DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT

Purpose

 To seek Council approval of the 2015/16 annual report of the Wellington District Licensing Committee (DLC) for submission to the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority (ARLA).

Summary

- 2. This report asks Council to approve the Wellington DLC's annual report to ARLA, the national tribunal that decides alcohol licensing appeals and enforcement applications.
- 3. The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (Act) requires the Wellington DLC to report annually to ARLA, which can specify the form and content of the report. The **attached** annual report, for the period from 1 July 2015 to 30 June 2016, contains the information requested by ARLA.
- 4. In order for the Wellington DLC's annual report to be taken into account in ARLA's own report to Parliament, it must be lodged by 18 August 2016.
- 5. Highlights of the Wellington DLC's annual report to for 2015/16 are noted below and the Council is asked to approve its submission to ARLA.

Recommendations

- 2. Agree that the Wellington District Licensing Committee's annual report for 2015/16 be submitted to the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Committee.

Background

- 6. Under section 199 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, the Wellington DLC is required to report annually, within 3 months of the end of Council's financial year, to ARLA, the national tribunal that decides alcohol licensing appeals and enforcement applications. ARLA may specify the form and content of the DLC's report, which it has done and this has been followed in the preparation of the 2015/16 report.
- 7. In order for the Wellington DLC's annual report to be taken into account by ARLA as it prepares its own annual report to Parliament, it must be lodged by 18 August 2016.

Discussion

- 8. A copy of the Wellington DLC's annual report for the perod 1 July 2015 to 30 June 2016 is **attached** to this report and highlights from it are noted below.
- Membership of the Wellington DLCs has not changed over the past year. All DLC members were appointed until 31 October 2018, with the exception of the Deputy Chairs whose appointments are for the period of their current term as members of the territorial authority.

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- 10. During the reporting period, the Wellington DLC convened 15 public hearings. Public hearings are generally the result of objections to applications for alcohol licences or managers' certificates by members of the public or by the Police, Medical Officer of Health or Licensing Inspector. Hearings during the reporting period have taken between half-a-day and three days to conduct.
- 11. During the reporting period, the Wellington DLC received a total of 2176 applications, being 284 more than was received by the Wellington DLCs in the previous financial year. In the same period, the Wellington DLCs issued 2065 substantive decisions.
- 12. Alcohol application forms and supporting documentation were reviewed during the reporting period to simplify and streamline them and to provide better guidance for customers around the requirements of the Act. All application forms can now be downloaded from the WCC website and some can be lodged online. Development work is continuing to ensure all alcohol licence applications will be able to be made online in future.
- 13. During the reporting period, an online public notification system for alcohol licences was introduced, to reduce errors in notices that were being published in newspapers and to assist the public to find all current licence applications in one place. The new system costs applicants less and has been taken up by the majority of them. Since its introduction, there have been fewer complaints from members of the public that they were not informed about licence applications indeed feedback from community groups and members of the public has been positive.
- 14. A trend noted in the reporting period has been the participation in the alcohol licensing process, particularly in the central city, of body corporates (i.e. the governing bodies of inner city residential properties). They have usually participated as public objectors with their concerns tending to relate to amenity and good order (e.g. noise, vandalism) and hours of trade. Body corporate involvement in DLC hearings has resulted, in most cases, in licences being granted on conditions that balance local residents' desire for pleasant and agreeable surroundings with applicants' desire to operate successful businesses.

Conclusion

15. The Council is asked to approve the submission of the Wellington District Licensing Commmitee's annual report for 2015/16 to the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority.

The Wellington District Licensing Committees (DLCs) were appointed by Wellington City Council from 18 December 2013 in accordance with the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) and with Council's *Terms of Reference and Delegations for the 2013/16 Triennium*, adopted on 14 November 2013. The DLCs are charged under the Act with dealing with alcohol licensing matters for Wellington City.

Three Wellington DLCs were appointed and these continue to be chaired by Commissioners Hon Sir Douglas Kidd (District Licensing Commissioner A), Rex Woodhouse (District Licensing Commissioner B) and Murray Clearwater (District Licensing Commissioner C) all of whom were appointed for five year terms until 31 October 2018.

Membership of the Wellington DLCs has not changed over the past year. All DLC members were appointed until 31 October 2018, with the exception of the Deputy Chairs whose appointments are for the period of their current term as member of the territorial authority.

Changes to DLC support personnel in the 2015-16 year included the appointment of a new Governance Advisor, Claire Gilray, and an additional approvals and operations officer, Chris Ormond.

1.2 Staff training relating to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

DLC Secretariat and support staff, and DLC Members and Chairs, receive regular ongoing internal guidance and training on process and case law developments.

DLC Members, Chairs and support staff meet annually to discuss relevant matters, including process at DLC hearings, decision-making, legal developments, trends and issues in the sector. At the 2015 annual meeting, topics discussed included judgement writing, the implications for DLCs of recent High Court licensing decisions, external professional interaction, an update on the status of the Wellington Provisional Local Alcohol Policy (PLAP), evidence presented at DLC hearings, and media coverage of licensing matters.

1.3 DLC meetings and hearings

During this reporting period, the Wellington DLCs have convened the following meetings and hearings:

- 16 meetings to consider and determine 32 Temporary Authority applications; and
- 15 public hearings to consider and determine:
 - 4 new on-licence applications
 - 4 on-licence renewal applications
 - 3 new off-licence applications
 - 4 off-licence renewal applications

- 1 temporary authority application
- 3 manager's certificates.

In the period from 1 July 2015 to 30 June 2016, the Wellington DLCs received a total of 2176 applications, being 284 more than was received by the Wellington DLCs in the previous financial year. In the same period, the Wellington DLCs issued 2065 substantive decisions.

1.4 Trends/issues faced by the DLC

The Wellington DLC has noticed the reporting agencies, in particular the Police and Medical Officer of Health, have refined their evidence of alcohol related harm in particular localities in the Wellington City area. The agencies still face challenges in presenting a picture of harm that can be directly related to specific premises, not the least of which is the response of some applicants that "it is not our alcohol causing the harm."

In this regard, the Wellington DLC commented in a recent decision:¹

- 3. "[134] The difficulty faced by the Committee in this, and other, applications in the absence of a Local Alcohol Policy is that were we to impose a reduction in hours the response may be of victimisation and loss of competitiveness. Without evidence of harm caused by the products of the applicant in question, given the thrust of decisions from the Authority, we do not see how we can address the apparent mayhem in and around the streets of the Wellington's 'entertainment precinct' by night, without local or central government intervention. The question of how to apportion responsibility, on an application by application basis, is an extremely difficult one, with applicants universally arguing that it is not they who are to blame. The Committee has begun to think creatively about these matters, including considering the potential, with the right factual circumstances, of imposing a discretionary condition requiring the affixation of irremovable stickers/markers to a licensee's products in order to ascertain just whose alcohol it is that is causing the harm."
- 4. The Wellington DLC has noted a trend of public objections, particularly in the central city, lodged by Body Corporates. These are sophisticated and often legally-skilled objectors, whose concerns most often relate to amenity and good order, and also hours of trade. Body Corporate involvement in applications considered by the Wellington DLC during the reporting period has resulted, in most cases, in licences being granted on conditions that balance local residents' desire for pleasant and agreeable surroundings with applicants' desire to operate successful businesses.

The Wellington DLC has declined a number of renewal applications from premises that have been found to trade as dairies or convenience stores. In some cases, applicants have indicated acceptance that they no longer qualify

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to hold a licence under the new Act, but have asked for time in which to sell off stock. In such cases, the Wellington DLC has declined the renewal applications and, by consent of all the parties, has done so on the papers, including in the decision to decline a period (within the 3 month limit) to dispose of remaining stock.

