

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

Beautifying the riverside promenade is not a necessary at the moment. Flood proofing is important as is transportation. The interchange and transport hub at Melling should be a much bigger priority and this should be bought forward much earlier than the 2025/2026. This section is already a big choke point and will now be highlighted even more once the Hayward Hill interchange is complete. Having two sets of lights at Melling in close proximity often out of sync makes the issue even worse. Increase the usability of Melling Station for the Western Ward so more people can travel to and from Wellington/Petone. Investing in cycleways/bus services around the station particularly to the Western Ward and cycle storage would be another good future proofing investment. If transport in and out of the city is improved then more people will choose to visit the Hutt giving more benefits in the long term.

The reduction target should be higher, especially given that Wellington region is not at a great starting point and there is so much opportunity for improvement. I am especially supportive of a move to wheelie bins for kerbside recycling. I would also recommend moving away from the existing model of each household selecting it's own rubbish removal service, and back to a service administered by the council and charged via rates. Such a program should aim to incentivise use of green-waste and recycling collection and provide a disincentive for creating too much other waste (non recyclable non green waste). Proactive programs to encourage waste reduction and create behaviour change are important, such as boomerang bag programs, waste-free lunchbox support for schools (as the existing programs are a joke - the parents need education), swap days and encouraging donation of unwanted household items versus sending them to landfill. Community/neighbourhood composting and recycling programs should be encouraged. Recycling bins / waste free event plans should be incorporated into all council run or funded events. There should also be waste levies or other disincentives charged to food retailers using non-recyclable packaging, as well as 'waste disposal' levies to clean up for all the KFC, McDonalds, Burger King etc rubbish that blows around our streets.

Where is funding for the valley floor review including the walk/cycle ways along the Waiwhetu stream reserve area. Funding is needed to plan / implement the following projects: - an high quality transport centre (bus centre) for the CBD, similar to that built in Christchurch that really encourages public transport use as opposed to making it into a last resort for those brave and hardy enough to huddle on Bunny Street or Queens Drive. - significant investment in footpaths to encourage their use by residents of all abilities, including children walking/scooting/cycling to school as well as the elderly and disabled with mobility needs. The current state of footpaths discourages use by the elderly and disabled because of uneven surfaces, trip hazards, inadequate accessibility (ramp) features. Creating a safe and attractive environment for walking should be a priority, and is an ideal way to improve health outcomes as well as reducing congestion at peak times and around schools. - The BikeTech program should continue to be funded as this has provided excellent support to provision of Pedal Ready cycle instruction programs, the Hutt Weetbix Tryathalon, the bike to work breakfast and many other council run/funded projects to increase cycle participation. It is also a vehicle to develop skills in what will be a growing employment opportunity as the uptake of cycling increases and sales of e-bikes sky-rocket, and we grab our share of the cycle tourism market. - The work of the Road Safety co-ordinator and Cycling projects manager needs better support by council leadership. - Funding needs to be provided to create a 'communities on bikes' contestable grant program like Wellington City Council has so we can encourage more grass roots projects the get more people into active transport, and reduce the dependance on the events and road safety teams to come up with and implement ideas in this space. It makes sense to leverage community willpower, creativity and resources in this space. - Way finding signage that shows the walkability of various destinations around the CBD (e.g. Library 5 mins) would help alter peoples perceptions about how

Submission Draft Annual Plan of Hutt City Council 2017-2018 from the Wellington Tenths Trust

Wellington Tenths Trust (The Trust) is a long standing land owning Trust representing Te Atiawa/Taranaki Whanui land owners, being the tangata whenua in Wellington, Hutt City and Upper Hutt City. Wellington Tenths Trust has its head offices located at Hikoikoi and has increasing interests in the Hutt Valley ranging from the Hikoikoi Waka Ama Club to the Hikoikoi kaumatua weekly gatherings. We are also closely connected with the marae of Te Tatau o Te Po and Waiwhetu and their respective urupa. A large number of our beneficial owners are resident in the Hutt Valley and our people have been residents from pre-European times.

We do wish to be heard in this submission.

Submission

RiverLink Promenade Project

The Trust over the years has supported funding for the Making Places projects. The proposals in the RiverLink Promenade Project are supported by the Trust and in particular the proposed pedestrian footbridge from the Melling Station leading into the CBD. This will enhance the use of public transport and can reduce car numbers in the CBD.

