## Hi Krystle,

Ryman are continuing to work on the additional shading studies and wanted to clarify the intended outputs in case the Commissioners wish to comment on Friday. As we understand, the Commissioners thought it may be useful to produce two additional shading studies for the Scapa Terrace interface that show:

- The shade cast by a permitted 2m tall fence on top of the shading studies already provided in the RCA.
- Shading outcomes between midwinter (22 June) and the spring equinox (23 September).

Each study will take staff approximately 1 hour to prepare and hence to get the work completed during the hearing, Ryman proposes to not adjust all 80 sun shade images (prepared at 15 minute intervals) in the RCA. Mr Burns has advised that the following range of times and additional sun studies should be useful and relevant to inform the Panel.