New DLC initiatives

2.1. Application forms review and online applications

During the reporting period, the Wellington DLC's support staff conducted a review of all alcohol licensing application forms and supporting documentation with a view to simplifying and stream-lining these for customers and providing better guidance around the requirements of the Act. All application forms in relation to alcohol licensing can now be downloaded from the WCC website.

In addition, some applications can now be made lodged online, namely applications for special licences and for manager's certificates. Development work is currently underway to enable applications for new on and off licences to be made online. WCC is working towards all alcohol licence applications being able to be made online in future.

Manager appointments can now be notified online and when an applicant does so the notification is automatically sent to the Police.

2.2. Online public notice service

During the reporting period, the Wellington DLC Secretary began offering an online public notification service, in part to address the number of waivers the DLC was being asked to grant under s208 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 to correct errors in newspaper advertisements. Another driver of the change was a desire to assist members of the public to find all current licence notifications in one place. The DLC had previously received a number of complaints from members of the public who reported they had not seen public notices in their local newspapers and so had been deprived of the opportunity to lodge a public objection. The DLC Secretary also felt that we could offer applicants a cheaper alternative to newspaper advertising on our website if they wished to take it up.

Since we've offered the online notification service, the majority of applicants have opted to use it, the number of s208 waiver requests to correct notification errors has significantly reduced, and the Wellington DLC Secretary has had fewer complaints from members of the public that they were not informed about licence applications – indeed feedback from community groups and members of the public has been positive.

2.3. DLC requirements for pre-exchange of documents

In November 2015, the Wellington DLC issued a Practice Direction regarding pre-hearing disclosure of documents. This was intended to assist in the smooth and efficient running of public hearings and to ensure the parties have a reasonable and fair opportunity to prepare. The DLC set general timeframes for the pre-exchange of evidence and noted that the parties might also wish to pre-exchange written submissions. Specific deadlines, based on the Practice Note timelines, are now being set and included in the Notice of Hearing for each application.

2.4. DLC professional body

The Council recently participated in a survey regarding a proposed initiative to establish a professional body for DLC chairs and members.

The Council considers a professional body for DLCs could benefit chairs and members in terms of their ongoing professional development, as well as improving succession and offering collegiality and networking opportunities.

Any DLC professional body would need to be independent in order to ensure there was no perception of bias to any particular sector view.

3. Local Alcohol Policy

In accordance with Part 2, subpart 2 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, Wellington City Council developed a provisional Local Alcohol Policy (the PLAP).

The PLAP was notified on January 21, 2014. Appeals were lodged by eight parties which were heard by the Authority over eight days between October 20 and November 5, 2014.

The Authority released its decision on January 20, 2015 which asked the Council to reconsider elements of its PLAP.

The Council resolved on March 18, 2015 to receive a "report to the February 2016 meeting of the Community, Sport, and Recreation Committee on the opportunities to resubmit an amended Provisional Local Alcohol Policy taking into account updated local data and the parameters for local alcohol polices arising from the decision on appeals".

On 3 March 2016, the Council's Community Sport and Recreation Committee resolved that the Council should not at that time resubmit the PLAP to the Authority, and should instead continue to monitor alcohol-related data in Wellington, work with key stakeholders, and consider future ARLA decisions on other PLAP appeals prior to determining if the Council requires a local alcohol policy. The Committee also "agreed to continue to advocate to central government for a higher minimum unit price for alcohol including off licences."

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4. Current legislation

The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 has now been in full force for two and a half years.

It has been the subject of two amending Bills during the period of this report, namely:

- The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Rugby World Cup 2015 Extended Trading Hours) Amendment Act 2015, which established a statutory regime under which eligible licensed premises with on- and club licences were permitted to open during the 2015 Rugby World Cup for the purpose of televising live games that fell outside of those premises' usual trading hours; and
- The Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Anzac Day Trading Hours for Licensed RNZRSA Clubs) Amendment Act 2016, which enabled Royal New Zealand Returned and Services Association Clubs that were incorporated and registered under the Charites Act 2005 to open and sell/supply alcohol to their members and guests between 4am and 1pm on Anzac Day.

As at the time of writing, *The Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Display of Low-alcohol Beverages and Other Remedial Matters) Amendment Bill 2015* is currently before Parliament. The Bill proposes that supermarkets will be able to display low and non-alcohol beer and wine alongside regular products within single alcohol areas.

In its previous Annual Reports, the Wellington DLC has included a list of issues with the Act that it considers warrant clarification, guidance and/or legislative amendment. The following is a list of the DLC's current concerns with the legislation.

4.1. Temporary Authorities

Temporary authority orders allow an applicant who has leased or purchased on or off-licensed premises to continue trading at the premises on the base licence held by the current licence holder. While most temporary authorities are granted for only one three month period, we have seen some premises trading for up to nine months on temporary authority orders. Furthermore, once an applicant is trading on a temporary authority, there is some degree of expectation that they will be able to continue doing so.

The holders of temporary authorities must comply with the conditions of the base licence and with the Act. Nevertheless, we consider that there is potential for risk to arise to the community given the very limited range of factors a DLC may consider when assessing an application under s136. As currently drafted, the only express statutory consideration the Committee is required to make when assessing temporary authority applications is whether

an applicant appears to have a "right, title, estate, or interest in any premises, or any business conducted in any premises for which an on-licence or off-licence is in force...."

The previous Authority has held that suitability is a matter which can be considered on an application for a temporary authority: <u>Nationwide Investments Ltd</u> [1993] NZLLA 2344/93.

The current Authority's first Practice Direction, dated 26 November 2013, takes a similar line stating that:

- "5.1 A temporary authority granted in terms of section 136 of the Act confers upon the holder the same duties, obligations and liabilities as the holder of a licence. The consequences of an unsuitable person operating premises pursuant to a temporary authority could obviously be as equally undesirable as such a person holding a licence.
- 5.2 It is the licensing authority's view that the secretary of the licensing committee should refer any temporary authority to the Police and the Inspector for comment and/or report. Each committee should settle procedures for the referral of such applications. Those procedures should be able to take account of situations where urgency or priority is required.
- 5.3 Any subsequent report or comment to which the committee considers it may wish to have regard in determining an application must be referred to the applicant before any decision is made."

The Wellington DLC would like to see section 136 expanded to provide Committees with the statutory power to consider a broader range of factors for temporary authority applications. It would also be of assistance if there were express reporting requirements and an express power for the DLC to consider any matters raised by reports.

Temporary authority order applications must be considered by a DLC Committee of three due to the provisions of s191. In most cases, such applications are non-contentious. It is suggested that this type of application be added to the list in s191(3) so that, where a DLC Chair considers that a temporary authority application warrants a public hearing (e.g. if suitability were in issue), this could be directed under s202(1) and a 3 person quorum convened, but in all other cases such applications could be dealt with on the papers by a Chair alone.

4.2. 'Supply only' special licences

The Wellington DLC wishes to draw to the government's attention the continuing uncertainty around the licensing requirements, or not, for supply-only alcohol events.

applied for consumption at an

What is clear is that where alcohol is sold and supplied for consumption at an event a special licence is required. Similarly, where alcohol is supplied for consumption at an event where the cost of the alcohol is included in the entry price requires a special licence. This is deemed in the nature of a sale.

What is unclear is whether events such as weddings, birthdays or an art gallery opening where alcohol is supplied free to attending guests requires a special licence. If it is the intention of government that this be so then it needs to be clearly prescribed in the statute. We believe that was not the intent of Parliament when drafting this Act.

