Earthquake Resilience Presentation by Neville Brown, Programme Director, Earthquake Resilience Wellington City Council	Slides from presentaiton attached as appendix. Neville's presentaiton was designed to respond to the questions PAG members had asked. Items to note: The Council has had a robust and extensive Earthquake Resilience programme Buildings for some year, well before the events in CHCH. Buildings pre 1976 may well be constructed with unreinforced masonry. Things to look for in at risk buildings are: verandas and parapets, Oamaru stone, ornamental features such as finials. In Wellington 835 buildings have been noted as having historic value. Buildings are being assessed at the rate of approx 500 per year. Project commenced in 2006 with expected completion in 2013. A checklist for building owners is being developed and a building inspection service to evaluate the risk in an earthquake is also being developed. Booklet being published by BRANZ. Further information: Mapping of buildings will be published on web site, in future. Neville to send link to Janette when finished. Question from Anthony – would the Council consider a land swop if hazardous buildings identified. Neville to consider in his report to Council.