The Trust also supports the flood protection work between the Ewen and Kennedy Good Bridges.

The Trust also supports work to replace the Melling Bridge as a part of this overall project including the floodway improvements.

Sportsville Projects

The Trust supports all these projects however with some particular focus including the Wainuomata and Petone Sportsville partnerships.

The Petone Library project is supported strongly as are the Wainuiomata and Naenae Community Hubs. The Lower Hutt Events Centre will help in getting events hosted in the Hutt and will help revitalize the CBD.

The Dowse Art Museum is an important cultural centre for all including Maori in the Hutt and it is essential that maintenance work is completed in a timely fashion.

The Silverstream Landfill needs to be fully supported as does work on the Water Supply particularly in ensuring the security of the quality of the underground water sources. The Trust is very conscious of the issues that arose in Havelock North with contaminated bore water and this requires active management by Wellington Water Limited.

Stormwater discharge improvements will be required in part in response the new Regional Natural Resources Plan. That expenditure is supported by the Trust.

Financial Strategy

The Trust supports the contingency for natural disasters. These cannot be predicted however the effects to some extent can be mitigated such as with improve flood control and earthquake strengthening along with general natural disaster planning.

Options for Council-Owned Wharves

The Wellington Tenths Trust support the full refurbishment of the Days Bay and Petone wharves as part of the transport infrastructure as well as being of considerable heritage value. We have no view on the other two wharves.

Seaview Treatment Plant Resource Consents

The Trust recognizes that the Seaview Plant requires consents for occasional discharges from the Seaview Plant when the main outfall pipeline to Pencarrow needs to be maintained or when stormwater flows into the treatment plant cannot be discharged out the main pipeline. In looking at these options it is recognized that aside for a consent for the status quo the implementation of an improved will take time so the Trust put forward the following principles:

- 1. That the permanent emergency discharge point is beyond the Waiwhetu Stream.
- 2. That discharges are kept to a minimum by good management particularly of the main pipeline.
- 3. That the ultimate long-term discharge of the Hutt Valley treated sewage remains into Cook Strait.
- 4. That where the alternative discharges are required mitigation such as with the use of storage tanks is actively considered.
- 5. That the discharge point takes the discharge out into the harbor on the outgoing tide if that is relevant.

Development Incentives and Remissions Policies

The Trust generally supports policies to encourage development and in particular with respect to the Wainuiomata Mall and the Naenae Shopping centre, both places with a significant Maori population.

General rate Share paid by residential properties

There are a good number of Wellington Tenths owners who are residential ratepayers in Lower Hutt and given the behavior of residential values versus commercial property values it makes sense to adjust the differential between commercial and residential rates to try decrease the effective rate rise for residential properties the Trust supports the one year freeze on the current rates differential transition.

Joint Wellington Region Waste Management and Minimisation Plan

The Trust supports the reduction of waste going to landfill by various strategies including re-use or re-purposing things, recycling where this can be done efficiently and any resource recovery work. Petone Community Board Submission re HCC 2017/2018 Annual Plan

The Petone Community Board has carried out the following consultation:

- Public meeting on 21 March with a focus on the wharves with a live video feed
- Public meeting on 11 April with a live video feed
- Tour of key parts of Petone by Board members on 25 March and discussion with Council officers and some community organisations
- Further time with community groups/organisations
- Feedback via our PCB facebook page and email and personal communications

a) Petone 2040

The Petone Community Board sees the Petone 2040 spatial planning project as the most important initiative for Petone and Moera and endorses it as the overarching strategy for those areas.

We strongly support continuing financial support for Petone 2040 of at least \$50,000 and want Council to know that in our opinion Council has been getting more than its value in money spent on the work completed to date.

We see a Jackson Street Precinct streetscape design project and the Infrastructure projects as the most urgent.

b) Wharves and especially the Petone Wharf

The overwhelming feedback has been that the Petone wharf and the Days Bay wharf should be refurbished. Some people have also variously shared that Rona Bay and/or Point Howard wharves could be demolished and not replaced, or that they should also refurbished.

Our main feedback is that people from Petone and beyond see the Petone wharf as an iconic part of Petone and the Wellington harbour and want to see it retained. It has significant heritage and social values for people of all ages and cultures who want to see its continued use for recreational purposes.