For completeness it is noted that, according to case law, BYO-only events cannot be granted a special licence. Parliament may wish to consider reviewing this position.

It is our view that low risk events, with limited quantities of alcohol provided, but still subject to sound host responsibility practices should not be required to hold a special licence. This category of events could be safely managed using guidance material similar to that currently available through the Health Promotion Agency.

There is currently significant variation of interpretation on this issue throughout New Zealand and we encourage the government to urgently clarify this matter.

4.3. Caterers' licences

The Authority has provided guidance, by way of a Practice Direction dated 28 July 2015, as to how caterers' off licences issued under the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 may properly be converted into endorsed caterers' on licences under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. It is suggested that the Act be amended to reflect the Authority's directions.

4.4. Notice period for special licence hearings

It would be of assistance if provision were made to enable the Secretary of the DLC to truncate the ten working day notice period for special licence hearings where such applications need to be dealt with urgently. In some instances there has been insufficient time for a special licence hearing after opposition has been raised, resulting in applicant's either withdrawing their applications or agreeing to licence conditions under time pressure, in order to satisfy reporting agency concerns.

4.5. Notification for special licences

The DLC Secretary has discretion to require public notification of special licence applications. In the event that the Secretary requires notice of such an application, the only way in which this may be done under the Act is by a notice on the site. It is suggested that the ways in which the Secretary may require public notification of a special licence application be expanded to include other media (e.g. online public notice) in appropriate cases.

4.6. Objections and oppositions to new and renewal applications should trigger a public hearing

It is suggested that both reporting agency opposition and public objection, for all premises applications (but not for specials, unless public notification is required) should trigger a public hearing. Natural justice requires this, in the view of the Wellington DLC, in any case. The current provisions are inconsistent and draw a distinction between new and renewal applications² that does not appear justified on any policy grounds.

4.7. Split designations

The current designation requirements for hotel style on licensed premises are not in line with modern reality. The vast majority of hotels, at least in urban centres such as Wellington, no longer include a separate "public bar" area in which patrons gather for the specific purpose of drinking. More common in such premises now are "lobby bar" areas, which are often not distinct from the reception/thoroughfare to the hotel rooms. These areas often are not used for the sale and supply of alcohol all day long. Designating such areas to exclude children can pose real practical problems for licensees.

Similarly, the requirement to designate a "tavern" causes difficulty for premises that trade more in the nature of a café during the day and a bar at night. Time split designations have been adopted for this purpose on the basis that the operation morphs from a restaurant to a tavern at a particular time of night, which section 118 appears to permit. It would be helpful to have clearer legislative support for such an approach.

4.8. Regulations/Forms

The secretariat to the Wellington DLC finds that applicants who are able to submit an application that is complete and correct following the Regulatory forms on their first try is the exception rather than the rule. There is a significant workload for the administrative staff of the DLC in shepherding applicants through the process of completing the forms.

The Wellington secretariat has responded to this issue by undertaking a complete review of its forms and intends amending these substantially to improve their readability and to address such issues as information requested that is no longer legally relevant (e.g. the forms preserve a distinction between public and private companies that no longer exists under the Companies Act 1993 and request details of "nominal" and "paid up" capital, terminology which is no longer in use.)

It is suggested that a review of the forms in the Regulations could be of real benefit.

The following are some errors in the regulatory forms identified by the Wellington DLC:

- forms 9 and 10 should include "Easter Sunday" in condition (a)
- form 9 should not have an exclusion for caterer's endorsed licences from the sacrosanct day trading restrictions – those apply by virtue of s47 to all on licences, there is no express exclusion for s38 caterer's endorsed licences (if that was intended, then an amendment needs to be made to s47)
- form 11 should refer to from Part 6 to Subpart 7 of Part 2
- form 12 and 13 should refer to Subpart 6 to Subpart 7
- form 14 should refer to Section 120 not to Sections 280 and 283.

4.9. Temporary/acting managers regime

Licensees are required to notify the licensing committee of the appointment of any manager, acting manager or temporary manager (s231(1)).

A temporary manager can be appointed for an unspecified period to cover an illness, absence or the resignation or dismissal of a certificated manager. A temporary manager does not hold a manager's certificate at the time of appointment, but must apply for one within 2 working days of being appointed as a temporary manager (s229). An acting manager may be appointed for up to three weeks to cover for a certificated manager who is ill or absent. An acting manager need not hold a manager's certificate and is not required to apply for one (s230).

Licensees who appoint acting or temporary managers must notify the committee, and the Police, within 2 working days. Within 5 working days of that notice of appointment, the committee may notify a licensee that it does not approve of the appointment (s231(4)). The Committee must consider and determine any s231(4) matter in a three person quorum as s231(4) is not listed in s191(3).

In practice, the 5 working days allowed for a licensing committee to undertake a s231(4) consideration is inadequate. The committee will only be alerted to any issues with an appointed manager if the Police or Inspectors raise those. Time is required for this to occur. Natural justice then requires that those issues are put to the licensee and acting or temporary manager and an opportunity to respond is given. A full committee must then be convened to consider and determine the matter and a notice must then be issued.

It would assist if s231(4) decisions were added to the list in section 191(3) of matters that can be determined by a District Licensing Commissioner alone. This would speed the process somewhat.

It would also assist if more time were allowed for the committee to issue a non-approval notice. It may be that it would make sense to draw a distinction between acting and temporary manager appointments in this regard.

Allowing further time in the case of an acting manager could mean that a non-approval order would come too late to make any difference to a particular appointment.³ However, a s231(4) notice would send a signal regarding any decision to appoint the individual in question in future.

Allowing more time in relation to a temporary manager could have a practical effect. A temporary manager who is appointed for longer than 48 hours must apply for a manager's certificate, and may remain appointed until that application is granted (or declined) by the DLC. If there were grounds for the committee to issue a s231(4) notice of non-approval, such a notice would remove a temporary manager in these circumstances and could well discourage his or her application for a manager's certificate.

Under the current regime, the Wellington DLC has never had an acting or temporary manager's appointment queried by the Police, and has not issued any s231(4) notices.

5. Other matters

The DLCs and the Wellington City Council welcome any coordinated, centralised promotion of best practice in the operation of the Act and its Regulations.

The DLCs and Council welcome the recent initiative to investigate the establishment of a DLC professional body with a view to providing training and professional development support to DLCs nationwide.

6. Statistical information

During the reporting period, the Wellington DLCs accepted 2176 applications, being 284 more than were received by the DLCs in the previous financial year.

Wellington Consolidated Bylaw 2008: Part 2 – Animals

Proposed bylaw to be adopted by Council

Changes following Environment Committee on 04 are righlighted. Deletions are marked with strikethrough and additions are underlined.

Purpose

The Wellington Consolidated Bylaw 2008: Part 2 – Animals, gives effect to, and gives legal powers to enforce, the Dog Policy 2016. It also sets requirements for the keeping of animals, to protect the public from nuisance, and to maintain and promote public health and safety and safeguard the welfare of animals.

This bylaw is made under Sections 145 and 146 of the Local Government Act 2002, Section 20 of the Dog Control Act 1996 and Section 64 of the Health Act 1956. The Animal Welfare Act 1999 should be read in conjunction with this bylaw.

1. Definitions

In this bylaw:

Animal has the meaning defined in the Animal Welfare Act 1999 and means any live member of the animal kingdom that is a mammal, bird, bee, or any other member of the animal kingdom that is declared from time to time by the Governor-General, by Order in Council, to be an animal.

Authorised Officer means any person appointed or authorised by the Council on its behalf.

