PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE - IMPACT REPORT

ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATIONS, WELLINGTON CITY THURSDAY 25 APRIL 2013

1. Description of Event

The Wellington Returned and Services Association (Inc) and the Wellington City Council Events Team have requested the closure of the following roads, to vehicle traffic, to safely facilitate commemorations for ANZAC DAY 2013..

The proposed closures are as follows;

Dawn Parade and Service from 5.00am to 7.00am

- o **Bunny Street** (between Featherston and Lambton quay)
- Lambton Quay (both sides between Bunny Street and Ballance Street)
- Bowen Street (between The Terrace and Lambton Quay) and
 Whitmore Street (between Stout Street and Lambton Quay), from 5am until 7.00am for the Dawn Parade Service.

Wreath Laying Ceremony from 10.00am to 11.00am

- Molesworth Street (between Hill Street and the Lambton Quay/Bunny Street Intersection)
- Lambton Quay (northbound side between Bowen Street/Cenotaph and Molesworth Street
 access for buses to remain open).

These ANZAC Day ceremonies have become popular events and draw attendance from a large crosssection of the community. The road closures are proposed to safely accommodate the increasing numbers of pedestrians attending these events.

The events will be advertised in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post in the week preceding ANZAC Day.

Public Transport Operators have been consulted with and their requirements will be accommodated.

The event is to be traffic managed by a qualified Traffic Management Company. Pedestrian access will not be restricted and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required.

2. City Events Support

This event is supported by the City Events Business Unit.

3. Proposal Notice and Consultation

The public notice that the Council is proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

Dominion Post Saturday 16 February 2013.

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted with.

4. Objections

There have been NO objections to this closure request.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Steve Spence (Chief Transport Planner), acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to approved traffic management plans, will have minimal impact to the road network. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Regulatory Processes Committee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to re-open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to ensure that the closure is publicised via media releases and advanced notification signs to inform the public of the road closures.
- The event organiser is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the temporary traffic management plan during the road closure.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the affected property owners and businesses along the road closure are consulted with.
- The event organiser is to provide suitably qualified marshals at the road closure points to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and attendees) is not compromised.
