Background

- 3. Wellington City Council consulted the community on the Draft District Plan from 2 November 2021 to 14 December 2021.
- 4. On 15 December 2021, Council endorsed a multiple stream approach for oral submissions on the Draft District Plan.
- 5. Given the Red traffic light setting requirements for local government meetings, in person forums were not a possibility. As such, these forums will be held online via Zoom.
- 6. In person forums have been unable to be livestreamed and recorded, due to the availability of technology in the Council meeting room. Given this forum will be held online, staff are able to record the sessions and upload the recordings to the website retrospectively.
- 7. Councillors also requested that a hearing session be scheduled, to allow participants to address all councillors in a formal hearing setting. All participants who had registered for the forums sessions were contacted and offered this option instead of the forums.
- 8. The hearing will be livestreamed as per usual.