Domestic animal means any animal (including a bird or reptile, but excluding bees) kept as a domestic pet; any working dog; any other animal kept by any person for recreational purposes or for the purposes of that person's occupation or employment.

Nuisance refers to the dictionary definition (a person, thing, or circumstance causing trouble or annoyance; anything harmful or offensive to the community or a member of it and for which a legal remedy exists) or to a statutory nuisance as defined in Section 29 of the Health Act 1956.

Poultry means domestic fowls kept for the eggs they produce, their meat, their feathers, or sometimes as pets.

Public place has the meaning defined in Part 1 of the bylaw and means a place that, at any material time, is open to or is being used by the public, whether free or on payment of a charge, and whether any owner or occupier of the place is lawfully entitled to exclude or eject any person from that place; and includes any aircraft, hovercraft, ship or ferry or other vessel, train, or vehicle carrying or available to carry passengers for reward.

Rural area means any area zoned "Rural" in the Council's Operative District Plan.

The Act means the Dog Control Act 1996.

Urban area means any area that is not zoned "Rural" under the Council's Operative District Plan.

2. Activities that require Council permission

- **2.1** The process to grant Council permission for anyone to carry out the activities set out below is outlined in Part 1 (Introduction) of the Wellington Consolidated Bylaw 2008. Council permission may be granted subject to any conditions the Council sees fit.
- **2.2** The following activities will require the Council's prior written permission:

2.2.1 Animal establishments

- a. Establishing or maintaining any animal boarding establishment, including dog day care services
- **b.** Establishing or maintaining a pet shop, animal hospital, or refuge centre for the keeping, selling, or treating of animals that also operates a business as a boarding establishment.
- **2.2.2** Bringing a domestic animal, other than where this is permitted under the Dog Policy, into areas classified as a beach area (restricted during summer), controlled public place, exercise area (specified times), prohibited public place, prohibited place (specified times) for special events.

3. General conditions of keeping animals

- **3.1** All animals shall be kept in a manner that is not, or is not likely to become, a nuisance, dangerous, offensive, or injurious to health.
- **3.2** All animals shall be kept in a manner that ensures they have adequate physical well-being through acceptable nutrition, environmental, health and behavioural stimulus, and adequate mental well-being.
- **3.3** All domestic animals, other than domestic cats, found at large and not within their owner's property may be seized and impounded by an authorised officer.
- **3.4** The Council may sell, re-home or otherwise dispose of any animal seized and impounded under clause 3.3 that has not been claimed or returned within 7 days after it was seized and impounded.
- 3.5 Feeding animals
- **3.5.1** Feeding of animals can attract rats or other vermin or cause excessive fouling to public places. No animals (excluding dogs) are to be fed in public places, except for in designated areas, or with prior written permission from the Council.
- **3.5.2** Areas for feeding will be clearly signposted. In assessing an application to feed animals, the Council will consider the following factors:
 - a. whether the activity is likely to attract vermin or create public health issues
 - b. whether the activity is likely to cause nuisance, or adversely impact wildlife.

4. Cats

This Part will come into force 18 months after the date the Council adopts the Bylaw or the date the Animals Policy is approved by Council (whichever comes first).

4.1 All domestic cats must be identified as owned.

The Council recommends that owners microchip and register their cats with the New Zealand Companion Animal Register, or other Council approved microchip register.

4.1 All domestic cats over the age of 12 weeks must be microchipped and registered with New Zealand Companion Animal Register, or other Council approved microchip register.

5. Dogs

5.1 Interpretation (dogs)

Beach exercise areas means beach areas where dogs can exercise off-leash.

Beach areas restricted during summer means areas where dogs are prohibited from 10am to 7pm every day during summer (from 1 December until 1 March the consecutive year). These areas are classed as controlled public places where dogs can be on-leash before 10am and after 7pm in summer and on-leash at all times in winter.

Controlled public place means any area where dogs are allowed as long as they are onleash and under the control of their owner.

Disability assist dog means a dog trained (or in training) to assist a person with a disability as defined under the Act, including any guide dog, hearing ear dog, or companion dog.

Exercise area means any area where dogs are allowed off-leash under the control of their owner.

Exercise area (specified times) means areas where dogs are allowed off-leash before 10am and after 7pm in summer (from 1 December until 1 March the consecutive year) and off-leash at all times in winter.

Leash means a strap or chain attached to a collar or harness on the dog, sturdy enough to ensure that the dog is restrained and controlled by the person using the leash.

Owner has the meaning as defined under the Act including every person who owns a dog; or has a dog in his or her possession, or the parent or guardian of a person under the age of 16 years who owns a dog.

Prohibited public place means any area where dogs are not allowed at any time, on or off-

Prohibited place (specified times) means where dogs are prohibited during the times specified.

Working dog means any dog that works for the Government, the Police, is a disability assist dog, or is part of commercial activity.

5.2 Activities that require Council permission

The following activities will require the Council's prior written permission:

5.2.1 Keeping more than three dogs

No household (other than those in a Rural area) may keep more than three dogs in total, unless given prior written permission by the Council. Permission will be required for more than three dogs over the age of 3 months, whether or not the dogs are registered or the owner/occupier is the registered owner of the dogs.

- **5.2.2** On application, dog owners will have to pay the associated fee for permission to keep more than three dogs on a property.
- **5.2.3** In assessing an application under clause 5.2.1 the Council will consider the impact granting Council permission will have on the amenities of the neighbourhood. The Council's permission may be subject to any terms, conditions and restrictions it thinks fit, including:
 - a) specifying the number of dogs that may be kept on the premises at any one time
 - b) specifying the duration of the Council's permission
 - c) restrictions as to the purpose for which the dogs may be kept
- d) provision for the dogs' hygiene, control, confinement and regular inspection provision for the protection of other persons or property from being affected in any way by the dogs.

5.3 Dog nuisances

- **5.3.1** If, in the opinion of an authorised officer, any dog or the keeping of any dog on any premises has become, or is likely to become, a nuisance, injurious or hazardous to health, property, or safety, the officer may require the owner by written notice to:
 - a) reduce the number of dogs kept on the premises
 - construct, alter, reconstruct or otherwise improve the kennels, fences or other buildings used to house or contain the dog
 - take such action as the authorised officer deems necessary to minimise or remove the likelihood of nuisance, hazard or injury to health, property or safety.
- **5.3.2** The owner must comply with any notice issued under clause 5.3.1 within the time specified in the notice.

5.4 Dog areas

- **5.4.1** The Council may, by publicly notified resolution, declare any public place to be one of the following classifications and may impose prohibitions and restrictions in respect of that area:
 - a) controlled public place
 - b) exercise area
 - c) exercise area (specified times)
 - d) beach exercise area
 - e) beach area (restricted during summer)
 - f) prohibited public place
 - g) prohibited public place (specified times).
- **5.4.2** Dogs not on private land must be on-leash and under the control of their owners at all times, unless in a designated off-leash area (where they can be off-leash, but still need to be under the control of their owner).
- 5.4.3 Dogs are permitted to enter any cemetery controlled by the Council, provided that:
 - a) this part of the bylaw is complied with
 - b) the dog is under the control of its owner and on-leash at all times.

This clause is made pursuant to the Burial and Cremation Act 1964.