It is also potentially an important resource in times of disasters such as earthquakes and could be a commercially viable ferry terminal in the future. It is one of Petone's best known and most visited structures.

So we urge HCC to agree to spend the money needed to refurbish Petone wharf and to ensure that the gates and landward end at least are kept in heritage style. Some people say that it could be a lesser length if that is absolutely necessary. A few people also see that there could be commercial activities introduced on or around the wharf to help towards the costs of refurbishment or ongoing maintenance. The PCB would be very happy to work with officers again to hold more community meetings in the future about any matters that require or lend themselves to further consultation.

c) Sportsvilles \$4.8M for Wainuiomata and later \$7.4M for Petone plus 30% more fundraising for each sportsville

In its last year's Annual Plan submission the PCB noted the proposal for a Sportsville in Petone to be developed on the Petone Recreation Ground. This year we have a different proposal involving nearly exclusively North Park. We still support the concept of shared administration and the sharing of knowledge and resources but we still see no indication of these happening – and note the mention of potential shared administrative services only recorded for Wainuiomata Sportsville in the HCC consultation document.



We also still (as the PCB said last year) encourage Petone Sportsville to work with the Petone 2040 spatial planning project – to ensure that what is proposed will not work against a long term vision for what might be able to best happen in Petone and Moera.

We also see sporting facilities catering for the local community as being more important than a world class facility attracting a majority of those involved from outside Petone. We wonder how a seven days a week for twelve hours a day facility might operate in what is a residential area. We suggest that Hutt Park could be a better fit for an indoor sport such as gymsports.

If the cricket club facilities are those most in need of attention we would not be averse to seeing funding of up to \$500,000 going into a replacement facility there – with the rest of the possible involved clubs given more time to talk together and see what might really work best for them all. And it would be prudent for a large, if not the largest player, in the North park area, the Petone Working Men's Club, to be a part of future discussions alongside the P2040 proposals and group – so that any Sportsville development can be made the most of for all of Petone, Moera, and even Alicetown.

d) Petone Library

\$1.5M to complete necessary works that include mechanical services, fire protection and structural work. Taken as read this suggests that work has started that needs additional money to be completed. However there are no figures in the background papers that support this theory. And fire protection and structural work both suggest necessary maintenance rather than a new project – so we wonder why the delay until 2021.

e) Water Supply and Stormwater Projects

We see anything that will increase the resilience of the water supply and stormwater standards as being of critical importance. However, we have had difficulty getting any information about what exactly the amounts allocated are meant to be spent on. We suggest that these are two fundamentals that should have more rather than less money spent on them plus more transparent forward planning about their management.

f) Silverstream Landfill and Joint Waste Management and Minimisation

While we can accept the increase of space at the Silverstream landfill we are interested in how much recycling actually goes on there. We feel that the public in general needs to have a lot more knowledge and understanding about what is and can be recycled at the landfill and generally.

We agree with the regional targets as they seem logical and needed and the HCC Local Action Plan for as far as it goes. However, a clearer and firmer HCC and regional strategy is also needed that is about the 3 Rs – Reduce, Re-use, Recycle – and has a focus on the Reduce aspect. Reduce is the most critical aspect and requires transparency and reports around the process of waste/recycling; education of young people, residents, and retailers on e.g. what can be recycled; and a lot of education of retailers about what reduce might mean in practice. For plastic bags – the example of levies in Ireland could e.g. be used

g) Seaview Treatment Plant Resource Consents

The PCB has already shared that it thinks that No 3 (previously Option 6) is the best option as we want to see less of an impact on Waiwhetu Stream in the future, and this option also seems least likely to have effects of the marina and beach areas.

While we see that HCC has only \$13M budgeted and that, therefore, No 4 will be what the Council may prefer we would see this as only a very short term option. With No 4 the window of time during which discharge effluent plume could flow back up the stream would be limited but it would also be a larger amount of effluent involved in any flow back.

We also understand from the Friends of Waiwhetu Stream that the discharge on an ebb tide would be transferred downstream by the cross-flow in the Hutt River and tend to hug the shoreline which would very much reduce the dilution achieved by this option - because of the water being shallower near the shore and also because of lower tidal flow velocities along the shoreline.

