This document is the second volume of our long-term plan for the city. It covers our funding and financial policies, sets out our significance policy and provides summaries of our waste management plans and an assessment of our water and sanitary services. But it's only a draft. It can't be finalised until we've heard your views on things like:

- Should commercial rate payers pay 3.45 times more general rates than residential ratepayers with the same value property?
- Are our borrowings and investment policies set at the appropriate levels?
- Which of our services should we charge for and which should be subsidised by rate payers?
- How much should swimming pool users pay towards the cost of their swim?
- Should downtown hotels, bars and retailers pay for the tourism promotion that we do?

These are just some of the questions we've had to ask as we've prepared this long-term plan. Throughout, you'll find our tentative answers, in the form of proposed polices. At this stage, they are just in draft. Have we got them right?