- **5.4.4** The owner of any dog will ensure their dog does not enter any public place contrary to any classification, prohibition or restriction imposed by the Council under clause 5.4.1.
- **5.4.5** The owner of any dog may keep their dog off-leash in any exercise area, exercise area (specified times), beach exercise area, or beach areas restricted during summer during the times specified in the resolution under clause 5.4.1.
- **5.4.6** Despite any restrictions imposed under clause 5.4.1, any working dog that is working at the time may enter a controlled public place without a leash if required and a prohibited public place, beach areas (restricted during summer) or a prohibited place (specified times) declared under clause 5.4.1.
- **5.4.7** The owner of any disability assist dog may keep their dog off-leash in a controlled public place, prohibited public place, beach areas restricted during summer, or a prohibited place (specified times) declared under clause 5.4.1.
- 5.4.8 Criteria to determine exercise areas

The criteria used to determine exercise areas for dogs include:

- a) the area is not used extensively for sporting or other purposes
- b) the area is of significant size and has appropriate access
- c) there are sufficient sight lines
- d) the area is well bounded from adjacent areas
- e) no potential risk to other groups
- f) new areas must be fenced if they are adjacent to a road.

6. Other animals

6.1 Poultry

- **6.1.1** Poultry must be adequately contained within the owner's property, so as not to cause (or be likely to cause) nuisance, offence or be injurious to health.
- 6.1.2 Activities that require Council permission
 - **a.** No roosters are to be kept in urban areas, unless written permission has been granted by the Council.
 - b. An owner or occupier of any property in an urban area may keep no more than 8/12 chickens (or other poultry) without the Council's prior written permission. In assessing an application to allow more than 8/12 chickens (or other poultry), the Council will consider:
 - i. the number of poultry at the premises
 - ii. provision for the welfare, hygiene, control, and confinement of the poultry
 - iii. provision for the protection of other persons or property from being affected in any way by the poultry
 - iv. the size of the property and proximity to neighbours, and
 - v. any other factors it considers relevant.

The Council may impose whatever conditions it sees fit on any permission it issues.

6.2 Goats

6.2.1 Goats must wear an ear tag (an RFID tag or similar) or collar to indicate that they are not feral, so the owner can be traced if the goat is seized.

6.2.2 All goats kept within the city must be kept confined within their owner's property.

7. Offences

- 7.1 Everyone commits an offence who:
 - a) keeps animals in a manner that is, or is likely to become, a nuisance, dangerous, offensive, or injurious to health
 - b) being the owner or having the care, custody, or control of any domestic animal, other than domestic cats, and does not confine it adequately to prevent it from straying on to any road or car park; trespassing on any land or reaching into or over any residential property or public place
 - c) injures any domestic animal in a public place and fails to render assistance
 - d) kills any domestic animal in a public place and allows it to remain in a public place
 - e) buries any animal carcass anywhere in the district in a manner that is or is likely to become a nuisance, injurious or hazardous to health or safety.
- 7.2 Every dog owner or person in possession of the dog at the time commits an offence who:
 - a) allows their dog to enter or be in a public place when it is infected with an infectious disease or is a bitch in season
 - b) does not immediately pick up and remove and/or dispose of their dog's faeces when their dog defecates in any public place, or on land or premises other than that occupied by the dog's owner
 - allows their dog (except a working dog that is working at the time) in a public place, unless it is controlled by a leash or unless allowed by resolution under clause 5.4.1.

1. INTRODUCTION

The Dog Control Act 1996 referred to as 'the Act', requires the Council to develop a policy on dog control. The Dog Policy specifies:

- the nature and application of any bylaws made to give legal powers to implement the Dog Policy and determine what is considered to be an offence
- public places where dogs will be controlled on a leash, prohibited or allowed off leash (exercise areas)
- whether dogs classified as menacing must be neutered and the criteria used to decide whether to neuter
- · fees and expenditure
- · education programmes (for dogs and owners)
- when owners may be classified as probationary owners or disqualified from owning dogs
- infringements set by the Dog Control Act 1996.

The Council recognises that the majority of dog owners in Wellington are responsible and that most interaction between dogs and the public is positive.

This policy aims to achieve a balance between the control of dogs and recognition of the community health benefits of dog ownership. The policy will be implemented in conjunction with the Wellington Consolidated Bylaw 2008 – Part Two: Animals.

2. PURPOSE

- To ensure that the owners of dogs comply with their obligations under the Act, that
 dogs are well cared for and Wellingtonians are able to enjoy dog ownership.
- To prevent any potential danger caused by dogs to the public, wildlife and natural habitats.
- To minimise the risk of distress and nuisance caused by dogs to the public, wildlife and natural habitats.
- · To actively promote the responsible ownership of dogs.
- To provide for the reasonable exercise and recreational needs of dogs and their owners.

3. DEFINITIONS

Central area means the area zoned "central area" the Council's operative District Plan.

Dangerous dog means any dog classified as dangerous by the Council under section 31 or 33ED of the Act.

Disability assist dog means a dog trained (or in training) to assist a person with a disability as defined under the Act, including any guide dog, hearing ear dog, or companion dog.

Domestic animal means any animal (including a bird or reptile) kept as a domestic pet; any working dog; any other animal kept by any person for recreational purposes or for the purposes of that person's occupation or employment.

Infringement offence has the meaning given to it in section 65(1) of the Act.

Menacing dog means any dog classified as menacing under sections 33A or 33C or 33ED of the Act.

Neutered dog means a dog that has been spayed or castrated; and does not include a dog that has been vasectomised.

Nuisance refers to the dictionary definition (a person, thing, or circumstance causing trouble or annoyance; anything harmful or offensive to the community or a member of it and for which a legal remedy exists) or to a statutory nuisance as defined in Section 29 of the Health Act 1956.

Owner has the meaning as defined under the Act including every person who owns a dog; or has a dog in his or her possession, or the parent or guardian of a person under the age of 16 years who owns a dog.

Probationary owner means any owner classified as probationary under section 21 of the Act.

Protected wildlife means any animal for the time being absolutely or partially protected under the Wildlife Act 1953, and has the same meaning as defined under the Act.

Public place means a place that, at any material time, is open to or is being used by the public, whether free or on payment of a charge, and whether any owner or occupier of the place is lawfully entitled to exclude or eject any person from that place; and includes any aircraft, hovercraft, ship or ferry or other vessel, train, or vehicle carrying or available to carry passengers for reward.

Roaming dog means any dog that is found in any public place or on any land or premises other than that occupied by the owner and is unaccompanied by their owner.

Stock means any animal that is kept within a fence or enclosure for domestic or farming purposes.

Under control a dog can be kept under control by a person by physically limiting its movements, or by using direct commands.

Working dog means any dog that works for the Government, the Police, is a disability assist dog, or is part of commercial activity.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES

4.1 Responsibilities of the Council

Dog owners have a responsibility to provide for their dog's welfare. To support dog owners and the welfare of dogs in Wellington, the Council will:

- provide dogs and their owners with a reasonable level of access to public places, however this will be balanced with the need to protect public safety and to minimise distress and nuisance to the public at large.
- provide designated exercise areas enabling dog owners to exercise their dogs offleash provided the dogs are kept under control at all times
- consider restricting or prohibiting dog access to public places where the likelihood of conflict exists between dogs and the public, while considering existing and previous use of the area
- restrict or prohibit dog access to public places where the likelihood of conflict exists between dogs and wildlife
- actively encourage responsible dog ownership through the promotion of the Responsible Dog Owner (RDO) status
- promote public safety, responsible dog ownership and provisions of the Act and the Council's Dog Policy through education programmes for dog owners and the public
- encourage the use of approved education and obedience courses for dogs.

When dogs have not received proper care and attention the Council will ensure that the appropriate action is taken and may:

- · issue a warning or infringement notice
- · prosecute where it considers the offence or the effects of the offence are significant.

