#### **OXFORD STREET - TRAFFIC RESOLUTION**

#### 1. Purpose of report

This report outlines the recommended amendments to the Wellington City Council Traffic Restrictions in relation to Tawa streets. These recommendations support the achievement of the Council's Transport Strategy Outcomes of safety, accessibility, efficiency and sustainability. The proposed traffic restrictions have been publicly advertised.

## 2. Executive summary

The proposed resolutions were advertised on 24 July 2012, giving the public 18 days to give feedback.

The feedback received during the consultation period has been included in Section four of this report and where appropriate officer's responses have been included.

#### 3. Recommendations

Time limited (P30, Saturday 9:00am-12:00pm) - Oxford Street - Tawa (TR53-12)

**Net Parking Loss: 0** 

Council officers have received a request from the Toy Library located in Oxford Street opposite Tawa School, to provide time limited parking on Saturday mornings. Currently, parking spaces are fully occupied due to swimming, rugby lessons and other activities in the area. Accordingly, it is difficult for parents with kids to find nearby parking to drop-off or pick-up toys.

It is proposed to have two P30 time limited parking spaces in front of the Toy Library to reduce the parking difficulties experienced in this location.
