BOSCOBEL LANE – TRAFFIC RESOLUTION

1. Purpose of report

This report outlines the recommended amendments to the Wellington City Council Traffic Restrictions in relation to Tawa streets. These recommendations support the achievement of the Council's Transport Strategy Outcomes of safety, accessibility, efficiency and sustainability. The proposed traffic restrictions have been publicly advertised.

2. Executive summary

The proposed resolutions were advertised on 24 July 2012, giving the public 18 days to give feedback.

The feedback received during the consultation period has been included in Section four of this report and where appropriate officer's responses have been included.

3. Recommendations

Officers recommend that the Tawa Community Board:

- 1. Receive the information.
- 2. Endorse the following amendments to the Traffic Restrictions, pursuant to the provisions of the Wellington City Council Consolidated Bylaw 2008.
 - (a) Time limited (P120, Monday to Friday 8:00am 6:00pm) Boscobel Lane (off-street parking area) – Tawa (TR52-12)

Add to Schedule A (Time Limited Parking) of the Traffic Restrictions Schedule

Column One Boscobel Lane (Off-street parking area) **Column Two** P120, Monday to Friday 8:00 am – 6:00 pm.

Column Three

North side, commencing 19.2 metres north and 2.3 metres east of its intersection with Boscobel Lane, (Grid coordinates x = 1753219.3 m, y = 5439141.8 m), and extending in an easterly direction following the kerbline for 15.2 metres. (6 car parking spaces)

4. Background

Time limited (P120, Monday to Friday 8:00am–6:00pm) – Boscobel Lane (off-street parking area) – Tawa (TR52-12)

Net Parking Loss: 0

Members of the Tawa Community Board requested clarification of parking signs erected within this off-street parking area adjacent to the Bucket Tree Motel. We have been unable to confirm the existing 2 hour parking was resoluted (by the former Tawa Borough) and it is being used by commuters to park all day. The purpose of this marked area is to provide parking for visitors to the adjacent reserve.

The intention of this report is to formalise the parking restrictions so they can be enforced as required.

It should be noted that just six of thirteen car parks are recommended for a time term restriction, the balance will remain unrestricted for commuters and those wishing to stay for longer periods.