4.2 Responsibilities of Dog Owners

The responsibilities of dog owners are to:

- immediately pick up the faeces of their dog if it defecates in a public place. Failing to pick up dog faeces and properly dispose of it could result in a \$300 infringement
- · ensure their dog does not cause any public nuisance
- ensure that the dog is registered with the Council, and that the Council is notified of any change of address or ownership of the dog
- ensure that the dog is kept under control at all times or confined in such a manner it cannot freely leave its premises
- ensures that the dog has adequate physical well-being through acceptable nutrition, environmental, health and behavioural stimulus, and adequate mental well-being
- take all reasonable steps to ensure that the dog does not cause a nuisance to any other person, whether by persistent and loud barking or howling or by any other means
- take all reasonable steps to ensure that the dog does not injure, endanger, intimidate, or otherwise cause distress to any person

- take all reasonable steps to ensure that the dog does not injure, endanger, or cause distress to any stock, poultry, domestic animal, or protected wildlife:
- take all reasonable steps to ensure that the dog does not damage or endanger any
 property belonging to any other person
- comply with the Act, and any regulations and bylaws made under the Act.

5. ACCESS TO PUBLIC PLACES

5.1 Designated public places

Under the Act, councils can designate public places where dogs are prohibited or allowed on or off-leash. These areas are enforced using the related bylaws.

Designated public places are classified as follows:

- · Controlled public places dogs are allowed on a leash
- · Exercise areas dogs can exercise and socialise off-leash
- · Prohibited places dogs are not allowed in these areas at any time

Dogs must be under the control of their owner at all times on or off-leash. A list of exercise areas and prohibited places are attached in Appendix A.

Wellington City has the additional classifications of:

- Beach exercise areas beach areas where dogs can exercise off-leash.
- Beach areas restricted during summer dogs are prohibited from these areas from 10am to 7pm every day during summer (from 1 December until 1 March the consecutive year). These areas are classed as controlled public places where dogs can be on-leash before 10am and after 7pm in summer and on-leash at all times in winter.
- Exercise area (specified times) dogs are allowed off-leash before 10am and after 7pm in summer (from 1 December until 1 March the consecutive year)-and off-leash at all times in winter.
- Prohibited place (specified time) where dogs are prohibited during the times specified.

5.2 Controlled public places

Dogs must be on-leash and under the control of their owners at all times in public places, unless in an exercise area or exercise area (specified times).

5.3 Exercise areas

The Council provides designated off-leash exercise areas and beach exercise areas across the city. The city also has exercise areas where dogs are allowed off-leash before 10am and after 7pm in summer (from 1 December until 1 March the consecutive year) and off-leash at all times in winter.

Dogs can exercise and socialise off-leash in these areas as long as they remain under the control of their owner. In an exercise area, dogs must be verbally under direct control.

A list of all exercise areas is provided in Appendix A. Maps of all exercise areas are provided in Appendix B.

Dog exercise areas may be considered for other uses over time. This intends to allow for continued improvement in the quality of the areas available for dogs and other park users, and to allow for the protection of wildlife. If this occurs, the existing and previous use of the area will be considered. Consultation will take place before any decisions are made and, where possible, compensatory areas will be provided.

5.3.1 Criteria to determine exercise areas

The criteria used to determine exercise areas for dogs include:

- · the area is not used extensively for sporting or other purposes
- the area is of significant size and has appropriate access
- · there are sufficient sight lines
- · the area is well bounded from adjacent areas
- no potential risk to other groups.
- new areas must be made safe, where appropriate, if they are adjacent to a road
- the potential risk to wildlife

5.3.2 Criteria to determine if a designated exercise area is suitable for fencing

The criteria that may used to determine if an exercise areas is suitable for fencing includes:

- · that the area is a suitable size
- · its location and proximity to other exercise areas
- parking and accessibility

5.4 Prohibited places

Dogs will be restricted or prohibited in places that are used frequently by the public and areas where there is the presence of significant wildlife and/or wildlife habitat.

Prohibited places are listed in Appendix A, Table 5. The city also has areas that are classified as "Prohibited places (specified times)" where dogs are prohibited during the times specified. These places are listed in Appendix A, Table 6.

5.4.1 Right of access to a prohibited place

Dog owners are allowed:

- to move through a play area specifically to move from one side to the other if there is no alternative route but they cannot stop with their dog in the play area
- access to Wellington International Airport if they intend to transport their dog
- to access the side-line of a sportsfield, if the marked sports surface is not in use.

5.4.2 Seal colony restrictions

Areas where seals congregate and "haul out" in the area of Sinclair Head and on the south coast will be classed as prohibited public places.

5.5 Unattended dogs and central city

Dogs are not allowed to be left unattended in any public place, including the Central Area of the city. Dogs are not to be left unattended in the Central Area of the city. Dog must be onlead and with their owners at all times.

Dogs under the control of their owner may stop in public places, including the Central Area of the city.

5.6 Exemptions

Disability assist dogs are exempt from all public place restrictions specified in this policy. They do not need to be on-leash in controlled or prohibited public places.

Disability assist dog exemptions require written authorisation from the appropriate organisation.

Working dogs will also be exempt from the restrictions specified, if they are working at the time.

5.7 Classification of areas under other legislation

Access for dogs can be controlled by other legislation, for example the:

- Conservation Act 1987 "controlled dog areas" and "open dog areas"
- National Parks Act 1980 "national park"

At present there are no areas in Wellington City that are classified according to these provisions.

6. REGISTRATION, FEES AND EXPENDITURE

6.1 Registration

The maintenance of a dog registration system is both a statutory requirement and an essential component of the efficient running of a dog control service.

Information will be provided to dog owners and potential owners about their obligation to register their dog.

Registration will be monitored and the following action taken against owners who fail to register their dog:

- · issuing of a warning or infringement notice
- impounding of unregistered dogs (Note: all dogs will be required to be registered before they are released from the shelter).

6.2 Fees

6.2.1 Registration fees

Registration fees are due on 1 July each year. There are penalties for late dog registration.

Dog registration fees are set by Council resolution in accordance with the Revenue and Financing Policy. They are consulted on through the Annual Plan or Long-term Plan. When appropriate, this consultation may also cover levels of service.

A full registration fee must be paid for dogs that have not been neutered. A discounted dog registration fee is available for owners who:

- · hold Responsible Dog Owner status
- have a neutered dog
- have a working dog(s).

There is no registration fee for disability assist dogs.

6.2.2 Other fees

Fees are also charged by the Council for:

- · dogs who have been impounded (impounding fees and daily sustenance fees)
- permission to keep more than three dogs (in urban premises not rural)
- collection or delivery of a dog on behalf of an owner
- euthanasia of a dog at the owner's written request
- · replacement registration tags
- · Responsible Dog Owner status (this includes site inspection fees).

Fees are set and advertised before the beginning of each registration year. The registration year runs from 1 July to 30 June the consecutive year.

6.3 Dog revenue and expenditure

The Council recovers approximately 75 percent of the total cost associated with dog control through registration and control fees, and enforcement. Residential rates are used to meet the approximate remaining 25 percent of dog-related costs. The exact spilt is set in the Revenue and Finance Policy in the Annual Plan process.

The Council may seek appropriate sponsorship to offset its capital or operating costs. A report on revenue, expenditure and activities undertaken is within the Council's annual dog control report.

Funds generated from dog registration fees are used to provide: facilities and maintenance of dog exercise areas; signs and advertising about dog bylaws; education programmes and campaigns for schools; community groups and businesses; dog control including law enforcement and attending to complaints and incidents; administering the shelter at Moa Point; and administering the dog control programme.

