- 1.5. Clare Lundon, Sean Johnson, and Liam Hodgetts provided updates on the following topics:
 - Advisory groups review – officers are working on implementing the recommendations from the advisory groups review. A recruitment process is scheduled to finish in March with new PAG members starting in July.
 - Three priority strategies – following the presentation to PAG in December, officers have had follow up conversations with Kira about the Arts and Culture Strategy and Anton Carter about the three strategies. Officers will come back to the group at the March PAG meeting to discuss draft of the strategies.
 - Tawa Community Board by-election – The Tawa Community Board is having a by-election following the resignation of a member. PAG members were asked to encourage Pasifika people in Tawa to stand.
 - Planning for Growth – the full list of submissions on Planning for Growth will be made public on Monday 15 February 2021.

- Innovating Streets – Placemaking pop-ups turning carparks into places for people have launched as part of the Innovating Streets project.
- Cemeteries Management Plan -
- Long-term Plan – Council has announced an indicative rate rise of 14-17% for the 2021-31 Long-term Plan. Housing and water infrastructure are major concerns for the issues that the Long-term Plan will address.
- Fale Malae – Liam has had conversations with the Fale Malae Trust about the Fale Malae. The Trust is continuing to work on this and has turned their attention from the proposed Bunny Street site to Frank Kitts Park.
