PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE - IMPACT REPORT

WELLINGTON CHINESE NEW YEAR PARADE 24 FEBRUARY 2013

1. Description of Event

The annual Chinese New Year Festival began in 2002 and has five main events this year run over the weekend of the 23rd and 24th of February 2013, with an estimated audience of over 20,000 people. The street parade is a major part of the celebrations and begins at Courtenay Place and culminates at Frank Kitts Park. Organised by the Asian Events Trust, the organisers do not require a closure for the street parade itself, but do require a safe assembly area for the performers and floats from **9am to 2.30pm on Sunday 24 February 2013**.

The proposed road closure is:

o **Tennyson Street** (between Tory Street and Cambridge Terrace)

The parade starts at 2pm via Tennyson Street, Cambridge Terrace, Courtenay Place, Taranaki Street and on to the Taranaki Street wharf. The parade is to be carried out on the open road under a temporary traffic management plan - the details of which will be approved by a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Road closure notification signs will be placed at each end of the assembly closure at least one week prior to the event. Residents and local businesses will receive a letter drop advising them of the road closure and the parking restrictions. The closure is also to be advertised in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post in the week preceding the parade. The road closure and the street parade are to be traffic managed by a qualified traffic management company and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required.

2. Events Directorate Support

The Chinese New Year celebrations are a significant cultural festival in the city and the parade is now an annual event. This event is supported by Councils' City Events Team.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

Dominion Post Saturday 17 November 2012

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

There have been NO objections to this closure request.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to an approved traffic management plan, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions listed below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to notify the public via newspaper advertisement, letter drop, advanced signage and media releases.
- The event organiser is to obtain Council approval on the details of the traffic management plan prior to the event (in particular the Tennyson Street closure).
- The event organiser is responsible for safety (pedestrian and traffic) within the closed area.
- The event organiser is to provide marshals at all road closures ends to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised.
- The event organiser is to provide marshalled vehicle access to all properties affected by the closure for the parade assembly.



Approval of Post-Settlement Governance Entity & Investment Framework

Over the last few months Maungaharuru-Tangitū Incorporated (MTI) has held several hui with the Hapū of Tangoio Marae to discuss developing a post-settlement governance entity to receive the assets that will be acquired through the upcoming settlement with the Crown. Also discussed was a proposed Investment Framework to guide investment decisions.

The Hapü now have the opportunity to vote on whether the Maungaharuru-Tangitü Trust should be the post-seitlement governance entity to receive the assets that will be acquired through the settlement, and to approve the investment Framework. The resolutions to be voted on are:

. I approve the Trust Deed for the Maungaharuru-Tangitü Trust & that the Trust receive the Treaty ettlement Assets for the Hapū.

I approve the Investment Framework.

ATI will hold several hui to present information about the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust and the Investment Framework and to provide an opportunity for questions to be asked. MTI will also provide an update on the progress of the negotiations with the Crown for the settlement of the historical claims of the Hapt. Please note, there will be a separate vote (in 2013) to approve the settlement when the negotiations with the Crown have been completed.

The voting period will commence on Tuesday 6 November 2012 and will close on Tuesday 4 December 2012 at 5pm.
