on the draft policy and supports the draft policy as set out in Appendix 1 in the Strategy and Policy Committee paper dated 27July 2006.

FOOTPATH MANAGEMENT POLICY REVIEW

TCB agrees with the general scope of the draft Footpath Management Policy as it affects Wellington City (CBD) but strongly requests that option (iii) or as an alternative (ii) be adopted as the policy on the use of sandwich boards on footpaths.

In the preamble to the draft policy it is clearly stated that "the draft policy does not intend to restrict businesses or economic growth".

The Tawa retail sector is still struggling to retain viability in competition with the two major retail centres in Johnsonville and Porirua and it needs to utilize every possible avenue for attracting custom.

The Board has discussed the issue with Tawa Business Assn representatives and a number of local retailers and they support our submission.