7. MICROCHIPPING DOGS

Owners must provide permanent identification of their dog (other than a working dog) by arranging for the dog to be implanted with an approved microchip when the dog is:

- registered for the first time on or after 1 July 2006
- · classified as dangerous or menacing on or after 1 December 2003
- · impounded and not registered
- · registered and impounded twice.

Where microchipping has not occurred the Council may:

- issue a warning or an infringement notice
 - prosecute the owner
 - if the dog has been impounded, microchip the dog and recover the costs from the owner or person taking possession of the dog.

The Council requires a copy of the implantation certificate at the time of registration.

8. ACTIVELY PROMOTING RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERSHIP

8.1 Responsible Dog Owner status

The Council encourages responsible dog ownership through the promotion of its Responsible Dog Owner (RDO) status. The Council will actively encourage dog owners to achieve RDO status, with the goal of having 50 percent of owners registered as RDO by 2019.

Dog owners can apply for RDO status if they meet the criteria listed at 7.1.1.

Once RDO status is obtained owners receive a discount on their annual registration fee. Unless cancelled for one of the reasons set out at 7.1.2, an owner can retain their RDO status for as long as they require it.

Additional payment for RDO status will only occur if:

- a) the owner moves house and requires another site inspection
- b) the owner's RDO status is cancelled for reasons detailed.

Note: Responsible dog owners still require permission from the Council to keep more than three dogs.

An owner's RDO status can be held in suspension for up to 24 months if the owner is travelling away from Wellington or their dog dies. Responsible Dog Owner status will only be reinstated if the owner still lives at the same property or until the new property has been approved.

8.1.1. Criteria for Responsible Dog Owner status

To be classified as a Responsible Dog Owner the following criteria must be met:

- a) The owner must comply with the Council bylaw requirements as they relate to dogs (e.g. dogs must be under control at all times, owners must remove their dog's faeces in public places);
- b) The owner's dog must have been registered in Wellington for at least 1 year; or the owner must provide adequate proof of having held this status from their previous authority. If an owner has not been registered in Wellington for at least 1 year the owner should provide the Council with a pass certificate for an approved Responsible Dog Owner Education and Obedience course; The owner must provide the Council with a pass certificate for an approved Responsible Dog Owner Education and Obedience course;
- c) The owner must not have:
 - received a conviction under the Act
 - · received an infringement notice in the last year
 - · had a dog impounded in the last year
 - · been the subject of a substantiated public complaint in the last year
 - · been classified as a Probationary or Disqualified owner, or
 - · received a conviction under the Animal Welfare Act 1999;
- d) The area of the property that the dog has free access to a fully enclosed containment area (not necessarily a fully fenced garden/yard)
- e) Any outside kennels must be weatherproof and hygienic

An application and payment of the prescribed fee must be made to Council, and approved before the benefits of the RDO status can be gained.

8.1.2 Cancellation of Responsible Dog Owner status

An owner's Responsible Dog Owner status will be cancelled if the owner:

- a) Is convicted of an offence under the Act. The owner will never be permitted to be reinstated as a RDO.
- b) Is issued with an infringement notice. The owner will not be permitted to be reinstated as a RDO for a year.
- Has their dog impounded. The owner will not be permitted to be reinstated as a RDO for a year.
- d) Has one substantiated complaint. The owner will not be permitted to be reinstated as a RDO for a year.
- e) Fails to pay dog registration fees by the 31 July penalty deadline. Registration fees are due on 1 July each year but an owner will lose their RDO status if they fail to pay their registration fee by 31 July. If this occurs, the owner will not be permitted to be reinstated as a RDO until after one registration payment is made by the due date.

If the owner moves from the approved property, then the owner will not be permitted to be reinstated as a RDO until the new property is approved by the Council.

9. EDUCATION

The Council will offer an education programme free of charge to promote public safety and responsible dog ownership as defined under Act and the Council's Dog Policy. The programme will include:

- · presentations to schools on dog behaviour and safety
- educational materials to dog owners on dog welfare, dog control problems and their avoidance, dog safety, the handling of dogs and the rights of the general public.

Media publicity will be used to promote public awareness of the:

- · responsibilities of dog owners, including:
 - that dogs must be on-leash at all times, unless at a designated off-leash exercise area

- failing to pick up dog faeces and improperly disposing of them can lead to a \$300 fine
- · responsibilities of Council
- need to ask permission from owners before members of the public approach unknown dogs
- · Council's Dog Policy and related bylaws.

A copy of the Council's Dog Policy and related bylaws will also be available to every dog owner through the Council website. These publications will also be available in hard copy on request.

9.1 Dog obedience

The Council will encourage the use of approved education and obedience courses by promoting them as a criterion to attain Responsible Dog Owner status and for probationary owners. A list of Wellington dog trainers will be provided on the Council website.

10. MINIMISING NUISANCE

10.1 Nuisance

Nuisance caused by dogs can include:

- · barking dogs
- · dog faeces
- · roaming dogs.

In managing nuisance caused by dogs the Council will:

- educate owners about major nuisances associated with the ownership of dogs and how to avoid them
- require owners to take steps considered necessary to abate dog nuisance such as removing faeces left by their dog in public places and properly disposing of them
- provide appropriate deterrents against non-compliance with dog control laws by issuing warning or infringement notices, prosecuting where the offence or the effects of the offence are significant, impounding roaming or unregistered dogs
- · control the number of dogs kept on a property
- provide incentives such as Responsible Dog Owner status to encourage responsible dog ownership.

10.2 Abatement of nuisance

Where a complaint has been received and a Dog Control Officer considers that a nuisance exists the officer may issue the owner with a notice requiring the owner to stop the nuisance. These notices will be issued pursuant to the Wellington Consolidated Bylaw 2008: Part 2 - Animals.

10.3 Barking Dogs

Where a dog is considered to be causing a nuisance through persistent and loud barking or howling a Dog Control Officer may issue the owner of the dog with a notice requiring the owner to make such reasonable provisions to stop the nuisance.

The owner of the dog has 7 days to either comply with the notice or object to the Council about the content of the notice. The process for objections is set out in section 55 of the Act.

If the notice is not complied with, the Council may issue an infringement notice to the owner. If the nuisance notice is not complied with and further complaints have been received, a Dog Control Officer may remove the dog from the land or premises.

11. MENACING AND DANGEROUS DOGS

11.1 Classification as a menacing dog

The Council may classify a dog as menacing if the dog: poses a threat to any person, stock, poultry, domestic animal, or protected wildlife because of:

- · any observed or reported behaviour of the dog; or
- · any characteristics typically associated with a prohibited dog breed or type.

The process for objecting to a dog's classification as a menacing dog is set out in sections 33B and 33D of the Act.

The Council must classify dogs as menacing if they wholly or predominantly belong to the breeds of dogs listed in Schedule 4 to the Act.

As set out in sections 33E, 33EA and 36A of the Act, a dog that is classified as menacing:

- · must be muzzled and on-leash in any public place
- · must be microchipped within 2 months of classification
- maintains its status as a menacing dog no matter where it lives in New Zealand.

11.2 Neutering of menacing dogs

Under sections 33E and 33EB of the Act when a dog is classified as menacing the Council will order the owner to have the dog neutered, unless the owner provides a certificate from a vet that the dog is not in a fit condition to be neutered. The Council has a discretion to waive the requirement for neutering on a case by case basis. It will consider the likelihood of the dog posing a threat in public and whether neutering is likely to curb the menacing behaviour when requiring a dog to be neutered.