An option that has the most likelihood of best diluting the effluent because the pipeline outlet is a good distance from the shoreline and is in water that is as deep as possible and has a high tide current is best, and what needs to be achieved. From our reading this is No 3.

h) Riverlink Project

At our second public meeting we had some people stress that this is a last chance for having the Hutt CBD actually become viable again. It seems to make sense to have the must do flood protection work to be made use of in wider ways, and the possibilities all worked on collaboratively, for the greatest results, between GWRC, NZTA and HCC.

i) Financial Strategy

We support in principle the financial strategy for managing debt, as the current system has artificial debt levels for only three years out of fifteen. We would prefer to see debt levels managed in a more logical fashion. However, we are concerned that no reason was given in the consultation material for the level of debt of revenue ratio being initially set at 150%, then 130% and so on – especially as the current debt level 'needed' is only 121%.

We also support the general rates freeze for the 2017/18 year- as long as this means that the rate differential exercise is pushed out another year overall to and that there won't be a double effect for residential ratepayers next financial year.

We do not agree with an additional 1 per cent rates increase to fund rejuvenation projects in 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 and wonder if the increased residential valuations have already closed the proposed differential gap a lot more than expected by now.

j) Development Incentives and Remissions

We support incentives for <u>quality</u> development in the Hutt CBD, Wainuiomata Mall and the Naenae Shopping Centre. Perhaps there should be an incentives and remissions holiday in Petone to assist investment in other areas and until there can be more targeted work done in line with the Petone 2040 spatial planning recommendations.

As a windsurfer and kiteboarder I had for many years (often unwittingly) suffered the attitude that in bad weather no-one cares about the state of our harbour water quality, so no warnings were given. Fortunately this is no longer the case, but it still true that in cases where weather events (ie rain) has caused overflow issues the harbour has been deemed unsafe just at the time when myself and other recreational enthusiasts are most likely to want to use the harbour. Any dumping into the Hutt River or nearby will inevitably result in contamination along the Petone foreshore and other harbour coastal zones/ Eastern Bays. The option to dump into the harbour proper are the most desirable, I accept the cost of dumping out near Soames is significant, the shorter option is probably ok.



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

GWRC submission on the draft Hutt City Council Annual Plan

Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Hutt City Council draft Annual Plan 2017-2018 Consultation Document and Supporting Information documents. GWRC wishes to make the following comments.

Variations to the Long Term Plan

RiverLink Project

GWRC strongly agrees with HCC's decision to prioritise spending on the RiverLink Promenade Project and associated infrastructure, including:

- Riverbank car park replacement
- Melling Bridge renewal
- River trail work.

District Plan Work Programme

GWRC strongly agrees with HCC's decision to prioritise spending on the District Plan work programme, and GWRC Flood Protection will support this work by HCC as required.

Stormwater

GWRC strongly agrees with HCC's decision to prioritise spending on the stormwater programme to improve the quality of discharges in the immediate future.

Options for Council-owned wharves

The future of the Council-owned wharves is of particular interest to GWRC due to our responsibility for managing ferry services as part of the Metlink public transport network for Wellington.

GWRC currently subsidises the Wellington Harbour ferry service run by East By West. This continues a long history of ferry services in Wellington harbour since the first service commenced in 1893. The current ferry service utilises the Days Bay wharf at multiple times daily, providing heavily patronised



commuter services between the Eastern Bays and Wellington City on weekdays and recreational and tourist use at other times. Until recently East by West also provided weekend services to the Petone wharf.

GWRC considers the ferry service an important link in the Regional Council's vision for a fully integrated public transport network. During recent earthquakes it has also proven to be a valuable resilience resource for maintaining access between Wellington and Lower Hutt cities when SH2 and rail was not accessible.

Days Bay wharf

The Days Bay wharf is integral to the ongoing provision of the harbour ferry service. Were it not to be available, it would not be possible to provide a ferry service between the Eastern Bays and Wellington City. GWRC strongly encourages Hutt City Council to continue to maintain the Days Bay wharf to a condition that allows the continued safe use of the wharf for ferry services by current and future vessels, noting that foreseeable future vessels may be [20%] larger than current vessels.

