
**PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE
IMPACT REPORT:**

**“IT’S ALL WHITE ON THE NIGHT” (WORLD CUP
QUALIFIER PARTY EVENT) – SATURDAY 14
NOVEMBER 2009**

1. Description of Event

The Four Kings Bar plans a party event to coincide with the World Cup Football qualifying match between New Zealand and Bahrain – to be played at the Westpac Stadium on Saturday 14 November 2009. The Four Kings Bar is an official Yellow Fever supporters bar (the Wellington Phoenix Football Club) and a bar that is well supported by football fans. A stage, live entertainment and a bar is planned within the proposed closure area to cater for the expected increase in patronage. Entry to the closed area will be by ticket only (a condition of the proposed liquor licence).

The proposed road closure is for Inglewood Place (for approximately 30 metres adjacent to the Four Kings Bar) on Saturday 14 November 2009, from 4pm to 2am (the times proposed allow for set up and pack down). The band will stop at midnight and the event will finish at 1am. All appropriate consents will be obtained by the organisers - including security provisions, liquor licensing, structures/fencing, noise management and toilet/health & hygiene requirements.

The event is to be traffic managed by a professional traffic management company and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required.

Residents and local businesses will receive a letter drop advising them of the event and the road closure. A Road Closure notification board will be placed in the street at least one week prior to the event and the organisers will be required to advertise the road closure in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post the Tuesday before the event.

2. City Events Support

This is event organised by a local business and is supported by the City Events team.

3. Proposal Notice

The public notice that the Council was proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

- Dominion Post, Saturday 26 September 2009

4. Objections

No objections were received in response to the proposal notice.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.


Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to the plans provided, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions listed below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Temporary Road Closures Subcommittee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to publicly notify the event via letter drop, local newspaper advertisement, advanced signage and media releases.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the affected property owners and businesses along the road closure are consulted with.
- The event organiser is to provide marshals at the road closure ends and along the Taranaki Street side of the closure to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised such as adjacent to Taranaki St and Dixon St.
