
**PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE
IMPACT REPORT:**

**THE WHITE RIBBON RACE – THURSDAY 25
NOVEMBER 2010**

1. Description of Event

The Wellington Living Free Without Violence Network (with support of the New Zealand Police) are again organising an event called the White Ribbon Day Race, as part of national events profiling White Ribbon Day. A similar event was run very successfully for the first time last year. The United Nations has officially declared November 25th of each year to be “Elimination of Violence towards Women Day”. This day has been celebrated in communities throughout New Zealand since 2000 and is gaining momentum with many organisations declaring themselves to be White Ribbon supportive. The goal is to use the event as an opportunity to engage a large number of men across a wide range of ages, industries and cultural backgrounds in the message of non violence for the education, awareness and the ongoing health and safety of our community.

The participants will assemble in the grounds of Victoria University Law Faculty (Old Government Buildings), Lambton Quay and it is proposed to run a series of races (runners joined together holding large white ribbons) from there to Civic Square. It is therefore proposed to close the following roads from 11.50am until 12.20pm: **Lambton Quay** (Bunny St to Panama St seaward side only and then both sides from Panama St to Willis St); **Willis Street** (Lambton Quay/Willeston St intersection to Manners St); **Mercer Street** (Willis St to Victoria St); **Victoria Street** (Harris St to Mercer St) to enable the race to be run in a safe manner. Activities are also planned at Civic Square following the race.

The race will have an impact on vehicle traffic in the wider area and especially on public transport for a period of approximately 30 minutes over the Thursday lunchtime. The organisers, Council Officers and other stakeholders will work together to make sure that the impact of the race will be kept to a minimum. The event will be traffic managed by a professional traffic management company and by the Police at key intersections. Pedestrian access will not be affected within the proposed closures. The organisers are planning a letter drop to affected properties and businesses along the proposed road closures and adjacent streets. Road closure notification boards will be placed in the streets affected at least one week prior to the event and the organisers will be required to advertise the road closures in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post the Tuesday before the event.

2. Rugby World Cup and Events Directorate Support

This event is organised by local community groups and the Events Directorate has no objection to the event.

3. Proposal Notice

The public notice that the Council was proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

- Dominion Post, Saturday 21 August 2010

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted.

4. Objections

No objections were received in response to the proposal notice.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to the plans provided, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions listed below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Temporary Road Closures Subcommittee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to publicly notify the event via letter drop, local newspaper advertisement, advanced signage and media releases.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the affected property owners and businesses along the road closure are consulted with.
- The event organiser is to provide marshals at all road closure ends to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised.
- The intersection of Lambton Quay/Whitmore St/Bowen St is to remain operational at all times except during the start of each race where an intersection closure of two minutes is required to maintain safety for

competitors across the intersection. There will be five races in total and five two-minute closure of the intersection.

- Detour routes and diversion are to be clearly signed during the road closure period.
- The event organiser is to work with the public transport operators to provide alternative public transport routes and bus stops.

PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE IMPACT REPORT:

WOMEN'S INTERNATIONAL CYCLING TOUR OF NEW ZEALAND – SUNDAY 27 FEBRUARY 2011

1. Description of Event

The NZCT Women's Tour of New Zealand takes place from the 23rd to the 27th of February 2011. This proposed event comprises a final stage in Wellington - a 35 km Criterium event. The tour is the only women's international cycle event in Oceania for 2011 and is sanctioned by the World Cycling Body. The event gives an opportunity to up and coming New Zealand riders to take part in an international event on home soil. The event is organised by Jorge Sandoval, Director of Sandoval Promotions Ltd.

The event requires road closures to vehicles only on Sunday 27 February 2011, 12noon to 5.30pm on **Lambton Quay** (Bowen Street to Willis Street), **Ballance Street** (Lambton Quay to Stout Street), **Stout Street** (Lambton Quay to Ballance Street), **Waring Taylor Street** (closed to traffic from Maginnity Street to Lambton Quay), **Johnston Street** (closed to through traffic from Lambton Quay to Featherston Street) and **Brandon Street** (closed to through traffic from Featherston Street turning right into Lambton Quay).

Local businesses and residents will receive at least two letter drops advising them of the event and the road closures. Road closure notification boards will be placed at each end of the closures at least one week prior to the event. **PROPOSED TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE
IMPACT REPORT:**

**NATIONAL TRIATHLON CHAMPIONSHIPS –
SATURDAY 12 MARCH 2011**

1. Description of Event

This event has become a regular on Wellington City's sporting event calendar and will comprise five separate races. The event is proposed to be held on Saturday 12 March 2010, starting at 7am. All races are proposed to start from Waitangi Park, except for the Contact 3:9:3 and the Contact 1:2:1 events. These are proposed to be held around the Freyberg Pool car park area (due to the shallower swimming conditions available there).