The options put forward for Days Bay wharf are to fully refurbish, or remove and replace. GWRC does not have a strong preference either way but notes that both options present an opportunity to significantly improve the utilisation of the wharf for ferry customers and the general public. GWRC requests that the following aspects be investigated and considered in the design of the Days Bay wharf:

- The use of different permanent landing levels to provide improved access for customers using ferry services. The ferries currently in service must use top deck loading given the distance between the wharf deck and the water. This provides access issues for customers with mobility impairments;
- Installation of enhanced wharf shelters to provide ferry customers with access to shelter while waiting for services;
- Improving the fenders provided; and
- Improved level of general amenity for ferry users.

The ongoing provision of the Days Bay wharf is considered imperative by GWRC to enable the continuation of a key component of the region's public transport network. For this reason a high level of amenity is requested.

Petone wharf

While the Petone wharf is not considered essential by GWRC for the current public transport network, it is considered an important resilience link between Wellington and Lower Hutt cities, and as public transport demand increases and other modes become constrained in the future, a Petone ferry service may become an important component of the public transport network in future. For this reason, GWRC recommends the preservation of the Petone wharf to a standard that enables its



use for ferry services for transport resilience purposes and the potential future use as a public transport service.

Seaview Wastewater Treatment Plant Resource Consents

GWRC supports HCC's work to identify options for managing the treated effluent discharges from the Seaview Wastewater Treatment Plant. Our strong preference is for Option 3 as it avoids discharging effluent into either the Hutt River or Waiwhetu Stream, instead discharging directly into the marine environment. As identified in the Plan, this option would significantly lower the risk of effects on freshwater aquatic life. It would also complement efforts by multiple parties over recent years to restore the ecological, social and cultural values of both these watercourses.

We acknowledge the additional costs of Option 3, but query whether further options could be considered until resources are available for option 3. For example, HCC might consider only undertaking the construction of additional storage at the Treatment Plant in the short term (one of the actions suggested in Option 4). This would prevent or lessen discharges during extreme weather events, which appear to be the primary current contributor of wastewater to the Waiwhetu Stream.

Finally, we would question whether a predicted "no change to the number of discharge events" as described in 3 of the options is achievable in light of the probable increase in high intensity rainfall events.

Joint Wellington Region Waste Management and Minimisation Plan

GWRC strongly supports the draft WMMP's goal of reducing waste to landfill in the region by a third over the next decade, and the commitment of the region's territorial authorities to work together to achieve this objective.

Other comments

Public transport integration

GWRC recommends that when undertaking planned and new projects, including Petone Sportsville, Lower Hutt Events Centre, Wainuiomata Community Hub, Naenae Community Hub, and the Urban Growth Strategy development, Hutt City Council should carefully consider the role that public transport can play in reducing road congestion. GWRC requests that Hutt City Council partners with GWRC during the development of these projects to identify potential needs and opportunities for public transport integration.

Waiwhetu Stream

GWRC supports the allowance for Waiwhetu Stream Floodplain Management Plan (\$45,000 over the next 3 years). However, due to resourcing commitments GWRC is delaying recommencement of the Waiwhetu Floodplain Management Plan until 2019/20.



Whaitua process

GWRC notes that the whaitua process will be starting in the Hutt City area from July this year and requests that Hutt City Council ensures funding is put aside for staff resourcing to input into the whaitua process. This will require at least 1-2 days of staff time a week during the setup phase and ongoing project team involvement, which will involve fieldtrips, community engagement meetings and whaitua committee meetings.

Additional comments (this will form basis of presentation)

1. Wellington Region Waste Management and Minimisation Plan needs to anticipate the coming rise of electric car lithium ion batteries. In coming years most cars will have such batteries, which are very large, and there is no mechanism in NZ for these to be reused at scale to extend their useful life (eg used for storage of solar energy in homes gives the batteries a 10 year extension of life) nor recycling into constituent parts (should only occur when the reuse phase has been exhausted). These batteries should not be sent to landfill or overseas as we can use them productively locally, but investigative and potentially procurement work needs to be done to deliver that.

