NEW ZEALAND COMMUNITY BOARDS' FORUM 'MEETING EXPECTATIONS', LOWER HUTT, 14-15 JULY 2006

1. Purpose of Report

To provide information on the New Zealand Community Boards' Forum 'Meeting Expectations' to be held in Lower Hutt, 14-15 July 2006, and to seek approval for elected members' attendance at the conference.

2. Recommendations

It is recommended that the Strategy and Policy Committee:

- 1. Receive the information.
- 2. Approve the attendance of up to three members of the Tawa Community Board and three members of the Makara/Ohariu Community Board at the New Zealand Community Boards' Forum to be held in Lower Hutt, 14-15 July 2006, and that the costs associated with attending the Forum be met from the Elected Members Budget (GVEMO1).
- 3. Approve the attendance of one Councillor at the New Zealand Community Boards' Forum to be held in Lower Hutt, 14-15 July 2006, and that the costs associated with attending the Forum be met from the Elected Members Budget (GVEMO1).
- 4. Note that a report back on the Forum from attendees of each community board will be presented to their respective Community Boards in accordance with Council policy.

3. Discussion

This forum will focus on the relationship between community boards and their councils and how the nature of this relationship can influence the performance of a community board. Upon attending the forum, participants will come away with a clearer understanding of the functions of community boards and guidelines on how community boards and their council can work together positively to do their job better. 3.1 Considerations
