
PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE – IMPACT REPORT

THE WHITE RIBBON RUN FRIDAY 23 NOVEMBER 2012

1. Description of Event

White Ribbon (a global campaign) offers men the opportunity to be part of the solution to end the endemic violence against women. One in three women are victims of violence from a partner, while on average fourteen women are killed each year by a member of their own family.

The White Ribbon campaign condemns violence against women and encourages men to take action.

The Wellington Living Free With-out Violence Network (with support of the New Zealand Police) are again organising the White Ribbon Day Run, as part of national events profiling “White Ribbon Day”. This is the fourth time it is proposed to run this event since 2009.

The goal of this event is to engage a large number of men across a wide range of ages, industries and cultural backgrounds in the message of non violence for the education, awareness and the ongoing health and safety of our community.

Participants will assemble in the grounds of the Old Government Buildings; Lambton Quay and stagger groups of runners joined together holding large white ribbons to Civic Square.

It is proposed to close the following roads from 11.50am until 12.20pm to enable the event to be run in a safe manner:

- **Lambton Quay** (Bunny to Panama Streets - seaward side only, then both sides between Panama and Willis Streets)
- **Willis Street** (Lambton Quay/Willeston St intersection to Manners St)
- **Mercer Street** (Willis St to Victoria St)
- **Victoria Street** (Harris St to Mercer St)

Activities are also planned at Civic Square following the race.

The race will have a direct impact on vehicle traffic (especially on public transport) in the wider area for an initial period of approximately 30 minutes over the Friday lunchtime, and indirectly for approximately another 45 minutes as the network clears the build up of vehicles.

The organisers, Council Officers and other stakeholders will work together to make sure that the impact of the race is kept to a minimum.

The event is to be traffic managed by a registered traffic management company and by the New Zealand Police at key intersections. Pedestrian access will not be affected within the proposed closures. The organisers are planning a letter drop to affected properties and businesses along the proposed road closures and adjacent streets. Road closure notification signage will be placed in the streets 14 days prior to the event. The road closures will be advertised in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post on the Tuesday before the event.

2. Events (Business Development) Support

The Events Business Unit has no connection with, and no objection to, this event.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

- Dominion Post Saturday 8 September 2012

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

There have been NO objections to this closure request.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact


In the opinion of the Councils' Transport Network Manager, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to the plans provided, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions stated below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Temporary Road Closures Subcommittee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to re-open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to publicly notify the event via letter drop, local newspaper advertisement, advanced signage and media releases.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the affected property owners and businesses along the road closure are consulted with.
- The event organiser is to provide marshals at all road closure ends to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised.

- The intersection of Lambton Quay/Whitmore St/Bowen St is to remain operational at all times except during the start of each race where an intersection closure of two minutes is required to maintain safety for competitors across the intersection. There will be five races in total and five two-minute closure of the intersection.
- Detour routes and diversion are to be clearly signed during the road closure period.
- The event organiser is to work with the public transport operators to provide alternative public transport routes and bus stops.



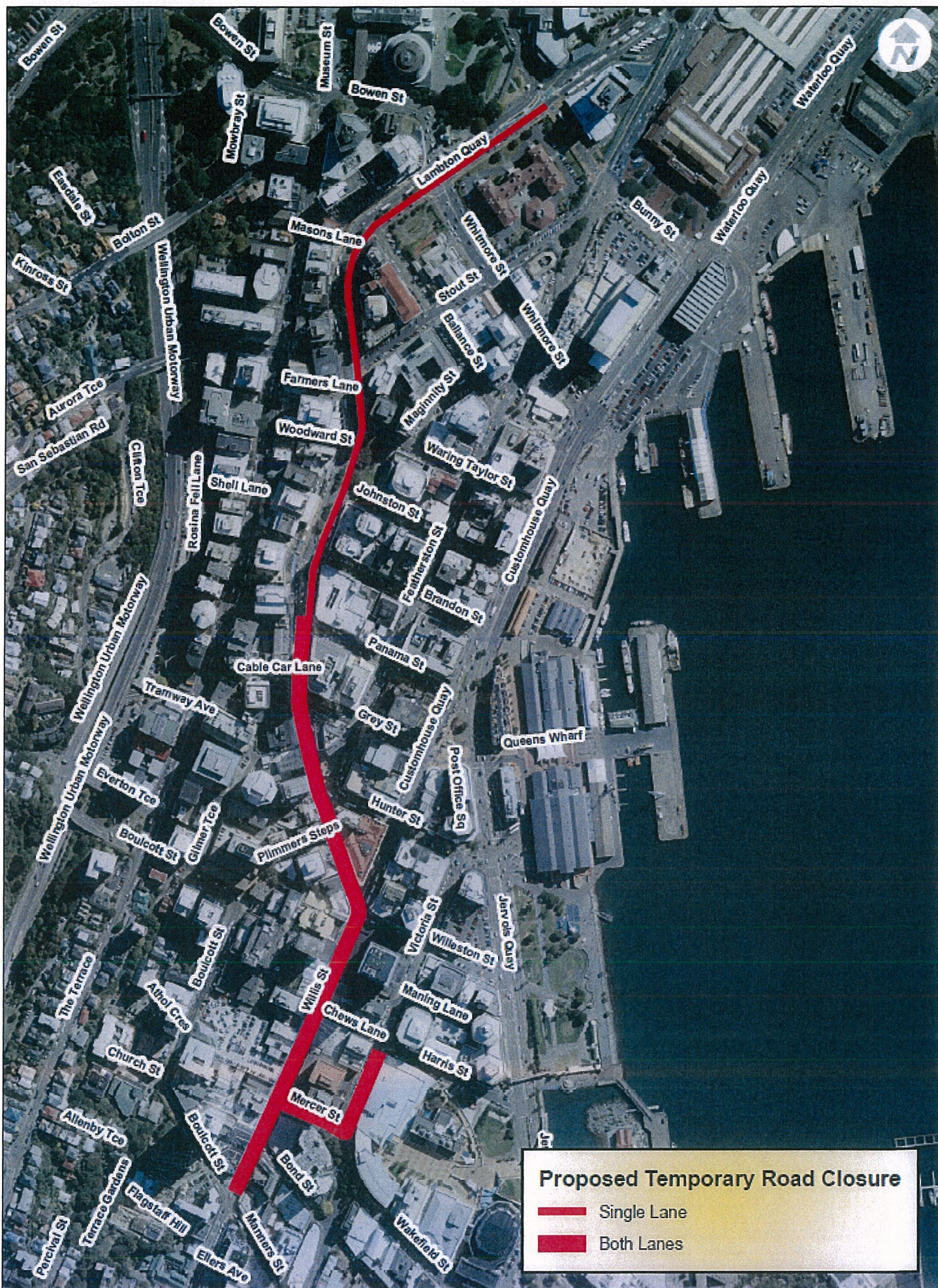

WATER MAIN UPGRADE PROJECT

Single lane traffic, Tasman Street
Mid-September 2012 – January 2013

Capacity Infrastructure Services, on behalf of Wellington City Council is managing a project to upgrade the water main and associated services on Tasman Street.

As the main is located in the road, sections of Tasman Street will be reduced to a single lane. Traffic management will be in place, but delays are likely. Pedestrians and cyclists may also be temporarily affected.
