ACTIVITY SUMMARY

Following the completion of the international and domestic season the Basin was able to host a week of community cricket, this included the Premier Men's Club Final between Eastern Suburbs and Johnsonville, the Regional Boys and Girls Secondary Schools Finals that involved Wellington College, St Pats Sliverstream, Tawa College and Wellington Girls College. Following this Primary School Finals involving Raroa Intermediate, Hutt International Boys School, Evans Bay Intermediate and Wellesley College. The week was concluded with the first Governor General's Girls XI fixture against former Wellington Blaze and White Ferns players.

Work on the RA Vance Stands and Scoreboards are now complete, and the result has been excellent. Both items are much more presentable and informal positive feedback has been received by many parties. At the same time, work has continued the Masterplan design work and this is now progressing well.

Basin Reserve Master Plan

The Trust continues to work with Council and architects Tennent-Brown in progressing the vision of the Masterplan. The Trust is supportive of the inclusive engagement process delivered by Tennent-Brown, and believes that they are now well placed to present a comprehensive and well thought out plan for the Basin's future development. The Trust has been involved in meetings discussing the designs of the Western Side of the Ground which will ideally commence at the end of the 2017-18 season at the start of April.

Progression of the Masterplan will take two streams over the next twelve months; 1) detailed planning of the major items (Museum Stand, Lights, Embankments etc) and 2) completion of minor items covering the following areas:

RA Vance Stand Progress

External and internal refurbishment works completed in 2017 prior to West Indies test match.

Scoreboards

Refurbishment completed.

Museum Stand Precinct:

Detailed design for Brierley Terrace (also referred to as SW Terrace in design documents) and playground almost complete. Some minor changes required (e.g. design for installation of silt traps to field & channel drains) following pre-application meeting with Council's consenting teams for building consent. Also, some re-worked design required to allow for pre-cast concrete retaining walls and geo-grid under the ramp/road to minimise earthworks excavation. Tender closed and WCC now in negotiations with preferred contractor. This contract includes the Players' Pavilion works.

Museum Stand:

All engineering reports and peer review completed and QS for strengthening options received. Awaiting some final QS estimates for refurbishment works – expect by mid next week. Officer's report to Council in May for Council's decision on the future of the stand. Officer recommendation will be to retain and strengthen the stand.

Players' Pavilion:

Detailed design almost complete. Some 'enabling works' needed before construction can begin. This includes relocating a drain from under the planned new building foot print and this work is still in the design stages. Risk to programme of hold up related to this item. Demolition consent and building consent applications being prepared by Tennent Brown for lodgement this week.

Northern Entrance

Officers still not happy with designs for this reserve area so Council's own landscape architect preparing simple design for road reserve area. Still aim to have contractor develop and re-grass this area for spring 2018.

Rest of ground:

Embankments & toilets preliminary design to begin in 2018 winter. Also, perimeter fence and entrances to be done at the same time.