2. The Hutt City Fleet currently has one electric car (plus a mayoral plug in hybrid). This is little given the fleet has approx 75 vehicle. The council must show leadership and adopt a practical and cost effective policy to shift all of its vehicles to electric. This results in broader awareness and uptake of the technology in the city, and serves to accelerate climate change and air quality goals. The best manner to do this is to adopt Greater Wellington Regional Council's electric first fleet policy which does not require any lift in fleet budget, and seeks to ensure all vehicles, when replaced, are electric unless a case can be put forward as to why a specific vehicle can't. Full explanation document and GWRC vehicle policy text is at:

3. The council sustainability team has done a sterling job of seeking to install electric car chargers on council property, but is prevented from lack of funds. To date a charger is outside the Dowse, and a potential project exists with a car parking operator following EECA funding. Demand on electric vehicle stations is growing quicker than supply. Locations should be expanded to cover other sites such as the final phase of Avalon Park Upgrade, libraries, and recreational areas that people park at for some time such as Petone beach. The best way to do this is to adopt a council policy that budget is placed each year to identify suitable locations and fund the installation of electric car chargers at those locations, until such time as demand for facilities is eventually met by market players.

4. Similarly, the council must encourage private enterprise to help in offering chargers (to meet demand and increase uptake of such cars) by updating district plan or similar policy tool to specify that electrified car parking should be offered at relevant sites (eg, overnight has at hotels

'reduction, reuse, recycling, or recovery' ie that a first focus is on not creating waste in the first place. That is why 'product stewardship' is Part 2 of the Act. The primary target of 'reduce the total quantity of waste sent to landfills by a third over the next 10 years' is not specific enough about the initial priority of reducing the amount produced in the first place. Product steward ship only turns up in the very weak policy 10: '10. Work together to lobby for product stewardship for possible priority products such as, but not limited to, e-waste, tyres and plastic bags.' All of the other proposals focus on managing waste after it is created - and in some cases seek to do by punitive measures such as bylaws - but on the primary issue of product stewardship for possible priority products.' It is very unclear what that means. To give a practical example, there are no need for polystyrene in local supermarket packaging, some even provide alternatives for meat trays and the like. Similarly, food outlets dont need to use polystyrene. Why not a campaign encouraging the public to ask for substitutes and at the same time assisting and rewarding with good publicity businesses who move to the alternatives that are available.



 - a. Note the contribution that Enviroschools programme makes, and has the potential to make, to achieving Lower Hutt's strategic social, environmental, cultural and economic goals.
 - b. Note the progress achieved with the Enviroschools programme so far during 2016/17.
 - c. Further strengthens the partnership between Enviroschools and HCC through a long term partnership agreement of at least six years following the completion of the current contract.
 - d. Work with the joint councils of the Wellington region to adopt a more ambitious overall target for reduction in waste to landfill that takes a step change in waste management that will enhance Wellington's reputation and show leadership nationally.
 - e. Note that the Enviroschools programme in the Lower Hutt can play an important role in meeting the goals in the Draft Waste Minimisation and Management Plan.
 - f. Retain goal E2 on page 37 of the Draft Waste Minimisation and Management Plan, and add *'and early childhood centres'* after schools.

Progress during 2016/17

- 5. With funding of \$39,000 from HCC, the following key highlights have been achieved so far during 2016/17:
 - a. Five early childhood centres have become Enviroschools, bringing the total number of Enviroschools in Lower Hutt to 24.
 - Boulcott School has reflected at Silver, Tui Glen reflected at Bronze. This demonstrates deepening sustainability practice in these schools. Lower Hutt has three green gold Enviroschools, the highest number in the region.
 - c. The Kids Connect event in 2016 was very successful, with 91 students attending from 21 schools, and 12 providers. Alina



Pescini, Lead Enviroschools Teacher, from Eastern Hutt School stated "What a wonderful day - thank you SO much. I have many excited teachers and students at school and look forward to riding the wave of enthusiasm with them!"

d. Enviroschools regularly connects with people from a wide range of organisations. In the last 12 months we have collaborated with a huge number of organisations to run professional development for teachers, including Petone Settlers Museum, The Dowse, GNS, Hutt Science, Zealandia and the Sustainability Trust. e. In Term 1 this year we held a very successful education for sustainability provider expo for teachers where providers from 16 organisations shared what they do with 15 teachers, and a Seaweek event for 16 ECE teachers. Term 2 will include an event for teachers about student empowerment, student agency and genuine student led action, and 3 ECE events for the 3 clusters.



f. Lower Hutt Enviroschools have been involved in many exciting sustainability projects. For example in the last 12 months, Wainuiomata, Koraunui and Normandale Schools have all audited the amount of waste they create and are working through ways of reducing the amount they send to landfill. Arakura Kindergarten has developed a community garden, while East Harbour and Kelson Kindergartens are getting to know their

local waterways and how to care for them.

g. 4 stories about Enviroschools have featured in local newspapers.

