## **Meeting Procedures**

The meeting opened at 5:31.

- 1. Apologies were received from the following members:
  - Erikka Helliwell, Humphrey Hanley and Cr Matthews for absence. No issues were raised with the minutes of the previous meeting.
- No conflicts of interest were declared.
- 3. The group did a round of introductions.

#### **Items**

4. Let's Get Wellington Moving update, presented by Shar Carlini, Mike Oates, Andrew Wright, Leti Page, Hazel Dobbie, Veronica Byrne.

Mike gave a presentation about the LGWM programme and its plan, and gave an overview of Mass Rapid Transit, People-friendly City Streets and the Golden Mile upgrade.

Members discussed:

- First principles discussion and definition of accessibility.
- Inclusivity.
- Connecting with people in groups and developing relationships being a new group of people and developing those connections
- Engagement sessions with sections of communities to facilitate conversations, working with universal design experts, ensuring disabled people are compensated for the work they do and knowledge they hold.
- What does good look like examples of projects/organisations that have done all the right things, leads to follow or surpass.
- 5. Cycleways update, Presented by Claire Pascoe, Bri Peters and Renee Corlett.

Claire provided an update on the upcoming cycleway consultations for Aro Valley, Ngaio and Kilbirnie. She discussed the cycleway update e-newsletter and whether AAG members would like to subscribe to it, or whether an accessibility-targeted newsletter would be more helpful.

#### Members discussed:

- Working in with Blind Low Vision NZ
- Accessibility of the transportprojects.org.nz website compared to the wellington.govt.nz website
- Increased representation of the disability community on transport steering groups

- Benefits of traffic lights compared to roundabouts, and the importance of tactile routes
- Waka Kotahi looking for someone to get involved with research project on bus platform use.

Susan shared the following updates with the group:

- Disabled Artists' Festival of Theatre went well, working on more things throughout the year.
- Boardwalk completed at Dixon St.
- Navigating way through election process.

The following updates were also shared with the group:

- Te Whatu Ora presentation at next month's meeting, discussion about how to connect with community.
- Working with Deafblind Association around access for deaf blind people for the election.

- Discussions with Whaikaha Ministry of Disabled People around postal voting, taking privacy seriously, and ensuring that disabled people are provided with all the information. Auckland City Council have bookable appointments for private assistance with voting.
