- 3. Recommend to the Council that it Agree to the resolutions of the Ngauranga to Airport Governance Group Bus Rapid Transit in relation to the Indicative Business Case.
- 4. Recommend to the Council that it approves bringing forward \$1.5m of CAPEX funding for the Bus Rapid Transit Detailed Business Case and other Bus Rapid Transit related works (noting that GWRC will contribute \$375,000 and NZTA will contribute \$750,000) and agrees any project overspend and notes that this will be reflected in the 2015/16 Annual Report as an capital expenditure overspend.
- 5. Requires the Detailed Business Case to give consideration to maintaining and/or improving city liveability, retail and walking amenity as identified in the Urban Growth Plan.

- 7. Notes that as the Detailed Business Case is approved and Bus Rapid Transit enters its implementation phase there will be public consultation, both as a result of this project and the need to secure funding through the 2016/17 Annual Plan.
- 8. Notes that the Public Transport Spine Study conclusions, agreed by Council on 14 May 2014, highlight the priority action as being to secure the core spine corridor thereby retaining the ability to consider other public transport modes in the future.
- 9. Notes that a higher level of bus priority than currently provided beyond the core spine may be desirable but that this doesn't form part of the current Bus Rapid Transit Detailed Business Case. Nevertheless it will be evaluated and consulted upon as a later piece of work.