We request the following:

6. HCC notes the positive progress made in the delivery of the Enviroschools programme in Lower Hutt so far during 2016/17.

Long term partnership between Enviroschools and Hutt City Council

- 7. Enviroschools would like to thank Hutt City Council for their progressive funding of the Enviroschools programme. Our current contract is for \$39,000 per year until 30 June 2019, including \$10,000 per year to grow ECE. This progressive 3 year funding model allows job security for our facilitators, lower administrative costs, and enables a longer term, more strategic approach to programme delivery. This in turn enables stronger outcomes, more collaboration, and increased skills and knowledge by our network and Enviroschools facilitators.
- 8. We expect continued demand from schools and early childhood centres in Lower Hutt to join our programme, and we are also looking at ways to strengthen our support to schools outside our network. We have strong support from all local authorities in the Wellington Region, and see ourselves as a lead provider of sustainability education to the region. Our goal is to continue to deepen and strengthen sustainability practice within schools and centres in the Lower Hutt and the rest of the Wellington region, and continue collaborating with other providers to maximise community outcomes, and build the skills and knowledge of future generations to tackle the sustainability challenges they may face.

9. The Enviroschools programme contributes in the following ways to HCC's long term goals and strategies:

10. We encourage the Hutt City Council to consider ways of further strengthening the long term funding and support for the Enviroschools programme through a partnership approach to recognise the role of the programme in delivering core goals and outcomes of Hutt City Council.

This could be achieved through a long term partnership agreement spanning 6 years or more supported by a financial and business plan. This would provide long term job security to our knowledgeable and experienced, facilitators, and offer the ability to take a longer term, strategic approach to programme development. We would be happy to provide HCC with a long term business plan to support this.

11. Our team works closely with many staff in Lower Hutt. Our team is committed to continuing to work alongside staff and councillors at Hutt City Council to ensure that our programme closely aligns with HCC's vision and aims.

We request the following:

12. Hutt City Council works with Enviroschools to develop a long term partnership agreement to continue the delivery of the Enviroschools programme in Lower Hutt beyond 2019 for at least 6 years.

Draft Wellington Region Waste Management and Minimisation Plan

This section sets out Enviroschools Te Upoko o Te Ika a Māui's submission on the Draft Wellington Regional Waste Management and Minimisation Plan.

Set more aspirational targets

- 13. We support the aim of the draft plan to reduce waste to landfill to 400kg per person per year by 2026, and realise this goal will require considerable effort and multiple actions to achieve. However we do not consider this target shows sufficient leadership on waste reduction.
- 14. We urge the joint councils to adopt a braver, more ambitious target that aims for a step change in the way waste is generated and disposed of, and is more aligned with the goal of the plan to be *"waste free, together"*. This more ambitious target should set Wellington up to become a leader around zero waste in comparison to other parts of New Zealand.
- 15. We also consider the wording of parts of the plan is cautious and takes a conservative approach.This includes the following:
 - a. Section 3.1 of the draft plan paints a picture of a range of challenges that the region faces around waste management. We acknowledge these challenges. However, there are also opportunities that could be highlighted too, and more positive, inspirational language used in the plan to support the changes required.
 - b. We challenge the statement made under section 3.6.4 that *"Total waste and recovered material quantities in the Wellington region are estimated to grow slowly over the next 10*

years in line with population and economic growth." We realise that this is based on a scenario of "no significant change in systems or drivers". However we think this plan should set out a number of possible scenarios into the future instead of using only a business as usual scenario of demand. This could include modelling strong approaches taken in other countries around zero waste.

16. Section 3.6.1 outlines how we are doing as a region compared to the rest of New Zealand. This paints a poor picture of the Wellington region's performance, particularly around household waste per capita and recycling rates at a regional level (realising there are differences across the region, particularly in the Wairarapa). We support the goals of the plan to address this performance, as we think it is critical for the Wellington region to be demonstrating strong leadership around household waste, recycling, and organic waste. We urge the joint councils to take strong measures to reduce household waste, particularly to significantly reduce the waste to landfill that could easily be diverted.

