PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE IMPACT REPORT:

KHANDALLAH TOWN HALL OPENING - SUNDAY 7 AUGUST 2011

1. Description of Event

Wellington City Council City Communities is planning the opening of the upgraded Khandallah Town Hall on Ganges Road. They propose to close the nearby road to enable festival type activities to safely occur in and around the Khandallah Town Hall site itself on the opening day.

The Khandallah Town Hall was built in 1912 and has been a key part of Khandallah life throughout its history. With the Town Hall's 100th birthday approaching, the Council has upgraded the facility to enhance its heritage value and adapt the building for modern needs. In 2003 the Council held a series of workshops with the Khandallah Community Forum which identified restoring the Town Hall as a community priority. Based on workshop feedback, the Council has restored the front of the building to its original design and transformed the interior into a multi-use facility that makes better use of space without compromising the main hall. The Cornerstone Community Centre will move into the hall and will manage the new facility as one of the city's network of community centres and will deliver activities and programmes that meet local needs.

The opening event is timed begin after midday and the proposed road closure timing is required to secure the clear parking spaces needed for the set-up and for the safe operation of the planned opening activities. The proposed road closure is for **Ganges Road**, from Agra Crescent to Dekka Street, on Sunday 7 August, from 7am to 5pm. Road closure notification boards will be placed at each end of the closure at least one week prior to the event. Residents and local businesses will receive a letter drop advising them of the event and the road closure.

The event will be traffic managed by a professional traffic management company. Pedestrian access will not be restricted and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required.

2. Rugby World Cup and Events Directorate Support

The opening of Khandallah Hall is the completion of a Council upgrade project for City Communities. This event contributes to the wellbeing of the community and is supported by the Rugby World Cup and Events Directorate.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council was proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

No objections were received in response to the proposal notice.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Stuart Bullen, Senior Traffic Engineer, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to the plans provided, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions stated below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to re-open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- Cars parked overnight in Ganges Road are to have safe marshalled egress from the street.
- Access from the Ganges Road off street parking area is to be safely managed.
- The detour route is to be clearly signed during road closure.
- No vehicular traffic will be allowed within the road closure area, except for those that are accompanied by a marshal, travelling at no more than walking speed (3km/h), to ensure public safety is not compromised.
- The event organiser will publicise the event via media releases, letter drops and advanced signage to notify the public of the road closure.
- The event organiser is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the temporary traffic management plan during the road closure.

- The event organiser is responsible for maintaining public safety within the road closure area.
