



What is Aho Tini?

Agree the following design and service principles which will shape the development of services within Te Matapihi, and influence design decisions as the project progresses:


- a. Engage fully with Mana Whenua (including commencing use, from now, of the te reo name Te Matapihi ki te Ao Nui)
- b. Design for the visitor:
 - i. "whole of population" inclusion: traditional, new and future users;
 - ii. facilitating access to knowledge and knowledge services;
 - iii. anchoring social infrastructure in the city.
- c. Harness the power of partnership
 - i. through an integrated (not just co-located) service from Libraries, City Archive and Council Service Centre;
 - ii. as the home of Capital E
- d. Design a visitor experience that is modern, fit for the future and Wellington:
 - i. a spatially flexible, accessible, modern environment speaking strongly of Wellington;
 - ii. a hub of creative, civic, and humanities activities and a visitor attraction in its own right;
 - iii. designed to evolve in response to ongoing digital and population change.



Re-imagining Toi Pōneke



- The re-imagined Toi P

 oneke vision is defined as a temporary space to support artists to develop and grow.
- Toi Poneke will be a hub of energy that provides a place for artists at all stages of their career to develop and grow and eventually transition to new opportunities.
- It will achieve this by offering fixed-term rental agreements and by using the tuakana-teina model to connect artists with support from more senior practitioners. The space will be flexible to facilitate different art forms.
- Toi Poneke will be open, innovative, and committed to fostering diversity, inclusiveness, creativity and collaboration in a dynamic, evolving environment.
