



PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE – IMPACT REPORT

WELLINGTON CAR CLUB – ALEXANDRA ROAD HILLCLIMB 17 MARCH 2013

1. Description of Event

The Wellington Car Club (Inc) has once again applied to run this annual event. The event is sanctioned by Motorsport New Zealand and run under their approval by way of an Event Organisers Permit. The event has been carried out on this section of road, as advised by the Club, since the 1960's. The proposed closure is from **7am to 6pm on Sunday 17 March 2013**.

The proposed road closure is:

- **Alexandra Road** (between Constable Street and the Lookout Road)

Closure points as in past years will be at the intersections of Constable Street, Upoko Road and Lookout Road. Pedestrian and walker access will be controlled via marshalled crossing points, to be detailed in the clubs Traffic Management Plan.

Road closure notification boards will be placed at each end of the closure at least one week prior to the event. Residents and local sports clubs will receive a letter drop advising them of the event and the road closures. The Bus and Coach Association and known tour companies will be informed of the proposal and it's affect on Alexandra Road. The event is also to be advertised in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post in the week preceding the event.

The event is to be traffic managed by the Club's approved traffic management plan. Emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required.

2. Events Directorate Support

The Councils' City Events Team has no connection with, or objection to this event.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

- Dominion Post Saturday 17 November 2012

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

There have been NO objections to this closure request.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to an approved traffic management plan, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to publicly notify the event via letter drop, local newspaper advertisement, advanced signage and media releases.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- Additional signage at Constable St and information to advise motorists to use an alternate route via Hawker St to the Lookout.
- Safe vehicle turning areas are to be provided for motorists where the roads and intersections are closed to public access.

