Risk appetite statements: practical application

- 1. For governors as a reference to weigh the range of risks associated with decision, and as a guide for evaluating options
- 1. For officers when describing the types of risks associated in papers briefings and workshops with a project/initiative;
- 2. As a clear trigger for reporting, monitoring and escalating risks
- 3. For officers' business Unit planning as a guide on which work to prioritise, how to balance risks and opportunities, guided by WCC risk culture

Officers' recommendation

Advance risk appetite statements to the full Council where they will be considered for adoption

- Those with clear majorities –simple risk appetite statements
- Those with clear trends ranged/combined risk appetite statements

Officers' recommendation

Based on the results of the in-person workshop and the online survey:

- Five statements have clear majority support
- Five statements show majority support for two adjacent options trends/ranged statements have been provided

Majority risk appetite statements

Staff health and safety

Cautious The health and safety of WCC staff is important. We will avoid all preventable risks to staff physical and mental health and safety unless they can be mitigated to minor risks. We will proactively monitor, manage and report health and safety risks in exceedance of legal requirements. All staff will have access to H&S training.

Transparency and public participation

Cautious Council governance meetings should be transparent and open to the public, minutes and agendas must be available. Key strategic decisions require effective public participation and consultation. The default position is to share all information but some information will be withheld in specific circumstances and makes use of the public exclusion process







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Majority risk appetite statements

Reputation and perception

Flexible Council acknowledges that Wellingtonians have diverse opinions and that some decisions may be controversial or unpopular and result in negative perceptions of us. Council will engage in good faith with the media

Private and sensitive data

Cautious We won't tolerate intentional release of private or sensitive data or privileged information. We'll follow central government Protective Security Requirements to ensure we prevent unintentional release or malicious attacks on our data

Strategic partnerships (excluding mana whenua partnership)

Cautious WCC recognises the value of partnerships in our work. The council will build partnerships and collaborate to deliver shared benefits and outcomes

Trend/range risk appetite statements Community health and safety

Cautious-flexible The Council will take all practicable and legally required steps to reduce the chance of harm to the public on Council managed sites. The Council will work with partners and the public on safety initiatives in public spaces. This may include mitigating environments that create opportunities for harmful social behaviour

Cautious The Council will take all practicable and legally required steps to reduce the chance of harm to the public on Council managed sites. The Council will proactively work with partners to mitigate environments that create opportunities for harmful social behaviour.

Flexible The Council will take practicable and legally required steps to reduce the chance of harm to the public on Council managed sites and engage with public safety initiatives on other sites.

Trend/range risk appetite statements Capital Budget and insurance headroom

Cautious-flexible We will not tolerate actions that have a significant negative impact on long term financial sustainability. We will hold balance sheet capacity to cover 40-80% of uninsured expected losses in a major event. We will consider variations in capital budgets outside contingency on a case-by-case basis. All critical assets must have insurance cover and we will seek a mix of external insurance and self-insurance cover based on criteria relating to availability, cost, benefit and criticality. Alternative and innovative risk funding will be considered for non-critical assets.

Cautious We will not tolerate actions that have a significant negative impact on long term financial sustainability. We will hold balance sheet capacity to cover 60-80% of un-insured expected losses in a major event. Major capital projects must meet budget within contingency for all variations within Council's control. All critical assets must have comprehensive insurance cover.

Flexible We will not tolerate actions that have a significant negative impact on long term financial sustainability. We will hold balance sheet capacity to cover 40-60% of un-insured expected losses in a major event. We will consider variations in capital budgets outside contingency on a case-by-case basis. We will seek a mix of external insurance and self-insurance cover based on criteria relating to availability, cost, benefit and criticality. Alternative and innovative risk funding will be considered for non-critical assets.

Trend/range risk appetite statements Operational Budget

Cautious-flexible We will not tolerate fraudulent or corrupt financial transactions. Minor budget variations are acceptable, provided they are in line with the WCC Procurement Policy, and variations fall within 5% of the activity or group budget.

Cautious We will not tolerate fraudulent or corrupt financial transactions. Minor budget variations are acceptable provided spending is in line with procurement policy and falls within 5% of the activity budget.

Flexible We will not tolerate fraudulent or corrupt financial transactions. We trust individual budget holders to make decisions about budget variances in their own departments provided the overall activity group budget is within 5%



Trend/range risk appetite statements Mana whenua partnerships

Flexible-open The Council will engage and work with mana whenua as partners to deliver shared outcomes but generally focus on WCC priorities. Council will take Tūpiki Ora outcomes into consideration for key decisions and meet all legal requirements for engagement and consultation.



Flexible The Council will engage and work with mana whenua as partners when there are shared outcomes that benefit WCC over and above legal requirements. Council will take Tūpiki Ora outcomes into consideration for key decisions.

Open The Council will generally prioritise its own strategic priorities and will adhere to all legal requirements for engagement and consultation with mana whenua.

Trend/range risk appetite statements Legislative compliance

Cautious-flexible We will focus our efforts on monitoring compliance with key legislation and will not tolerate deliberate breaches of these key Acts. We will take a risk-based approach to non-compliance with all other legislation that may apply to WCC

Cautious We will not tolerate deliberate breaches of key legislation. Unintentional breaches of the key Acts may occur but we will reduce this as much as practicable.

Flexible We will focus our compliance monitoring on the key legislation. We will take a risk-based approach to non-compliance with all other legislation that may apply to WCC.
