CHAIR'S REPORT covering April 2013

MATTERS ON THE GO

REGIONAL GOVERNANCE REVIEW

A community meeting was held at the Tawa Community Centre late on Sunday afternoon 7 April to give people the opportunity "... to learn more about the proposed changes. What are your views about Tawa becoming part of the new Porirua ward? Will there be a place for the Tawa Community Board in the future? Does there need to be? Come and have your say."

Bruce Murray from the Tawa Historical Society gave a short overview on the history of local government in Tawa. Brian Hannah, WCC Strategy Manager, then gave a 40-minute presentation on the Regional Governance Reform options (otherwise known as 'amalgamation' proposals). This was followed by approx 30 minutes of questions and answers. More than 120 people were present.

When a straw poll was taken at the end, there was minority support for options 1 & 2 – both involving a single council across the region). The overwhelming majority indicated their preference for the status quo.

When the question was asked whether we'd like to be part of a Wellington ward (as we are at present) or part of a new Porirua ward, the overwhelming majority indicated their preference for the Wellington option.

The community board's submission on Regional Reform was sent in on Friday 3 May. It is attached as part of this month's agenda.

BOARD NEWSLETTER

The first of two newsletters for the year was printed and distributed this month to all 4600 households in Tawa.

COMMUNITY ENEWSLETTER

Two editions went out in April. Community board issues covered were Regional Reform, Tawa Station, watering the hanging baskets, and Tawa Primary Schools' Citizenship Awards.

APPENDIX 1

THE HANGING BASKETS

More than 35 people responded to the request for volunteers to manually water the flowers in the hanging baskets when outdoor watering restrictions were imposed by the WCC. 24 people were rostered (four each evening) to use “unofficial” water to keep the plants alive, in addition to the Wednesday Guides taking charge of Wednesday evenings.

Manual watering commenced on Friday 29 March with the possibility that this would need to be continued for 3-4 weeks. As it turned out, watering restrictions were ended less than 12 days later and the automated irrigation system was switched on again.

TAWA CEMETERY CLEAN-UP

The cemetery is reasonably well-maintained by the Council, particularly in terms of keeping the grass mown. However a concerned resident had indicated that a number of graves at the back of the cemetery were overgrown with ivy and other vegetation.

After meeting with Parks & Gardens representatives at the cemetery, I organised a working bee to spend a couple of hours tidying things up. That took place on Saturday 13 April with 12 people taking part, including Richard Herbert from FoTBR. Most of the work needing done was done, and at least two gravestones were uncovered, one that was lying flat and covered with both vegetation and soil. A good effort on behalf of community volunteers!

The chair has the opportunity to meet with the Mayor twice a year to discuss matters of importance to Tawa. Issues discussed on this occasion were:

- the amalgamation issue
- changes to the running of the Tawa Community Centre. It's all a bit up-in-the-air right now.

- Tawa Primary Schools' Citizenship Awards ceremony towards the end of the year.
