Welcome	Deputy Chair Dan Kauraka opened the meeting and welcomed everyone
Opening Prayer	Sofi gave the opening prayer
Councillor update	Councillor McKinnon gave an update on council business. The council has been considering the Annual Plan for 2013/14 including reviewing expenditure, user charges, and making investments in such areas as energy efficiency guidance and looking at an intern style programme for young people who have trouble finding jobs because of lack of experience, e.g. recent migrants, refugees. Would give them a leg up to get into the job market and may help persuade other organisations to join. Working party on amalgamation – decision by Councillors due tomorrow (14 March). Do keep aware of the consultation that will follow. This is an election year – the election will be based on current boundaries. Councillor McKinnon offered to meet with anyone who is interested in standing for election. Councillor Gill – noted that Wellington may end up with parallel consultations or a possible joint consultation on Local Government Reform. The particulars to watch out for are the boundaries and governance structure. Some councillors are suggesting a multi unitary authority but officers do not believe the multi unitary authority would fit the criteria for the Local Government Commission. Effect on rates is that they would likely go up in the short term for a long term gain. We could ask: can Wellington city remain tremendous? Question from Martha: she is interested in internship from a Pasifika view.
Forward programme discussion	Chair, Tina McNicholas joined the meeting. Tina raised the point that PAG has 12 months left of the term and we need to plan what we can accomplish in that 12 months. She invited suggestions from the group for the work programme. Suggestions included Formal submission as PAG to Local Government Commission when called for.
