- 4. Amend the Submission as follows:

2.1 Add the following as an Introduction, before Section 1 General Comments:

Thank you for the opportunity to make a submission. Wellington City Council (WCC) supports the approach of the Proposed Natural Resources Plan to provide a robust framework for the management and protection of the natural environment.

WCC seeks a number of changes to the plan and it submission is outlined below.

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2.2 Amend the first paragraph of Section 1.1 Urban Environment:

The existing urban environment is an important regional resource and its continued operation as well as the development of new urban environments cannot occur without the use and development of some natural resources. The PRNR does not fully recognise or provide for the benefits of the use and development of the urban environment.

2.3 Add to Section 1.1 Urban Environment as follows:

The vibrancy and vitality of the waterfront area relies on a range of activities occurring within the Coastal Marine Area (CMA) adjacent to the urban area. The PNRP clearly manages structures in the CMA but does not appear to have provisions that manage and control the use and change of use of the coastal marine area.

Include an additional decision requested as follows:

1.1.3 Amend the Plan to include provisions that better manage and control the use, change of use and activities in the CMA.

2.4 Add to Section 1.1 Urban Environment as follows:

Climate change is likely to have a significant impact on the ongoing maintenance, upgrade and provision of structures in the CMA. Decisions, in consultation with the community, about how best to continue to provide infrastructure and protect assets in the CMA, will need to be made. The Plan takes an 'avoid' approach to seawalls and the demolition of heritage structures. The effects of climate change may result in the need for new or substantial upgrades of seawalls to protect assets and infrastructure; or the need to demolish, mover or replace heritage structures (especially heritage structures that are also infrastructure items). WCC believes that the approach to heritage structures, seawalls and climate change in the PNRP is not well integrated and seeks changes to address this.

Include an additional decision requested

1.1.4 Provide better integration and recognition of how climate change will affect the provision of infrastructure; the need to replace and upgrade seawalls; and potential effects on heritage items; and how the separate policy approach to these issues relates to each other.

2.5 Amend the decision requested in 2.1.2 to:

Policy P73

The adverse effects of stormwater discharges shall be minimised including by:

(a)...

(b)...

(c) Implementing water sensitive urban design in new subdivisions and development (unless it can be demonstrated that it is not appropriate due to topography or soil type)

Or similar wording

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2.6	Amend	the	decision	requested	in	2.7.	1 t	0
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Add additional wording to the end of the policy to ensure all matters are given appropriate and due consideration.

2.7 Add an additional decision requested 2.6.6 to:

2.6.6 Undertake an assessment of stream systems within identified growth areas to better understand in order to determine where mitigation of adverse effects is appropriate and where avoidance of adverse effects is appropriate.
