Summary


- Recession not yet showing an impact on hospitality and retail spend. In fact, some indication of a slight upturn in the central city
- Public transport use is trending up perhaps more people returning to the office?
- Net migration remains high and is likely to make a recession mild and a recovery strong.







Retail/hospo spend: inflation adjusted




- Central city starting to turn the corner
 - Trend line is starting to tilt upwards
- Suburbs steady

Bus weekday loadings




- Loadings recovering towards 2019 levels

Train snapper weekday users




- 19,000 peak workday Snapper card users train into the central city each day

Visitors by market: not so fast




- Markets appear to have stabilised

Auckland

- 150,000 (or so) back-packers/annum continue flowing in
 - Replacing the 300,000 that powered our economy 'back in the day'
- Bringing skills, energy and \$\$
- · They may help lift us out of recession
- Wellington
 - Returning closer to a net zero situation
