Minutes for last meeting and matters arising:

Smoke free outdoor policy project:

George Thomson from the Department of Public Health, University of Otago, Wellington, presented PAG with information on the work underway to support a review of smoke free policy. This work will include a workshop to be held in November. George invited PAG to send a PAG representative to the workshop.

Action:

PAG going forward and joint letter of agreement discussion:

Gunther introduced key new staff to PAG from the policy and reporting team and the democratic services team. Gunther also discussed the way that the Council wants to work with PAG as an extension of council into the future.

Gunther then ran through the draft joint letter of expectation. The content of this letter provides a high level overview of shared areas of interest between a specific group and Council, and will assist in aligning the work of these groups to the priorities of the Council's 2015-25 Long Term Plan. The agreed content will be used to populate a work programme agenda schedule for PAG, developed in consultation with Sai.

This agenda schedule will help to ensure Council officers are presenting on projects of interest at key milestones throughout the year when input from PAG is sought, and assist each group to frame their agendas in line with the Council's annual work programme. There was extensive round table conversation around the letter and its contents. At the end of the discussion, it was largely agreed with some suggestions for improvements.

Pacific Advisory Group Forum Debrief:
