

Insight 1 Shifting city perceptions


Thinking about the look and feel of Wellington in general... Total agree Wellington is a great place to live, work and play --- I feel a sense of pride in the way Wellington looks and feels 95% 95% 91% 85% 85% 85% 84% **76%** 75% 60% 2014 2015 2016 2020 2021 2017 2018 2019

Perceptions of the city as being a great place and pride in the look of the city have dropped this year

However, the city continues to be rated higher by its residents compared to how other city dwellers think of their own cities


This is similar to other perceptions of the city

However, as seen before it ranks high compared to other urban cities, and at a nationwide level perceptions of the city haven't declined

Insight 2 Sense of safety in the CBD

While sense of safety in the CBD during the day has remained steady, perceptions of safety after dark have dropped since last year





Females generally feel less safe outside their homes after dark with those under 30 feeling the least safe.



Despite this drop, Wellingtonians still rate their sense of safety at night in the CBD higher than other city residents rate their own


Safety after dark in the city centre... total feel safe





Insight 3 Development and heritage tensions


While still high, the public have lower perceptions around the contribution heritage items bring to the city/community



Similarly, we are seeing less agreement around whether Wellington's local identity is appropriately valued/protected and around the balance between development and preservation




Insight 4 Ease of getting around



And only Wellingtonians believe peak traffic volumes are acceptable






Ease of cycling around the city has also declined since 2017



Insight 5 Stormwater & environmental perceptions




Unsurprisingly, we are seeing satisfaction with stormwater management (pipes) steadily dropping

Local perceptions of Wellington's environment have dropped this year

Perceptions of Wellington's natural environment being appropriately managed and protected has sharply dropped this year, as has the perception of it as an eco-city.




Insight 6 Governance



Satisfaction with how Council makes decisions has declined this year

Wellington City Council is no longer a leader in governance

The drop in satisfaction is across demographics – making this a citywide issue

Perceptions around participation and the opportunity to engage have not dropped

We have also seen a drop in residents believing we are making decisions in the best interests of the city, and their understanding of how we make decisions
