Community engagement with the Red Cross will be discussed – given it is the cyclone season in the Pacific and there is always a large interest and concern from the community.  An update on refugee settlement is also sought

	<ul> <li>Cr Free: <ul> <li>There are a lot of roadworks currently – noted that tar seal has to be laid in the warmer weather.</li> <li>Island Bay cycleway is having some teething issues</li> <li>Annual Plan: Questions are due early February.</li> <li>Translation of some documents for the community was discussed, if a specific piece could be nominated that would be helpful for getting something actioned.</li> <li>The budget is quite tight, if new expenditure is to take place it must be in alignment with council's goals (it was noted that this relates closely to the translation proposal).</li> <li>There was discussion around offering translations for free from within PAG, but the preference was for paid professionals.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Cr Eagle: <ul> <li>There was a discussion of the Pacific members on the Honours list</li> <li>The council has honours to be awarded, important to nominate members of the community where appropriate and possible.</li> <li>Election year is here</li> <li>The Salvation Army will be having a new Niuean minister in place of Captain Joe Serevi who has moved to Manurewa in Auckland.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	Nominees must live in the Wellington City area and be on the electoral roll.	
	If the vacancies can't be covered, those selected will be elected. PAG could appoint directly after the election process if the positions are not filled – would be done in March.