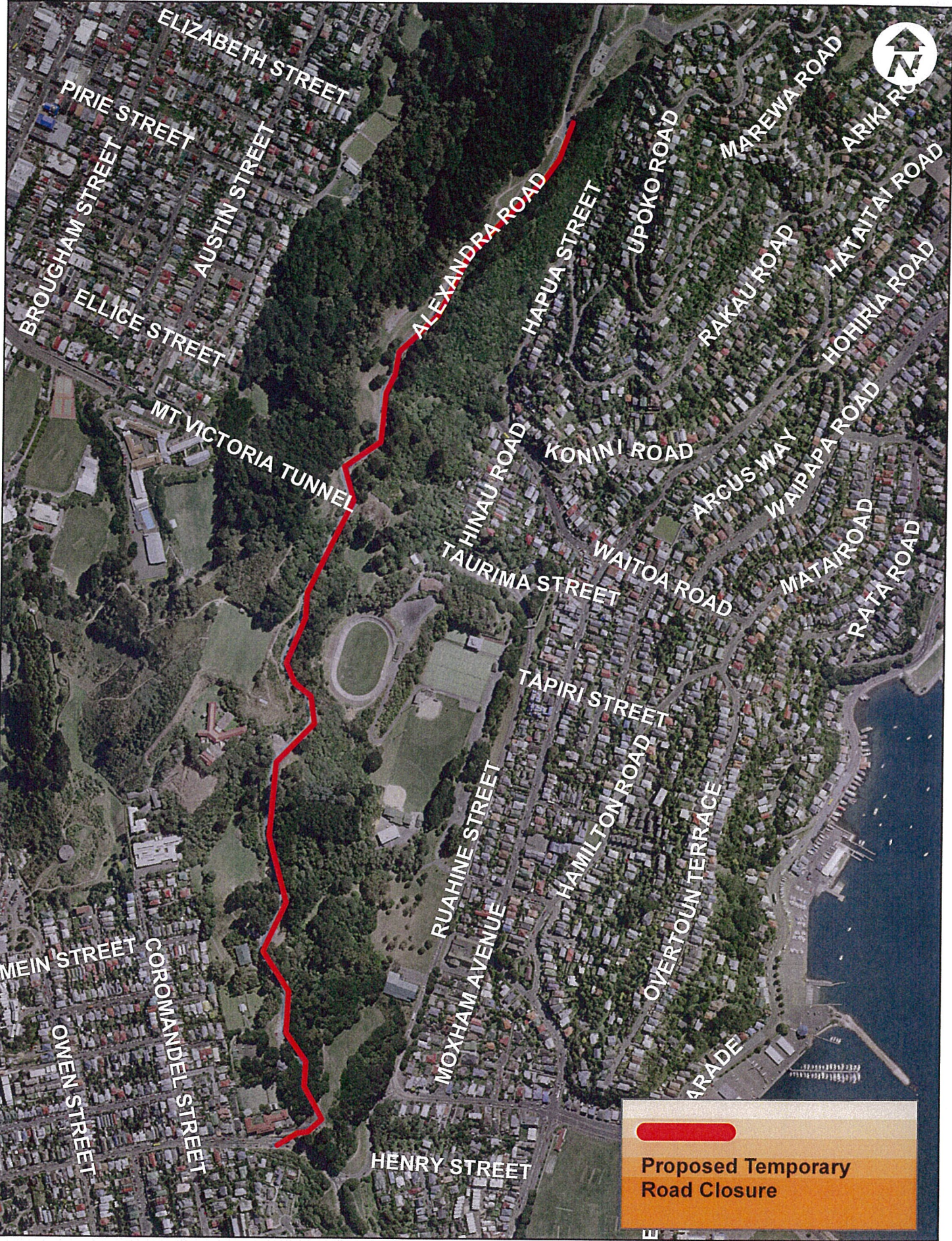

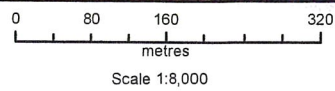

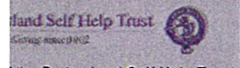

MAUNGAHARURU-TANGITŪ

Approval of Post-Settlement Governance Entity & Investment Framework

Over the last few months Maungaharuru-Tangitū Incorporated (MTI) has held several hui with the Hapū of Tangoio Marae to discuss developing a post-settlement governance entity to receive the assets that will be acquired through the upcoming settlement with the Crown. Also discussed was a proposed Investment Framework to guide investment decisions.

The Hapū now have the opportunity to vote on whether the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust should be the post-settlement governance entity to receive the assets that will be acquired through the settlement, and to approve the Investment Framework. The resolutions to be voted on are:

1. I approve the Trust Deed for the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust & that the Trust receive the Treaty Settlement Assets for the Hapū.
2. I approve the Investment Framework.

MTI will hold several hui to present information about the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust and the Investment Framework and to provide an opportunity for questions to be asked. MTI will also provide an update on the progress of the negotiations with the Crown for the settlement of the historical claims of the Hapū. Please note, there will be a separate vote (in 2013) to approve the settlement when the negotiations with the Crown have been completed.

All whānau who descend from the Hapū of Tangoio Marae are encouraged to attend an information hui. The schedule of hui is as follows:

Voting Process

Voting packs will be distributed by post to all registered adult members of MTI. The pack will include an information booklet explaining the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust & Investment Framework, a copy of the Trust Deed as well as a voting paper. All registered adult members of MTI (aged 18 years or older) are eligible to vote. Registered members who turn 18 years old during the voting period will also be eligible to vote. If you are not yet a registered member, you can still vote. Just contact the Voting Helpline for a special voting pack (including registration form). Alternatively, a special voting pack can be obtained at information hui. Special votes, which are otherwise valid, will be counted subject to confirmation of registration.

Each eligible voter will be able to make one vote for each resolution using their voting method of choice: online at www.tangoio.maori.nz, via post or in person by submitting their vote at an information hui.

The voting period will commence on **Tuesday 6 November 2012** and will close on **Tuesday 4 December 2012 at 5pm**.