We request the following:

- 17. Set a more ambitious overall target for reduction in waste to landfill that takes a step change in waste management that will enhance Wellington's reputation and show leadership nationally.
- 18. Include a number of scenarios for future waste projections based on changes in systems and drivers.
- 19. Use more positive, inspirational language in the plan.
- 20. Take strong measures to reduce household waste with the aim of being seen as a leader in this area nationally within the next 10 years.

Contribution of Enviroschools to regional waste minimisation actions

21. One of the regional actions of the plan (under R.E.1, and 9.4 Regional Engagement) is *"working together to deliver more consistent and effective forms of regional communications and education around waste services and minimisation, so households and communities are inspired*



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and supported to play their part". We support this action.

22. The Enviroschools programme provides a critical role in supporting waste education currently to 107 schools and early childhood education centres in the region. The 2014 census showed that 100% of Enviroschools were taking actions around waste. Schools reach out into their communities through their whānau, students, teachers and others they connect with. They can

have considerable influence over the behaviour of communities. Enviroschools provides support on zero waste to Enviroschools as it is one of our five key theme areas. This is through professional development, networking, sharing stories, resources, and other support.

23. In addition, a key feature is that the Enviroschools programme is region-wide



and supported by all councils in the Wellington region. Enviroschools is also a leader of the Wellington Regional Environmental Education Forum (WREEF). That makes the programme a key connector, able to operate in different local authority areas, with relationships with many staff in waste teams in councils, along with waste management providers.

24. One of the actions in the plan (R.LM.3 and R.LM.4 under 9.7) is *"Collaborating with other local government organisations, NGOs, and other key stakeholders on undertaking research,*

lobbying and actions on various waste management issues such as (but not limited to) product stewardship, electronic waste, tyres, and plastic bags."

25. Enviroschools could contribute to this action. Enviroschools is a nationwide programme which has partnerships with most local authorities and other key national agencies including Ministry for the Environment². Waste is a key theme area of our programme. Enviroschools often take action around plastic, including plastic bags. For example, in 2014 Keep Lower Hutt Beautiful held a reusable bag competition, and Enviroschools played a key part of making this successful.

We request the following:

26. Recognise the importance of the Enviroschools programme for contributing to regional actions around waste education and engagement. In particular, actions R.E.1, R.LM.3 and R.LM.4.

Contribution of Enviroschools to local Hutt City waste minimisation actions

- 27. We strongly support clause E2 on page 37 in terms of action Hutt City Council will take to implement the regional communications and education action. *E.2: Support schools to access the Enviroschools programme. Continue to provide funding for the Enviroschools programme to local schools that agree to participate".* We commit to working with Hutt City Council to ensure our programme contributes towards achieving the goals and targets of the Draft Waste Minimisation Plan. We request that *'early childhood centres'* is also added to this wording, as ECE are an important part of the community, with considerable ability to make a difference to waste outcomes, and to educational outcomes through a life-long learning approach.
- 28. There are a number of other Lower Hutt actions that Enviroschools can support and connect with through promotion within our network, and working with schools. These include:
 - a. E.9: Encourage and support household composting. (WDE1)
 - b. E.11: Undertake community recycling awareness programmes. (WDT5)
 - c. E.7: Deliver a comprehensive waste minimisation programme to include education, information, incentives, and community engagement. (WPT4)
 - d. E.13: Continue World of Waste Bus Tours. (WPT6)
- 29. We encourage the waste team at Hutt City Council to connect with our facilitators to ensure our work and the work of schools and centres maximises the ability to achieve these goals.

We request the following:

- 30. Note that the Enviroschools programme in the Lower Hutt can play an important role in meeting the goals in the Draft Waste Minimisation and Management Plan
- 31. Retain goal E2 on page 37, and add 'and early childhood centres' after schools.
- 32. That our Enviroschools facilitators meet with staff at Hutt City Council working to implement to Draft Waste Plan to ensure outcomes are maximised.

Conclusion

33. Thank you for the opportunity to make a submission on the Draft 2017/18 Annual Plan for Lower Hutt City and the Draft Wellington Regional Waste Management and Minimisation Plan.
