
PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE – IMPACT REPORT

RUGBY SEVENS STREET PARADE AND ASSEMBLY THURSDAY 31 JANUARY 2013

1. Description of Event

The street parade is now a major part of celebrations for the annual Wellington leg of the International Rugby Sevens competition. Organised by Crackerjack Promotions Limited in conjunction with the Wellington City Council, the organisers require a closure for the parade itself (to lessen the impact on traffic movements across the city) and for a safe assembly area for the performers, vehicles, teams and floats – the same footprint that was successfully run in 2012.

The proposed road closures are:

From 7am to 1.30pm (to allow for the formation of parade)

- **Ballance Street** (Lambton Quay to Featherston Street) – access for court vehicles will be maintained
- **Stout Street** (between Lambton Quay and Ballance Street) – access the Creative NZ dockway will be maintained

From 12.15pm to 1.30pm

- **Lambton Quay** (Whitmore Street to Willis Street)
- **Willis Street** (Lambton Quay to Manners Street)
- **Mercer Street**
- **Victoria Street** (Harris Street to Wakefield Street)
- **Wakefield Street** (northern side between Victoria and Cuba Streets)

The parade starts at the corner of Lambton Quay and Ballance Street and proceeds via Lambton Quay, Willis Street, Mercer Street and crossing Victoria Street into Civic Square.

The proposed parade starts at 12.20pm from the corner of Ballance Street and Lambton Quay and proceeds via Lambton Quay, Willis Street and Mercer Street into Civic Square.

Local businesses and residents will receive a letter drop advising them of the road closures. Information signage will be erected at least 7 days before the event and there will be extensive public notification via the various media outlets. The closure is also to be advertised in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post the Tuesday before the event.

The road closures for the parade assembly, and the parade itself, will be traffic managed by a qualified traffic management company. Emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required.

2. Events Directorate Support

The International Rugby Sevens has become a significant fixture on the city's Events Calendar. The proposed closure is supported by the City Events team.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

- Dominion Post Saturday 17 November 2012

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

There have been NO objections to this closure request.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closures, if implemented according to an approved traffic management plan will minimise the duration of the traffic impacts, mitigate issues of local access and address public safety concerns..However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to notify the public via newspaper advertisement, letter drop to affected parties, advanced signage and media releases.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to obtain Council approval on the details of the traffic management plan prior to the event.
- The event organiser is responsible for safety (pedestrian and traffic) within the closed area.

- The event organiser is to provide marshals at all road closures ends to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised.
- The event organiser is to provide access to all properties affected by the road closures for the parade assembly.