The Contact Trophy (starting at 7am) and the Contact Cup events double as the National and Oceania Standard Distance Championships and involve approximately 500 athletes over the three different swim, cycle and run courses within the proposed road closure area, and outside the road closure area to and from the Miramar Peninsula. The Contact 3:9:3 (this is a beginner's event with achievable distances) begins at 8.15am and leaves the Freyberg car park and utilizes sections of Oriental Parade. This event involves approximately 200 athletes. At the completion of this event it is proposed to run the 1:2:1 event, which is hoped to involve approximately 50 children between the ages of 7 to 11 years (this event will take 20 minutes from start to finish). At approximately 10.45am the Contact Cup Under 19 event begins involving approximately 150 athletes. At 11.30am the Grand Finale, that is the ITU Oceania Cup, begins with approximately 150 elite athletes on a swim, cycle and run course entirely within the proposed closure area.

The proposed road closures are for Saturday 12 March 2011, from 6am to 2pm, of **Oriental Parade** (all of Oriental Parade from Cable Street to Evans Bay Parade); **Carlton Gore Road** (Oriental Parade to Maida Vale Road) and **Evans Bay Parade** (Oriental Parade to just north of the NIWA building, 301 Evans Bay Parade). The proposed closure times have been extended by one hour, from last years timings, to 2pm to enable the running of the new children's event.

Access will be maintained (although this may be limited at times) by the event marshals for residents and businesses in the Herd Street area. Residents on Oriental Parade, Carlton Gore Road and Evans Bay Parade will also have access to and from their properties (although this also may be limited at times). Access in both directions on Evans Bay Parade from Greta Point southwards to Wellington Road will be maintained. The event organisers are to maintain as

much access for residents within the closure area as possible. Known stakeholders in the Oriental Parade area have been informed and communicated with regarding the proposed closures. Road closure notification signs will be placed at points along the proposed closure route at least one week prior to the event. Residents and local businesses will receive a letter drop advising them of the event and the road closures. The event is also to be advertised in the Our Wellington Page of the Dominion Post on the Tuesday preceding the event.

The event is to be traffic managed by a national, professional traffic management company. Pedestrian access will not be restricted and emergency services will have immediate access to the area if required. Transport operators have been informed of the proposed closures.

2. Rugby World Cup and Events Directorate Support

This local and international sporting community event is supported by the Events Directorate.

3. Proposal Notice

The public notice that the Council was proposing to consider this closure was published in the following newspaper:

- Dominion Post Saturday 21 August 2010

The New Zealand Police and the Ministry of Transport have also been consulted.

Representatives of the Wellington City Council Events Team and the Infrastructure Directorate met with the Oriental Bay Residential Association in early 2008 to discuss annual closures of Oriental Parade for events. The Oriental Bay Residents Association agreed to no more than two full road closures of Oriental Parade for events, this being one of the two.

4. Objections

No formal objections were received in response to the proposal notice.

The Oriental Bay Residents Association was consulted with regarding the proposal and the extension of the closure time to 2pm to run the new children's event. The Association report that "we think that the extension to 2pm for the National Triathlon event will be very unpopular with people wanting access to friends and facilities in Oriental Bay" and they question whether the new event could be run concurrently with the other events? The organisers of the event report back that this is not possible and the time extension to 2pm is necessary to successfully run all the individual events.

5. Traffic Impact Assessment

Prior Closures

None of the proposed closures for this event will result in a road being closed for an aggregate of more than 31 days in any year.

Traffic Impact

In the opinion of Soon Teck Kong, Manager Transport Network, acting as the Council's Traffic Engineer, the proposed closure, if implemented according to the plans provided, is not likely to impede traffic unreasonably subject to the conditions below. However, the Council reserves the right to modify this opinion at any time. If, in the opinion of the Council, the closure may or does impede traffic unreasonably, any approval granted by the Temporary Road Closures Subcommittee may be revoked and the event organiser may be required to open the road at the direction of a suitably qualified Council officer in charge of traffic.

Conditions:

- The event organiser is to publicly notify the event via letter drop, local newspaper advertisement, advanced signage and media releases.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the emergency services (Police, Fire and Ambulance Services) have been consulted with and that the Traffic Management Plan includes all of their specific requirements.
- The event organiser is to ensure that the affected property owners and businesses along the closure areas are consulted with.
- The event organiser is to provide marshals at all closure ends and intersections/bends to ensure that public safety (interaction of traffic and spectators) is not compromised.
- The event organiser is to work with the public transport operators to provide alternative public transport route and bus stops.
- The event organiser is to provide further details of the Traffic Management Plan to Council for approval prior to the event.
