







Vacant properties brokered for community use by Urban Dream Brokerage 2013-16



Traffic Resolutions – Bus Stop Changes – Kanpur Road, Broadmeadows

A report titled Traffic Resolutions - Bus Stop Changes - Kanpur Road, Broadmeadows is attached to be considered as a major late item at this meeting.

In accordance with section 46A(7) of the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 and Standing Order 3.9.5, a procedural resolution is required before a major item that is not on the agenda for the meeting may be dealt with.

In accordance with section 46A(7)(b)(i) the reason why the item was not on the agenda is because at the time of completing the agenda this report was not yet available.

In accordance with section 46A(7)(b)(ii) the reason why discussion of this item cannot be delayed until a subsequent meeting is because on 15 March the CSC agreed to an amendment deferring this item for "no more than 3 weeks, to allow for consideration of the relevant bus stop and bus route issues", and to delay the report further would not be consistent with the agreed timeframe within the recommendation.

Recommendation

That the item regarding Traffic Resolutions - Bus Stop Changes - Kanpur Road, Broadmeadows be considered at this meeting as a major item not on the agenda, pursuant to Section 46A(7)(a) of the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987, to enable the matter to be decided within the agreed timeframe.

2. Operational

TRAFFIC RESOLUTIONS - BUS STOP CHANGES - KANPUR ROAD, BROADMEADOWS

Purpose

 To seek Committee approval to withdraw a recommendation to create a bus stop on Kanpur Road, Broadmeadows (TR 08-18), in Wellington City as earlier proposed to progress the implementation of the new Wellington Bus Network.

Summary

- 2. The implementation of a bus stop on Kanpur Road, Broadmeadows near Jaunpur Crescent was proposed as part of the bus stop changes required for the implementation of the new Wellington Bus Network in July 2018. This was the last stop requiring approval in the Broadmeadows loop to enable bus services to be run both ways between the City and Johnsonville.
- 3. Previous attempts to find a suitable location on Kanpur Road in the vicinity of Jaunpur Crescent have met with opposition from residents in the area. The report tabled at the 15 March Committee was a culmination of consultation on a number of different sites with a recommendation that a bus stop be sited outside 88 Kanpur Road. Although this was objected to by the adjacent resident, it is the best location for the safe operation of the service and to meet the needs of the users in this catchment.
- Councillors questioned the need for the bus service to run both ways on the Broadmeadows loop and therefore the need for the bus stop, particularly because of public opposition to the creation of the bus stop.
- The report was laid on the table to give Greater Wellington Regional Council officers time to respond.
- Greater Wellington Regional Council have asked for the application for the bus stop to be withdrawn and will instead monitor the need for this stop once the new two way service is operating from 15 July this year.

Recommendations

That the City Strategy Committee:

Background

- implementation of the new Wellington Bus Network in July 2018. This was the last stop requiring approval in the Broadmeadows loop to enable bus services to be run both ways between the City and Johnsonville.
- 8. Previous attempts to find a suitable location on Kanpur Road in the vicinity of Jaunpur Crescent have met with opposition from residents in the area. The report tabled at the 15 March committee was a culmination of consultation on a number of different sites with a recommendation that a bus stop be sited outside 88 Kanpur Road. Although this was objected to by the adjacent residents it is the best location for the safe operation of the service and to meet the needs of the users in this catchment.
- 9. Councillor questioned the need for the bus service to run both ways on the Broadmeadows loop and therefore the need for the bus stop particularly given the public opposition to the creation of the bus stop. Greater Wellington Regional Council officers' were asked to provide the logic for the two way service and whether the service could operate as it currently does in a clockwise direction only.
- The resolution for TR 08-18 Kanpur Road, Broadmeadows was laid on the table for 3
 weeks giving time for Greater Wellington Regional Council to respond.

Discussion

- 11. Greater Wellington Regional Council held a number of workshops to develop service options for Khandallah, Ngaio and Broadmeadow communities throughout 2014 which resulted in 3 options being consulted on. 5,500 households were delivered material with 551 responses being received. From this community consultation it was identified that a two way option through Broadmeadows was preferred.
- 12. It is recognised international best practice to separate opposing services and elsewhere in the Wellington network where one way loops have been operating, these have been eliminated in the new network. Another example of where this will happen is on the Newlands Service. The only one way loops that will exist once the new network is operational are those at the terminal end of peak hour services.
- 13. Greater Wellington Regional Council are now committed to running a two way service through Broadmeadows which is supported by the contracts they have let to new operators and the material they have prepared for new routes which will come into effect from 15 July.
- 14. On the basis this is the only location on the route without an approved bus stop, Greater Wellington Regional Council have advised that they wish to withdraw their application and will monitor the effect this has on customers. This will give time to also monitor the effects of the two way service. In the event that customers are unhappy about walking to either of the adjacent stops then this can be assessed together with the overall benefits of the route changes.

Next Actions

15. Officers will continue to work with Greater Wellington Regional Council to monitor the effects of the new services with the view to bring any issues back to Committee for information and action as appropriate.