11.3 Dangerous Dogs

As set out in section 31 of the Act, the Council must classify a dog as dangerous where:

- · an owner of the dog has been convicted of a specified offence;
- the territorial authority has reasonable grounds to believe the dog constitutes a threat
 to the safety of any person, stock, poultry, domestic animal or protected wildlife
 based on sworn evidence that the dog has shown aggressive behaviour on one or
 more occasions; or
- the owner admits in writing that the dog constitutes a threat to the safety of any person, stock, poultry, domestic or protected wildlife animal.

The process for objecting to a dog's classification as a dangerous dog is set out in section 31 of the Act.

As set out in sections 32, 32A and 36A of the Act, a dog that is classified as dangerous:

- must be kept within a securely fenced portion of the owner's property (note: dog-free access to at least one door of the property must be available)
- must be muzzled and on-leash in any public place
- · must be neutered within 1 month after receipt of a notice of classification
- must be microchipped within 2 months of classification
- is subject to a higher registration fee
- must not be disposed of to any other person without the written consent of the Council
- · maintains its status as a dangerous dog no matter where it lives in New Zealand.

12. ENFORCEMENT

12.1 Impounding and seizing

The Act sets out certain provisions for the impounding of dogs. Where any dog is found at large in a public place in contravention of a bylaw or on any property other than the owners' (without the consent of the owner/occupier in question) it may be impounded.

Where any dog is impounded and the owner is known, the Council will make all attempts to contact the owner. The owner then has 7 days to recover the dog from the pound.

Where the owner of the dog is unknown the Council must keep the dog for 7 days. If the dog is not claimed, after this time the dog may be disposed of (eg a new owner found) or destroyed as the Council sees fit.

Where the owner of a dog does not comply with registration or microchipping requirements or the requirements of a menacing or dangerous dog classification the dog(s) may be seized and impounded. The dog may also be seized and impounded if not under proper control or it has attacked.

All registration requirements, fees and pound fees must be paid and the dog microchipped before a dog will be released from the pound.

12.2 Impounding fees

Under section 68 of the Act the Council can set fees for the impounding of dogs. Fees are set for seizure, sustenance, and the destruction of a dog. These fees can be varied for registered and unregistered dogs and may be graduated for repeated impounding of the same dog.

Impounding fees are listed on the Council's website.

12.3 Infringement notices

The Act empowers Dog Control Officers to issue infringement notices that impose fine on the recipient. Infringement notices can only be issued for particular offences (called infringement offences) as listed in Appendix D.

Fine amounts are set in the Act and range from \$100 to \$750. The Council has no discretion to alter these fees.

Once a fine has been issued the recipient has 28 days to pay it. After this period of time a reminder notice is issued. Twenty-eight days after issue of a reminder notice the infringement can be filed with the court. The court can then serve proceedings to recover any outstanding fines and any additional costs incurred.

The use of infringement notices is considered an efficient method of enforcement and allows the Council to fulfil its objectives under this policy. The Council may consider issuing an infringement notice rather than referring an offence to the court. As part of this system the Council may issue warning notices for particular infringement offences.

12.4 Prosecution

Where an offence is considered to be serious and sufficient evidence exists, the Council will consider prosecuting an offender. This includes situations where a dog has:

- · caused significant damage to property
- · caused significant damage or injury to any person or animal
- · caused severe distress
- caused danger, distress or nuisance to any person or the community on a number of occasions.

Situations for which a person can be prosecuted are defined in the Act and are set out in Appendix C.

12.5 Probationary ewners

When an owner is convicted of an offence under the Act (or other Act specified in section 21 of the Act) or has committed three infringement offences not related to a single incident within a continuous 24-month period, the Council will classify that owner as a probationary owner for a period of 24 months. The 24-month period will start from either the date of the offence or the date of the third infringement offence.

The probationary classification has the following effects within 14 days of being classified as a probationary owner:

- the owner is not allowed to own any dogs other than those that were owned at the time the classification was made
- the owner must dispose of any unregistered dogs.

A probationary owner has the right to object to the classification. The Act sets out a number of matters whereby the 24-month probationary period can be reduced. In considering an objection the Council will have regard to:

- the circumstances and nature of the offence(s)
- the competence of the person in terms of responsible dog ownership
- any steps taken by the person to prevent further offences
- · the matters advanced in support of the objection and any other relevant matters.

The Council will encourage all owners classed as probationary to undertake approved dog education and obedience courses.

12.6 Disqualification of ownership

Any owner convicted of an offence under the Act (or other Acts specified in section 25 of the Act), or who has committed three infringement-offences not related to the same event within 24 months, can be immediately disqualified from owning or possessing any dog.

A probationary owner who is convicted of a further offence, or receives three further infringement notices, can be disqualified from owning a dog. It is not necessary for an owner to be classified as a probationary owner before being disqualified.

The disqualified owner must dispose of all dogs they own within 14 days of being notified of the decision. Disqualified owners cannot own any more dogs for up to 5 years. A disqualified owner has the right to object to the classification.

13. BYLAWS

Under the Act the Council is required to create bylaws to give effect to the Dog policy. The Act lists the particular matters for which bylaws can be made. Bylaws relating to this policy are contained in the Wellington Consolidated Bylaw 2008 – Part Two: Animals.

The purpose of the Wellington Consolidated Bylaw 2008 – Part Two: Animals is to specify the requirements for the keeping of animals (including dogs) in order to protect the public from nuisance, maintain and promote public health and safety, and safeguard the welfare of animals. The following are in that bylaw.

Breaching the bylaw could result in a result in a \$300 infringement under the Dog Control Act.

13.1 Notice to abate dog nuisance

Where a Dog Control Officer considers that any dog or the keeping of any dog has become a nuisance, injurious or hazardous to the health, property or safety of any member of the public, an officer may in writing require the owner to:

- · reduce the number of dogs kept on a premises
- construct, alter, reconstruct or improve the kennels or other buildings used to house or contain the dog or dogs
- take such action as an officer deems necessary to minimise or remove the likelihood of nuisance, or injury or hazard to health, property, or safety to any member of the public.

13.2 Restriction on diseased dogs or dogs on heat

A dog is not allowed to enter or be in a public place when it is infected with an infectious disease, or it is a bitch in season.

13.3 Fouling of public places

The owner or handler of the dog will immediately remove and properly dispose of their dog's faeces if the dog defecates in a public place or on land or premises other than that occupied by the owner.

13.4 Dogs in public places

The bylaw identifies that the Council may, by publicly notified resolution, declare any additional public place to be one of the following classifications and may impose prohibitions and restrictions in respect of that area:

- · controlled public place
- · exercise area
- · exercise area (specified times)
- · beach exercise area
- beach area (restricted during summer)
- · prohibited public place
- · prohibited place (specified times).

Tables listing these areas are attached in Appendix A.

Any working dog that is working at the time may enter any public place off-leash if required.

13.5 Council permission required for more than three dogs

The bylaw requires that any household (other than in the rural area) that keeps more than three dogs in total on the property must obtain prior Council permission to do so. Permission will be required for more than three dogs over the age of 3 months, whether or not the dogs are registered or the owner/occupier is the registered owner of the dogs.

The Council will have the right to impose terms and conditions on the granting of permission, including:

- · specifying the number of dogs that may be kept at any one time
- · specifying the duration of the permission
- · restrictions as to the purpose for which such dogs may be kept
- provision for hygiene, control, confinement and regular inspection
- provision for the protection of other persons or property from being affected in any way by the dogs
- · provision for emergencies, including food, muzzles, leads for all dogs, and carriers.

On application, dog owners will have to pay the associated fee for permission to keep more than three dogs on a property.

Any person who faces an infringement or prosecution under the Animal Welfare Act 1999 will have any permission to keep more than three dogs revoked.
