3. Background

This report presents 40 strategic priority responses for inclusion in the Draft LTCCP. Strategic priority responses are business cases that meet one or more of the 23 strategic priorities agreed by Councillors in 2005 to guide the short to medium term (2006/09) planning and decision-making process.

A summary of all proposed strategic priority responses was presented to Councillors in December 2005 and full business cases were developed for each strategic priority response and considered by Councillors in February 2006. The 40 business cases consist of:

- those that describe a number of existing work programmes that meet one or more strategic priorities
- those where existing work programmes are reprioritised and/or funding increased to achieve one or more strategic priorities
- those where new work programmes with new funding are proposed to achieve one or more strategic priorities.

All strategic priority responses have been prepared within the context of Council's overall strategic framework including Council's seven draft strategies, 13 ten year outcome statements and the 23 three year strategic priorities.

Note that each business case discusses the purpose, objectives and the contribution the project makes to the strategic priority.
