### **Purpose**

| Relevant Previous<br>decisions  | In December 2019 Council endorsed the Bus Priority Action Plan, that was collaboratively developed with Greater Wellington and identified Newtown to City as a top priority for improvements to reliability and travel times for bus users.  Council approved the Parking Policy in August 2020 which set out principles and priorities used to inform these proposed changes. Through the development of the Long-term Plan 2021-2031, the Council provided \$231 million over 10-years for the delivery of a connected bike network. This included \$52 million that was brought forward to accelerate a rapid roll-out of the network in Years 1-3. The Committee, at its meeting on 23 September 2021, approved the release of a draft Bike Network Plan (refreshed Cycleways Masterplan) for consultation and to an adapted version of the Innovating Streets process used for the Brooklyn Hill cycleway to progress with interim projects through the transitional programme. Council endorsed officers to "commence work to install transitional schemes for the routes from the City to Newtown and the City to the Botanic Gardens in partnership with LGWM" |