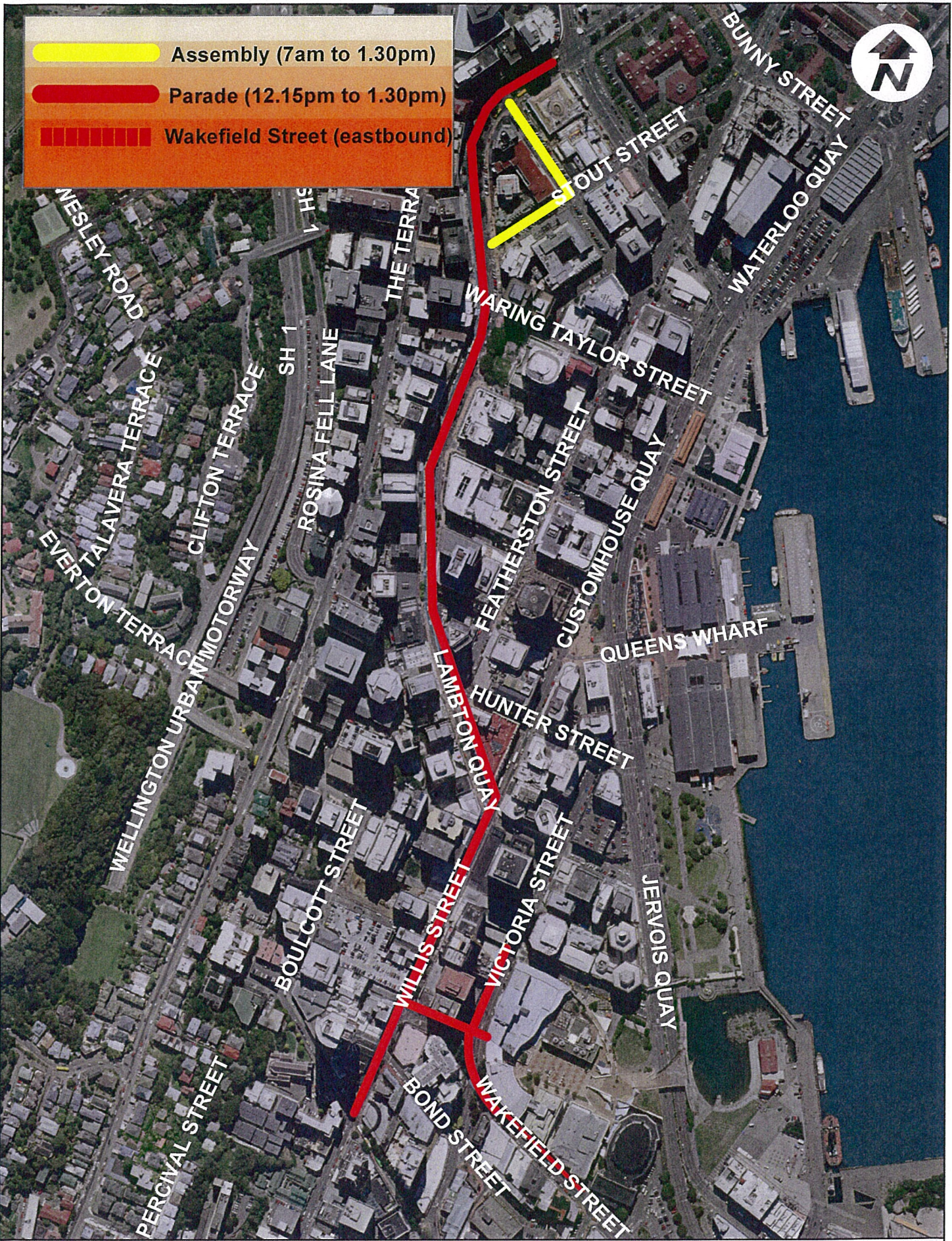

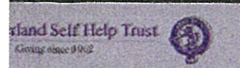

MAUNGAHARURU TANGITU
Approval of Post-Settlement Governance Entity & Investment Framework
 Over the last few months Maungaharuru-Tangitū Incorporated (MTI) has held several hui with the Hapū of Tangio Marae to discuss developing a post-settlement governance entity to receive the assets that will be acquired through the upcoming settlement with the Crown. Also discussed was a proposed Investment Framework to guide investment decisions.
 The Hapū now have the opportunity to vote on whether the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust should be the post-settlement governance entity to receive the assets that will be acquired through the settlement, and to approve the Investment Framework. The resolutions to be voted on are:
 1. I approve the Trust Deed for the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust & that the Trust receive the Treaty Settlement Assets for the Hapū.
 2. I approve the Investment Framework.
 MTI will hold several hui to present information about the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust and the Investment Framework and to provide an opportunity for questions to be asked. MTI will also provide an update on the progress of the negotiations with the Crown for the settlement of the historical claims of the Hapū. Please note, there will be a separate vote (in 2013) to approve the settlement when the negotiations with the Crown have been completed.

 All registered adult members of MTI (aged 18 years or older) are eligible to vote. Registered members who turn 18 years old during the voting period will also be eligible to vote. If you are not yet a registered member, you can still vote. Just contact the Voting Helpline for a special voting pack (including registration form). Alternatively, a special voting pack can be obtained at information hui. Special votes, which are otherwise valid, will be counted subject to confirmation of registration.
 Each eligible voter will be able to make one vote for each resolution using their voting method of choice: online at www.tangio.maori.nz, via post or in person by submitting their vote at an information hui.
 The voting period will commence on **Tuesday 6 November 2012** and will close on **Tuesday 4 December 2012 at 5pm**.
