Moved Councillor Foster, seconded Councillor Pepperell, the substantive motion with amendments to recommendations 2 ("part 4" removed and replaced with "part 5") and 5 as follows:

- 2. Agree to recommend that Council approves, for the purpose of public consultation using the special consultative procedure, the attached statement of proposal on proposed amendments to parts 5 and 7 of the Wellington City Consolidated Bylaw 2008 that:
 - removes the prohibition on Motorcycles using pay and display parks, providing consistency with provisions for ordinary parking meters
 - clarifies provisions relating to exemptions to residents parking areas
 - removes the objection period following public notification of Council decisions
 - removes offences specific to taxis
 - corrects errors, out of date references, and unclear provisions.
