Key points:


- Strong support for framing in light of LGWM

- Need to prioritize parking for car share spaces and mobility parks
- Vigorous debate about Newtown and the need to progress with Newtown Connections ahead of densification.

'Cost Recovery'

Cost of Resident Parking

In terms of pricing for parking, the Local Government Act 2002 restricts the Council to the recovery of **reasonable** costs only for permits, such as resident parking permits and coupon exemption permits.




Number and revenue derived from resident parking permits and coupon exemptions within Wellington


Resident Parking Revenue
