PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE - IMPACT REPORT

OCEANIA ORIENTEERING WORLD CUP QUALIFICATION SPRINT RACE MONDAY 7 JANUARY 2013

1. Description of Event

In early January 2013, for the first time since 1994, the Orienteering World Cup comes to New Zealand. The first 3 races of World Cup 2013 will be held in association with the Oceania Orienteering Championships and will give Australasian orienteers an opportunity to watch and mix with the best in the world.

On 7 January 2013 the New Zealand Orienteering Federation intends to hold the World Cup Qualification Sprint Race on land located both sides of Hill St, between Molesworth Street and the Wellington Urban Motorway Overbridge.

This international orienteering event will see 125 of world's best elite men & women orienteers competing over an urban environment. The Event Centre will be located at Parliament grounds. All necessary consents from the landowners where the orienteers will compete [including parliament] have been obtained.

The sport of orienteering requires competitors to navigate to checkpoints using a very detailed map and the aid of a compass. This particular sprint event will have two courses designed so that the fastest competitor should complete his/her course in approximately 12 minutes. Competitors are sent off separately at time intervals.

The proposed road closures, to vehicular traffic only, are for Monday 7 January 2013, from 12noon to 5.30pm on the following road;

Hill Street – between Molesworth Street and the Wellington Urban Motorway Over bridge

Local Access will be available to those Hill Street residents on the western side of the motorway overbridge and will include Parliament Street.

2. Events (Business Development) Support

The Oceania Orienteering World Cup Qualification Sprint Race is a new event and has the support of the Events Business Unit.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

Dominion Post Saturday 20 October 2012

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

There have been Three (3) objections to this closure request.

Event Organisers have met with both the child care centre and the Catholic Archdiocese Centre.

The child care centre agreed that as long as marshals are posted at the motorway end of the closure to help any parents with pick-up of kids they would be happy.

The Catholic Archdiocese Centre although being sympathetic to the event requires access to their offices. Event Organisers are happy to cater local access for residential and business traffic, but preventing through traffic. This will also address the objection of the submitter who wished exit during the afternoon.

Event Organisers have also agreed to bring forward the first start for the races to 1pm, which should result in all races finishing before there is any major flow exiting of traffic from either the Archdiocese offices or the parking building.

Event Organisers are just awaiting confirmation from the International Orienteering Federation (IOF) that this is acceptable.

Letter drops will cover Hill Street and all the side streets off it (i.e. Eccleston Hill and Selwyn Street and Guildford Terrace).

The Event Organisers have had extensive contact with the Dean at St Paul's Cathedral, the Parish Priest at St Sacred Heart Cathedral, and both Sacred Heart Primary School and St Marys College.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to the plans provided, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions listed below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic

unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to publicly notify the event via letter drop, newspaper advertisement, advanced signage and media releases. The letter drop to affected building occupiers and residents must include details of which end of Hill Street they will be able to gain access to and exit from their properties.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the affected property owners and businesses along the road closure are consulted with.
- The event organiser is to provide marshals at all road closure ends to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised.
- The event organiser is to work with the public transport operators to provide alternative public transport route and bus stops if required.
- The Traffic Management Plan will provide suitable information/direction to traffic wishing to detour the event.
- The event organiser is to provide further details of the Traffic Management Plan to Council for approval prior to the event.

LAND TRANSPORT RULES

In accordance with section 161(2) of the *Land Transport Act 1998*, the NZ Transport Agency, on behalf of the Minister of Transport, give notice of the Minister's intention to amend seven Land Transport Rules that apply to vehicles used for agricultural purposes, and advises that Land Transport Rule: Agricultural Vehicles Omnibus 2012 (the Omnibus Rule) is available for public comments

Amendments are proposed to the following Land Transport Rules Driver Licensing 1999 (Rule 91001), Heavy Vehicles 2004 (Rule 31002); Road User 2004 (Rule 51001), Vehicle Dimensions and Mass 2002 (Rule 41001), Vehicle Lighting 2004 (Rule 32005), Vehicle Standards Compliance 2002 (Rule 35001/1) and Work Time and Logbooks 2007

The aim of the proposed changes is to ensure that legislation that affects the primary production sector is fit for purpose and does not impose unnecessary costs or restrictions, including on the ability of the sector to manage critical agricultural operations where time or the weather is a limiting factor. These proposed changes follow a review of agricultural transport legislation, involving government agencies, key transport and agriculture industry stakeholders and the public; that considered which changes could be made to allow greater flexibility. while maintaining safety for operators and other road users.
