PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE - IMPACT REPORT

WELLINGTONS 'GOLDEN' MILE 23 FEBRUARY 2013

1. Description of Event

This proposed event is designed to bring a unique, exciting and inclusive event to the heart of the city, and promote the city's retail 'golden mile'.

It is an event that anyone can enter, with various races for different age groups and grades, with the highlight being an elite race featuring the best milers the organisers can muster.

Local businesses and residents will receive at least 2 letter drops advising them of the event and the road closures. Road closure notification boards will be placed at each end of the closures at least one week prior to the event. The event is also to be advertised in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post on the Tuesday preceding the event.

The event is run in conjunction with the Wellington Scottish Athletics Club.

The proposed closures are from 11am to 5pm on Saturday 23 February 2013.

The proposed road closures are:

- Lambton Quay (between Whitmore and Willis Streets)
- O Stout Street (between Lambton Quay and Balance Street)
- Waring Taylor Street (between Maginnity Street and Lambton Quay)
- Johnston Street (between Lambton Quay and Featherston Street)
- o **Brandon Street** (between Featherston Street and Lambton Quay)
- Panama Street (between Lambton Quay and Featherston Street)
- Woodward Street

The event is to be traffic managed by a professional traffic management company. Pedestrian access will not be restricted and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required. Public transport operators will be notified of the closures and temporary bus stops and detour routes will be arranged.

2. Events Directorate Support

This local sporting event is supported by the City Events team.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

Dominion Post Saturday 17 November 2012

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

There have been NO objections to this closure request.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to an approved traffic management plan, will minimise the duration of the traffic impacts, mitigate issues of local access and address public safety concerns. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to re-open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to ensure that the event is publicised via media releases and advanced notification signs to inform the public of the road closures.
- The event organiser is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the temporary traffic management plan during the road closures.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the affected property owners and businesses along the road closure are consulted with.
- The event organiser is to provide marshals at the road closure ends to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised.
- The event organiser is to work with the public transport operators to provide alternative public transport routes and bus stops.



Over the last few months Maungaharuru-Tangitü Incorporated (MTI) has heid several hui with the Hapū
of Tangoio Marae to discuss developing a post-settlement governance entity to receive the assets that
will be acquired through the upcoming settlement with the Crown. Also discussed was a proposed
investment Framework to guide investment decisions.

The Hapū now have the opportunity to vote on whether the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust should be the
post-settlement governance entity to receive the assets that will be acquired through the settlement, and
to approve the Investment Framework. The resolutions to be voted on are:

1. I approve the Trust Deed for the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust & that the Trust receive the Treaty
Settlement Assets for the Hapū.

2. I approve the investment Framework.
