Questions for the presenter

- What do you consider are the current barriers to accessibility and inclusion in the arts for disabled people
- Does WCC currently require those who seek grants to provide some major accessibility innovations and activities in order to get those grants?
- Is there some way Council can publically applaud and reward Downstage theatre for providing audio description for blind people? They have set an excellent example and perhaps Council could feature them in a publication to show others it can be done.

Discussion

- Awareness that communication about arts and culture activity is a barrier that is, not all websites etc are accessible
- Access to venues where activity is taking place can be a barrier. This is why
 organisations that are receive regular Council funding are expected to use
 accessible venues.
- Another barrier is that the content of the arts experience may not be accessible for some people and so Council is encouraging and supporting arts organisations to provide access through signed performances etc. A key issue is to ensure that the arts organisations find out which experiences people would like to be accessible. This is why Council has been facilitating contact between arts organisation and local accessibility organisations.
- Another key area is -Access to active participation in creative experiences –
 ensuring that there are ways and groups to support all people to actively participate
 in cultural experiences

- Council been working with groups to raise awareness, in current contracts groups will be required to create and implement an accessibility action plans and strategies

 most see the value and importance of the process
- Concern was expressed by AAG members at the lack of Council presence at recent events, in particular, to an Audio description set of workshops and a session on web accessibility.
