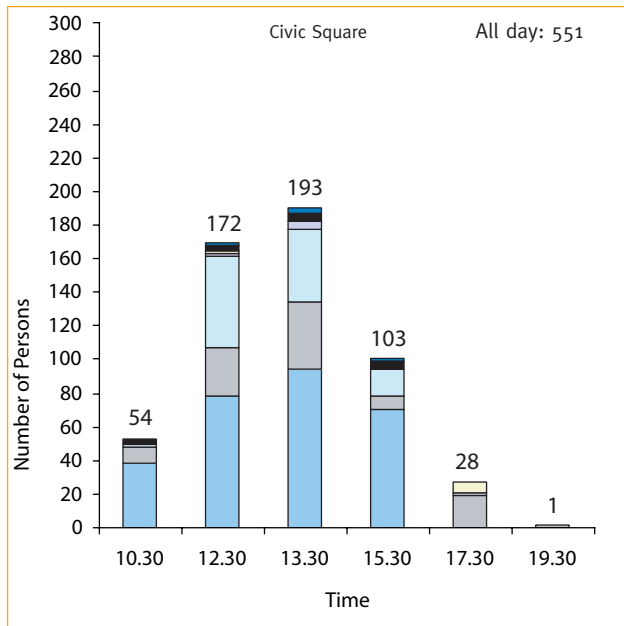
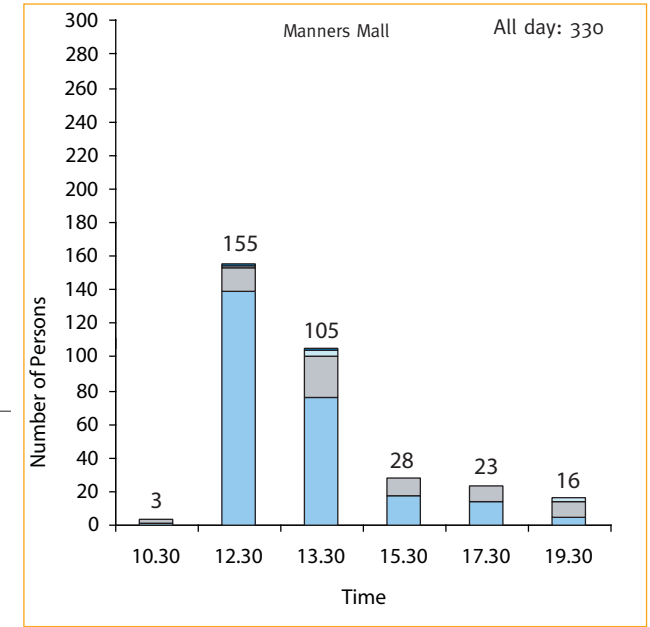
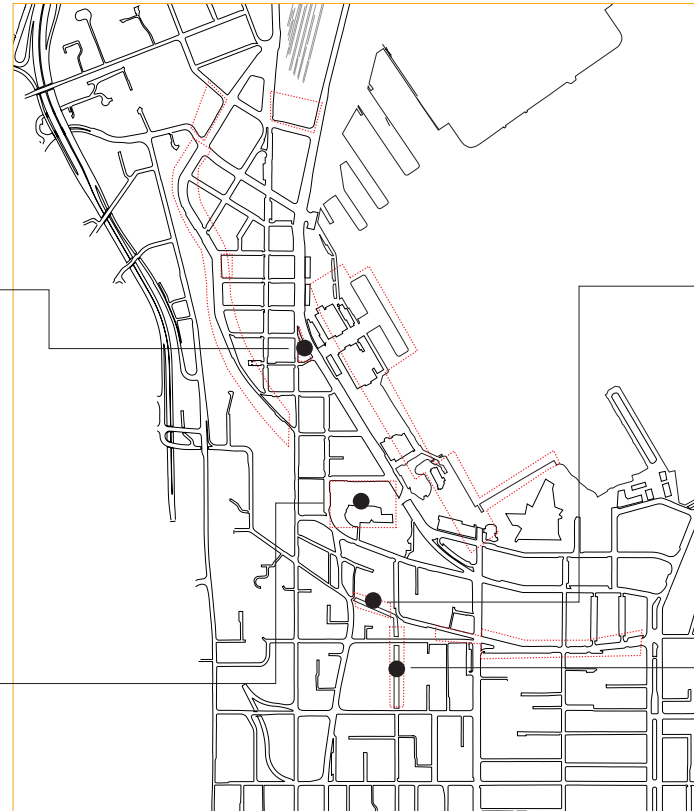
Railway Station Forecourt and Parliament Grounds: Under-utilised public spaces with almost no recreational activities.
