 - b. Address other issues identified in noise provisions that are not part of Plan Change 1 "Omnibus";
- 3. Direct officers to include in a future draft submission on resource management reform:
 - a. Issues with the current noise enforcement system as it relates to live music.
 - b. Options for resource management reform, including:
 - i. National direction on noise in mixed use environments
 - ii. Alignment between noise enforcement provisions under the Resource Management Act (RMA) and District Plan noise limits
 - iii. How to increase certainty for noise emitters;
- 4. Note that officers may include minor fixes to noise provisions through the District Plan Change 1 "Omnibus".
- 5. Direct officers investigate whether current provisions for temporary outdoor events could be expanded to include indoor events, including those held on public holidays, to better reflect the operating patterns of the city's creative and cultural sector.
- 6. Note that the RMA'S current guidance for noise control is subjective.
- 7. Direct officers to investigate the feasibility of incorporating standard sound level measurements as part of the enforcement process for noise complaints under Section 326, where practical and within resource constraints (e.g., weather conditions, equipment availability).
