Bill Day

Kia ora and good afternoon everyone. Absolutely Positively Wellingtonian Awards are a way the Council honours members of our community who make significant contributions to the city.

It is my pleasure to present an Absolutely Positively Wellingtonian Award to Bill Day for the years of service he has given to Wellington.

Bill's contributions to the Wellington community include over 24 years as a member of the Rotary club of Port Nicholson (including service as its president). Bill has also been essential to the development and expansion of Life Flight trust. He has been involved with the service since 1980 and has seen the service extended to include vital Air Ambulance services. Bill has recently stepped down from being the Chair of Life Flight a position he has held for 14 years and remains a trustee.

Alongside that role and his full-time paid work he has spent six years as the General Manager of the New Zealand Community Trust, a charity focused on amateur sport and other worth charities. During his time as chair over \$250 million was raised and distributed to charities throughout New Zealand.
