### 057/06P ORAL HEARINGS ON DRAFT EARTHQUAKE-PRONE BUILDINGS POLICY

(1215/52/IM) (REPORT 1)

#### **NOTED:**

- 1. Andrew Clark from the Wellington branch of the Institute of Professional Engineers of New Zealand (IPENZ) spoke in support of the draft policy as it would encourage building owners to do more than meet the minimum requirements of the Building Act. He recommended that Heritage buildings be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
- 2. Fran Wilde spoke on behalf of the Body Corporate, 124 Wakefield St about the difficulties a heritage listing caused when trying to comply with the draft policy. While she agreed with the reasoning behind the

- earthquake-prone buildings policy, she noted the extra costs and loss of property value for those properties with a heritage listing.
- 3. Colin Pannell questioned what risk it was that Council was trying to avoid with the policy. He criticised the lack of risk assessment or quantification of risks that the policy was trying to mitigate and how it did not address the cost implications for those buildings with heritage listings.
- 4. Alan Ritchie advocated the strength of older buildings in withstanding earthquakes that are not recognised by many engineers, He requested that as the policy had a worthy objective it should be implemented over time so as not to risk devaluing many old buildings. He reminded the Committee that the policy only sought to protect buildings in a moderate earthquake and the over reaction that had stemmed from the consultation.
- 5. Bruce Mitchell spoke about his frustration in trying to access information held by the Wellington City Council such as lists of affected building and earlier reports. He believed that the consultation period was too short and that many Wellingtonians did not have a full understanding of the implications of the policy.

(Councillor Goulden left the meeting at 10.00am.)

(Councillor Wain joined the meeting at 10.06am.)

6. Margaret Bryson asked that the Council take a passive approach in applying its policy as proposed by many other Councils (including Napier City and Hutt City). She highlighted that the implications of the policy were dramatically affecting older apartment sale prices and argued that only those buildings that were overtly dangerous or essential to the city's infrastructure should be dealt with immediately.

(Councillor Goulden returned to the meeting at 10.16am.)

7. Peter Johnstone spoke as a structural engineer and told the committee that the strength of old buildings to withstand a moderate earthquake was greater than could be quantifiably calculated. He noted that the most dangerous buildings that should be dealt with immediately however were 'soft storey' buildings.

(The meeting adjourned at 10.32 am for morning tea and a Councillor briefing and reconvened at 11.25am.)

(When the meeting reconvened Councillors Ahipene-Mercer, Armstrong, Cook, Foster, Gill, Goulden, McKinnon, Pepperell, Ruben, Wade-Brown and Wain were present.)

(Councillor Morrison returned to the meeting at 11.28am.)

- 8. Margaret Taylor spoke against the draft policy as a resident whose property sale had been affected by it. She noted the extra costs for owners that were associated with having to obtain engineering reports.
- 9. Adam Thornton voiced concerns about the robustness of the I.E.P process and noted that it would be of benefit to update maps of ground and soil conditions which could affect the strength of a building. He noted that in most cases where owners strengthen their buildings they also took the opportunity to renovate which could increase the affordability of the process.

(Councillor Goulden left the meeting at 11.50am.)

10. Richard Burrell spoke in support of the buildings being earthquake strengthened but noted that it should be a property owners legal obligation to ensure that their building were strengthened.

(Councillor Goulden returned to the meeting at 11.59am.)

- 11. Gillian Robertson asked that some parts of the policy be revisited and revised as well as requesting that the Council take a greater look at helping fund the upgrading of important historical buildings.
- 12. Jenny Bentley from Victoria University highlighted to the committee the impact that the earthquake prone buildings policy would have on the university, with upward of five million dollars work that would need to be done on some of it's large 'high risk' buildings. She asked that the council reconsider time frames to ensure that strengthening would be affordable for people and not be a 'quick-fix'.
